MVSD board eliminates Vigorito's post

President says position is no longer needed

MINERAL RIDGE

The Mahoning Valley Sanitary District board eliminated the position of plant operations manager held by Anthony P. Vigorito, who is under indictment ac-

cused of falsifying training records of Youngstown water employees.

"The prudent decision was to eliminate the position because there's no need to keep it on the organizational chart," Matthew Blair, president of the MVSD board of directors, said Friday.

"He was indicted and has been stripped of all of his licenses. But even if he wasn't, we would have considered eliminating the position."

The board expects to hire a chief engineer toward the end of this month, Blair said.

The board voted June 28 in support of a resolution to abolish the plant operations manager job, effective July 1, be-

cause the position is "not now necessary as those duties are effectively handled through the chief engineer and other management employees." The resolution allows Vigorito to receive health insurance coverage from the MVSD through July 31.

Vigorito, 41, of Niles was demoted in

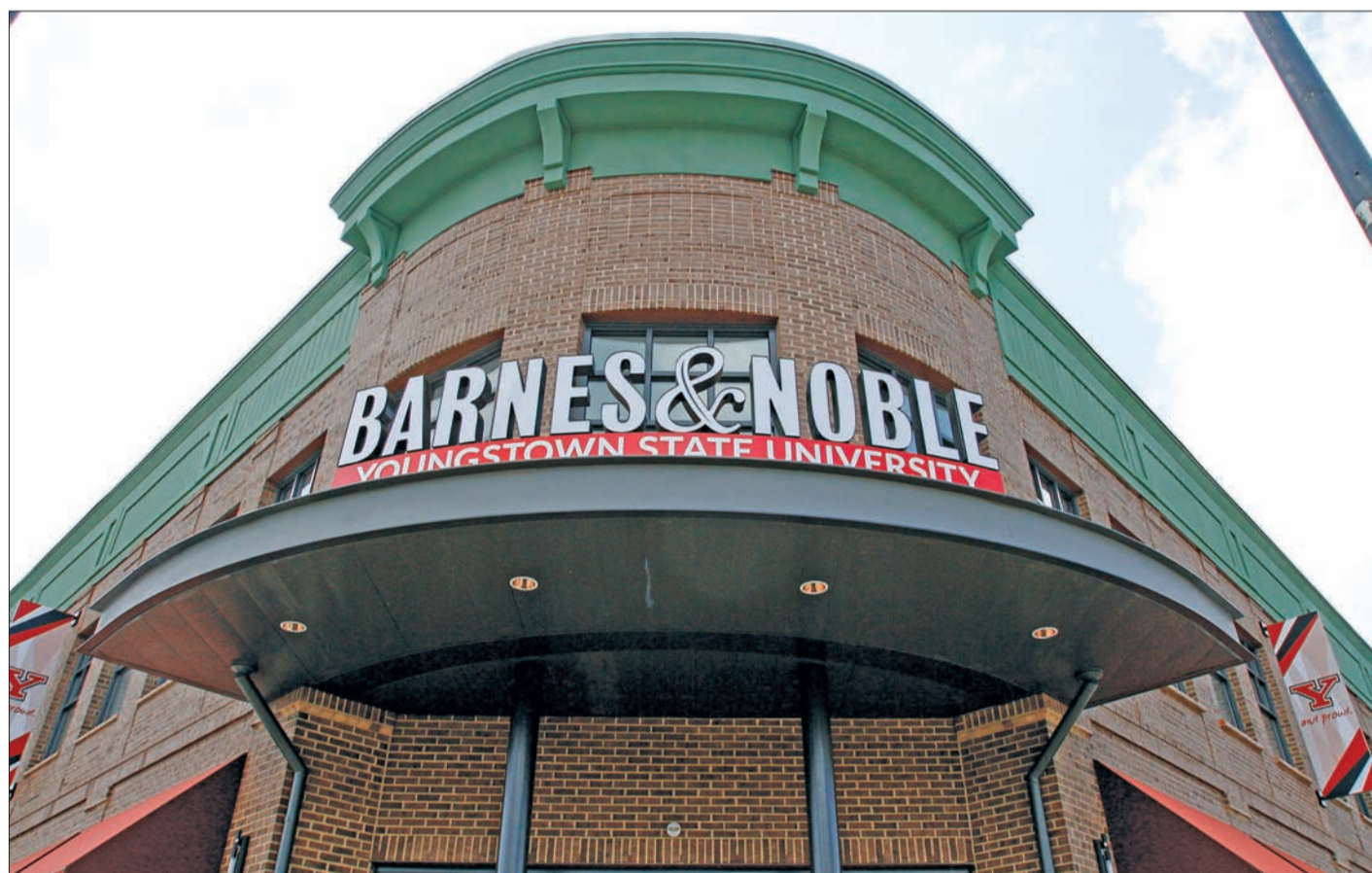

HIGH ABOVE THE GROUND floor of Youngstown State University's new Barnes & Noble bookstore – which opens Monday at 8 a.m. – construction workers meticulously installed a 10-foot graphic depicting former YSU track runner Nina Grambling mid-stride.

The store – between Lincoln and Rayen avenues west of Fifth Avenue – is full of similar YSU imagery, from wall-sized block Y graphics to an army of Pete the Penguins adorning everything from oven mitts to golf balls.

There is a Starbucks Cafe connected to a convenient store, and rows of windows lin-

DEA probes smuggling of pot via Ford Fusions

YOUNGSTOWN

The head of the Youngstown Federal Drug Enforcement Administration says a recent marijuana-smuggling operation with ties to Warren is the first of its kind he has seen in this area.

In fact, said Bob Balzano, who runs the local DEA office, the only time he has heard of the method being deployed was in April, when a similar discovery was made in Minnesota.

The marijuana was found last week inside the wheel well for a spare tire in a new Ford Fusion that was manufactured in Sonora, Mexico, at a Ford dealership in Kent, after one of the vehicles was unloaded from a car carrier, Balzano said.

Investigators were then able to find 14 more packages of marijuana in oth-

Judge overrules motion to acquit

After the prosecution presented its case against Dr. Joseph Yurich, defense attorney Lynn Maro sought to have a directed verdict of acquittal on all charges, but a judge hearing the case overruled the motion.

Maro said the prosecution presented insufficient evidence to sustain a conviction. Merely showing someone consumed alcohol and was then in an accident is not sufficient proof of impairment, she argued.

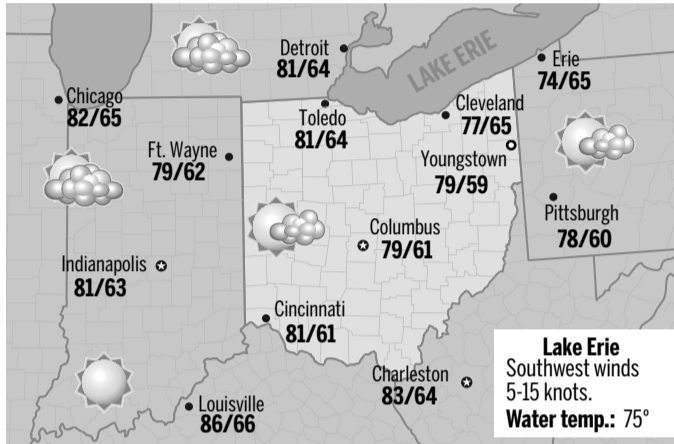

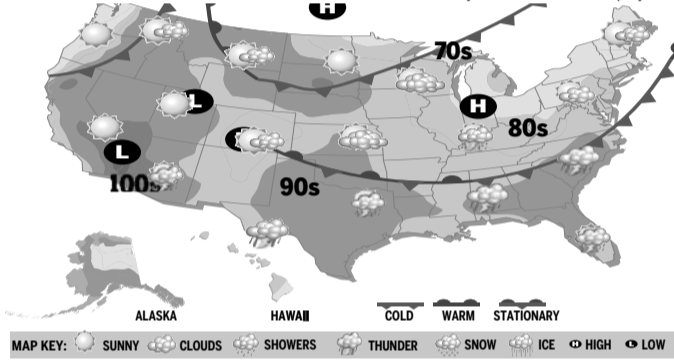

Winners, losers complicate GOP's path on health care bill

Associated Press WASHINGTON

Republicans' latest health care plan would create winners and losers among Americans up and down the income ladder, and across age groups.

It would give consumers more responsibility for their insurance choices, a goal long held by conservatives who argue that's the key to a true health care market.

And there are potential unintended consequences for people with employer-provided insurance, currently about 170 million Americans.

The legislation would put limits on federal spending for Medicaid, a partnership program with states to cover low-income people, the disabled and nursing-home residents.

As Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell, R-Ky., steers toward debate and votes next week, here is a look at some of the latest changes and major issues:

CRUZ'S PLAN

The new Senate bill incorporates the core of a proposal from Sen. Ted Cruz, R-Texas, that would reorganize the market for policies purchased by individuals.

EMPLOYER ESCAPE HATCH?

McConnell's new bill made a major change to pre-tax sheltered health savings accounts, which was also advocated by Cruz.

Under the bill, health savings accounts could be used to pay premiums with pre-tax money. Under current law, they can only be

requirements that Obama's law imposed on individual plans, including standard benefits such as pregnancy, maternity and newborn care; wellness visits and mental-health treatment.

Under the Cruz approach, an insurer can offer plans that don't comply with such requirements, provided they also offer coverage that does.

Healthy people would have opportunities to buy lower-premium, skinnier plans, while people with pre-existing conditions not eligible for premium subsidies could find themselves priced out of insurance,"

The latest bill includes another \$70 billion to help states keep health insurance affordable for older, sicker customers.

Some insurers are worried because of a technical change with huge practical implications: Health plans that enroll healthier customers would no longer have to cross-subsidize those with sicker patients,

"We think it is unworkable," said Justine Handelman, top Washington lobbyist for the BlueCross BlueShield Association.

She predicted skyrocketing costs for taxpayers also, stuck with the bill for sicker patients.

McConnell's new bill made a major change to pre-tax sheltered health savings accounts, which was also advocated by Cruz.

Under the bill, health savings accounts could be used to pay premiums with pre-tax money. Under current law, they can only be

used to cover out-of-pocket costs, such as deductibles and copayments.

The change is meant to level the playing field for people buying individual plans, as compared to people getting employer coverage.

But some analysts say McConnell risks undermining workplace coverage.

The upside is that the change might encourage more self-employed people to buy individual health insurance policies.

THE POOR AND THE SICK

McConnell kept some of the Obama-era tax increases used by Democrats to finance expanded coverage.

Reports said a 28-year-old woman was beaten by her husband Thursday evening between 20 and 30 times with a pipe and at one point the husband paused to send their children back to bed when they checked to see what was happening.

The husband was not there when police arrived about 9:20 p.m. at the victim's home in the first block of East Judson Avenue. Reports said police had to go inside after finding a broken window and no one answered the door.

Reports said the woman was arguing with her husband over a fake Facebook account he has when she threw a phone at him. The husband then picked up a pipe and began beating her, reports said.

Reports said the woman had bruises on her body consistent with being hit with a pipe. Police found a pipe in the home and took it as evidence.

January as MVSD chief engineer after failing for more than 18 months to obtain a Class 4 water engineer's license needed for the job.

At the time, the district created the position of plant operations manager, which pays \$77,000 annually, and selected Vigorito for the job with the board expecting he'd eventually get the license, Blair said.

On March 23, a Mahoning County grand jury indicted Vigorito on two counts each of forgery, tampering with records and falsification of training documents for allegedly falsifying training records of Youngstown water workers. Vigorito has pleaded innocent to those charges.

The week before Vigorito's April 4 arraignment on those charges in Mahoning County Common Pleas Court, the MVSD board placed him on paid administrative leave, converting that to unpaid administrative leave later that month.

His Class 3 water treatment license was suspended by the state.

The MVSD sells treated water from the Meander Reservoir to Youngstown and Niles, which distributes it to about 200,000 customers in Mahoning and Trumbull counties.

Martin F. White, Vigorito's attorney, declined Friday to comment to *The Vindicator* about the MVSD board's decision to eliminate his client's job.

Vigorito is charged with falsifying training records of 25 Youngstown Water De-

partment employees and a former city water department worker, who were enrolled in two-day continuing-education courses he was to teach in Youngstown for the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency in May 2013 and September 2014.

Investigators from the Ohio Attorney General's Office contend the workers did not complete the courses.

The 25 water department employees and the former worker pleaded guilty in March to falsifying their training hours and agreed to testify against Vigorito.

Under a plea agreement with the AG's office, the defendants agreed to pay \$2,000 in restitution to the city, plus a \$1,000 fine and a \$250 court administrative fee.

Some agreed to perform 50 hours of community service, but others opted to pay an additional \$1,000 fine instead.

The OEPA revoked their certificates, and the city imposed pay cuts on them and required them to complete a business ethics course.

Vigorito was an OEPA-approved instructor, who taught the classes on his own time as a side job. The agency isn't allowing him to teach the courses during the legal proceedings.

Not using Vigorito "has had minimal impact on the number of courses available to operators in Mahoning and Trumbull counties" as there are several other OEPA-approved training providers who can teach in the area, said Mike Settles, an agency spokesman.

Dr. Yurich, 38, of Poland, faces several charges stemming from a fatal Berlin Reservoir boat crash on May 9, 2015, that left one man dead and another man injured.

Dr. Yurich is charged with operating a watercraft while intoxicated, aggravated vehicular homicide and aggravated vehicular assault in addition to leaving the scene of an accident.

The aggravated vehicular homicide and aggravated vehicular assault charges require the prosecution to prove he was intoxicated when the boat crash occurred.

In response to Maro's arguments, prosecuting attorney Dawn Cantalamessa said Dr. Yurich violated the speed limit at night and left the scene of an accident.

Also, despite his attorneys arguing that Dr. Yurich believed there was a hole in his boat and he might sink, he decided to drive several minutes to his home rather than the nearest boat dock.

"He went full throttle home to get out of there," Cantalamessa said.

Maro countered that speeding is not in and of itself a sign of impairment.

Judge John M. Durkin of

Mahoning County Common Pleas Court overruled Maro's motion.

At this point in time, Judge Durkin said he is obligated to consider the evidence in a light most favorable to the prosecution.

The majority of Friday's proceedings concerned the testimony of Richard McCullough, an investigator for the Ohio Department of Natural Resources.

The damage on the speedboat, operated by Dr. Yurich, indicated that the boat either struck something or was struck at a high rate of speed, McCullough said.

The damage on the fishing boat which Neal Cuppett, 58, of Akron, who died in the crash, was on board indicated that the boat was stationary when it was hit, McCullough added.

The damage was not consistent with a submerged rock because the damage to Dr. Yurich's boat was above the waterline.

During Maro's cross-examination, she questioned McCullough's credentials. The investigator took a course in 2004 and two more in 2014. This was his first accident reconstruction since the 2014 courses.

The trial will resume at 9 a.m. Monday, when the defense will begin to call witnesses.

er Fusions, which all came through a rail yard in Warren.

All together, about 14.5 per kilos per car, or 400 pounds of marijuana, was found. It has a street value between \$400,000 to \$1 million.

The Portage County Sheriff's Office is also investigating, along with the DEA.

Balzano said investigators found marijuana in Fusions in Stark and Columbiana counties and as far away as Pennsylvania.

Once the marijuana was found in the Fusion in Kent, investigators searched the rail yard and found more marijuana in five Fusions there before other cars to other dealerships, a news release from the Portage County Sheriff's Office said.

After the Fusions were built in Mexico, they were shipped over the border through Arizona, the news release said.

Balzano, however, said he does not believe the marijuana was slated to get to the dealerships.

He said he believes it was to be retrieved before the cars made it to the dealerships, but for some reason whoever was supposed to retrieve it never did.

Maj. Dale Kelly of the Portage County Sheriff's Office also said he thinks someone was supposed to get the marijuana sooner.

"Somebody messed up somewhere," Kelly said.

Kelly said it is not the first large shipment of drugs he has seen in the county, but it is the first time he has seen it smuggled in this way.

"This is obviously cartel related," Kelly said. "That's a lot of dope."

He also said he believes the marijuana that was seized in Minnesota comes from the same smuggling operation. Both shipments were packaged the exact same way, Balzano said.

If the marijuana was meant for this area, Balzano said it would mean that someone with Mexican ties wants to compete with people here who sell domestic marijuana.

"Marijuana that comes into this area doesn't come in this way," Balzano said.

ing both floors of the two-story building, allowing for ample natural light.

And, of course, there are lots and lots of books.

While the retailer will offer a few shelves worth of general reading titles – including a few books by YSU President Jim Tressel – the store's primary functions as YSU students' main source of class textbooks and supplies.

Little in the actual management of the bookstore will change from its previous iteration. The new bookstore will still price match textbooks students find on Amazon and still offers physical and some digital textbooks.

The textbooks inhabit the store's entire second floor, sharing the space only with an information desk and a counter where students can

pick up textbooks they've ordered from Barnes & Noble's online shop.

On the larger first floor, nearly all the 13,000 square feet is split between the Starbucks Cafe and a "spirit shop" full of YSU-branded merchandise.

Along with serving the expected caffeinated beverages and pastries, the cafe also features "smart tables" with electric outlets and USB ports for charging devices, as well as an outdoor seating area facing campus.

Sharing the ground floor is a section of YSU apparel and accessories, from business card holders to hats and hoodies and giant foam fingers.

Store manager Heather White said along with retail opportunities, she intends to bring events to the space as well.

"We'd like to get authors in here to do book signings, and we're looking to work

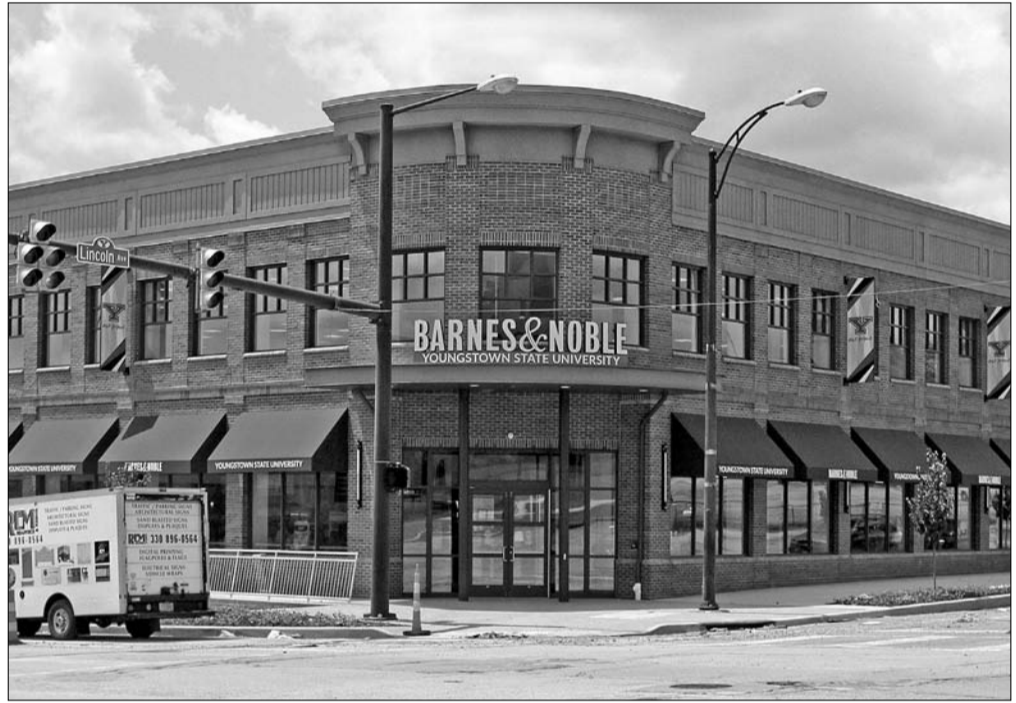
with the music departments at the university to arrange for student performers to play in the store," White said.

The store will employ eight full-time workers and has hired 40 part-time student workers from YSU.

While the store will be open to the public Monday, a grand-opening ceremony is being planned for mid-August once students have returned to campus.

Barnes & Noble manages more than 700 campus bookstores nationwide. White said the YSU location is one of only three in Ohio – the others are Ohio State University and the University of Toledo – to include a cafe.

The bookstore, which broke ground last October, is part of a major expansion of YSU's properties west of the campus, which includes a 220-bed university apartment complex.

A sting operation conducted by Austintown police caught a Lisbon man trying to engage in sexual activity with a minor, a report states.

Matthew Earl, 36, of Lisbon Road, is charged with importing a minor and possession of criminal tools. He was taken into custody by Austintown police Wednesday at McDonald's on state Route 45.

He reportedly planned to meet a minor at the restaurant to "discuss farming animals."

The report said Earl "communicated with the underage male via text message in a graphic manner."

Austintown police set up the sting by posting a male seeking male ad on the internet classifieds site backpage.com.

Earl reportedly answered the ad June 14, and knowingly conversed with an undercover officer posing as a 15-year-old boy, said Detective Jeff Solic of Austintown police.

Warrants were drafted for Earl's arrest shortly after he answered the ad, Solic said, and they set up a meeting.

Solic said department surveillance had Earl at an Austintown hotel coaxing the minor to visit him.

"Earl continued to converse for the sole purpose of engaging in sexual activity," Solic said.

Earl's court date is set for Monday at 1 p.m.

Kasich: Both parties needed for successful health care bill

COLUMBUS

Ohio Gov. John Kasich says the latest version of the Senate's health care bill remains unacceptable - and he blames partisanship.

The outspoken Republican said in a statement Friday the legislation is flawed because it cuts Medicaid too deeply, fails to give needed flexibility to states and doesn't do enough to stabilize the insurance market.

Kasich has preached cooperation between the parties since running for president last year, including in a book published after dropping out of the campaign.

He's among a bipartisan group of governors he says is standing ready to help Washington lawmakers craft acceptable legislation repealing and replacing President Barack Obama's Affordable Care Act.

Bond of \$1M set in murder case

WARREN

A judge set bond of \$1 million for Arteum P. Brodeur, 24, after he was indicted in the stabbing death of Michael Krevas, 31, July 8.

The men lived about a block from each other, and the stabbing took place in an apartment parking lot next to Brodeur's home, which is only a block north of the jail where Brodeur now lives.

Brodeur, of North Park Avenue, pleaded not guilty to charges of murder and tampering with evidence before Judge W. Wyatt McKay of Trumbull County common pleas court. If convicted, the penalty would be 15 years to life in prison.

Police have not said what led up to the 9:30 p.m. stabbing, but Chris Becker, assistant county prosecutor, said the killing is "not what I would consider a drug-related case," though drugs are an "overlay" to much of

the crime in the county.

Brodeur was arrested late July 8, a few hours after Krevas was found

stabbed. Krevas lived on Washington Street Northwest.

The sheriff's office confirmed that Brodeur was assaulted early Wednesday in the jail and was taken to St. Joseph Warren Hospital for treatment of minor injuries to his head.

Two men were charged Friday in Warren Municipal court in the assault. Kashuan Williams, 23, of Sweetbrier Street Southwest, and Marquis D. Porterfield, 20 of Belmont Street will both be arraigned at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday on misdemeanor assault charges.

A jail incident report says Williams assaulted Brodeur with fists and a plastic garbage can while Brodeur was lying on a cot. Porterfield was not mentioned, but the incident

was recorded on surveillance video.

Jail officials said it's not known what the fight was about. Brodeur did appear to have bruising in various places on his head when he appeared in court Friday.

Meanwhile, Jacob Larosa, 17, charged with the murder of his elderly neighbor, may be closer to going to trial after a pretrial hearing in Judge McKay's courtroom Friday.

Larosa, of Lafayette Avenue in Niles, is accused of killing Marie Belcastro, 94, at her home on Cherry Street in Niles March 31, 2015.

A competency evaluation has been conducted on Larosa to determine whether he's competent to stand trial, but it may be necessary to have a second evaluation, court officials said.

At the next hearing, at 9 a.m. Aug. 4, officials expect to know whether any additional evaluations will be needed or whether the trial can proceed early in 2018.

Police: No suspects in early Friday shooting

Bobovnyk also would not say if anything was taken.

There were other family members present when Bell was shot and they called 911, Bobovnyk said.

Bell was placed on life support in the hospital, Bobovnyk said.

Ex-teacher stipulates to probation violation

Dana pleaded guilty June 15, 2015, to two counts of sexual battery, a third-degree felony and a count of attempted sexual battery, a fourth-degree felony. Dana also must register as a Tier 3 sex offender.

The stipulation came after talks between prosecutors, his attorney and Judge Sweeney.

He will remain in the county jail until his probation-violation hearing.

sian government effort to help the Republican's White House campaign.
The meeting has heightened questions about whether Trump's associates coordinated with Russia to meddle in the presidential election - to help him and thwart Hillary Clinton - and whether they've been forthcoming about their foreign contacts. Federal and congressional investigators are probing possible connections between the campaign and Moscow.
Akhmetshin has been reported to have ties to Russian intelligence, a characterization he dismisses as a "smear campaign." He's a well-known Washington presence, lobbying for Russian interests trying to undermine the allegations of a lawyer who died in a Russian prison and is the namesake of a U.S. sanctions law.
Akhmetshin told the AP he served in the Soviet military in a unit that was part of counterintelligence but he was never formally trained as a spy.
In emails posted by Donald Trump Jr. earlier this week, a music publicist said he arranged the meeting because a Russian lawyer wanted to pass on negative information about Democrat Clinton. The go-between stated that the discussion was part of a Russian government effort to help the GOP candidate.
While Trump Jr. has confirmed that Russian attorney Natalia Veselnitskaya was in the meeting, he has not disclosed Akhmetshin's presence. The president's son has publicly discounted the meeting, saying he did not receive the information he was promised.
In a statement Sunday, Trump Jr. said the attorney had said she had information that people tied to Russia were funding the Democratic National Committee and supporting Clinton, a description that Akhmetshin backed up in his interview with the AP.
In his first public interview about the meeting, Akhmetshin said he accompanied Veselnitskaya to Trump Tower where they met an interpreter. He said he had learned about the meeting only that day when Veselnitskaya asked him to attend. He said he showed up in jeans and a T-shirt.
Veselnitskaya brought with her a plastic folder with printed-out documents that detailed what she believed was the flow of illicit funds to the Democrats, Akhmetshin said. Veselnitskaya presented the contents of the documents to the Trump associates and suggested that making the information public could help the campaign, he said.
"This could be a good issue to expose how the DNC is accepting bad money," Akhmetshin recalled her saying.
Trump Jr. asked the attorney if she had sufficient

evidence to back up her claims, including whether she could demonstrate the flow of the money. But Veselnitskaya said the Trump campaign would need to research it more. After that, Trump Jr. lost interest, according to Akhmetshin.
"They couldn't wait for the meeting to end," he said.
Akhmetshin said he does not know if Veselnitskaya's documents were provided by the Russian government. He said he thinks she left the materials with the Trump associates. It was unclear if she handed the documents to anyone in the room or simply left them behind, he said.
Jared Kushner, Trump's son-in-law and current White House senior adviser, and then-campaign chairman Paul Manafort also attended the meeting. Akhmetshin said he recognized Kushner and Trump Jr. He also said he recognized Manafort because they worked in "adjacent political circles" but never together.
He said there were others in the room but he didn't know them. Publicist Rob Goldstone, who brokered the meeting via email with Trump Jr., has told the AP that he was there.
Asked about Akhmetshin's participation, Manafort spokesman Jason Maloni declined comment. Trump Jr.'s attorney did not respond to inquiries, nor did a spokesman for Kushner. Veselnitskaya has denied having any ties to the Russian government. When reached by the AP this week, she declined comment. She did not respond to additional attempts to contact her Friday.
The confirmation of Akhmetshin's participation in the meeting drew swift reaction from the top Democrat on the House intelligence committee, Rep. Adam Schiff of California, who said he wanted Akhmetshin to appear before the committee and provide "any relevant documents and information."
Schiff said whether Akhmetshin is connected to Russian intelligence or not "it is clear the Kremlin got the message that Donald Trump welcomed the help of the Russian government in providing dirt on Hillary Clinton." Schiff said Trump Jr.'s omission of Akhmetshin's role in his public account of the meeting and the president's son's shifting explanations "paint a portrait of consistent dissembling and deceit."
Kushner disclosed the meeting on his security clearance paperwork, but Schiff said the Akhmetshin revelation raises questions about how much Kushner disclosed about it. He said he believes Kushner's clearance should be reviewed, and "if he was not perfectly candid," the clearance should be revoked.
Akhmetshin, who spoke to the AP while on vacation in France, said the meeting was "not substantive" and he "actually expected more serious" discussion.

Authorities say an Ohio woman was texting on her phone when she struck and killed two 14-year-old girls with her car.

Twenty-four-year-old New Franklin resident Natasha Boggs was arrested and jailed Friday. She's charged with voluntary manslaughter, vehicular homicide, driving while texting and other offenses.

Court records don't indicate if she has an attorney.

Boggs is accused of hitting three teens in Coventry Township in May, killing Taylor Galloway, of Akron, and Amber Thoma, of Coventry Township. A 15-year-old boy was seriously injured.

Civil-rights activists call on prosecutor for third trial

CINCINNATI

Civil-rights activists and other community leaders are joining the family of an unarmed black man killed during a traffic stop in calling for a third trial of a white former police officer.

Black Lawyers Association of Cincinnati President Donyetta Bailey said in a press conference Friday that the Ray Tensing case shouldn't end without justice being done.

Prosecutor Joe Deters' could announce next week a decision on whether Tensing will be tried again. The judge has scheduled a July 24 meeting. Tensing's attorney has asked her to dismiss the charges after two hung juries on murder and voluntary manslaughter charges.

The since-fired University of Cincinnati officer says he feared for his life when motorist Sam DuBose tried to drive away from the July 19, 2015, stop.

Fair hogs to be destroyed after swine flu found

WILMINGTON, OHIO

State officials have ordered the slaughter of nearly 300 hogs at a county fair in Ohio after at least two animals tested positive for swine flu.

WLWT-TV reports a Clinton County fair representative confirmed Thursday that hogs had tested positive and would be slaughtered.

An Ohio Department of Agriculture spokesman said Friday that the fair will disinfect the barn and its contents to stop any spread of the virus. Department spokesman Mark Bruce says any equipment inside the barn will be released to owners after disinfection.

Hog breeder Joey Johnson says it's been difficult, especially for children whose animals will be slaughtered.

The federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says when humans are infected with swine flu it's typically transmitted by prolonged exposure to hogs at agricultural fairs.

Arab gunmen kill 2 Israeli policemen at Jerusalem shrine

JERUSALEM

Arab assailants struck at ground zero of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict Friday, opening fire from inside a major Jerusalem shrine and killing two Israeli policemen before being shot dead.

The rare attack from within the sacred site, revered by both Muslims and Jews, raised new concerns about an escalation of violence. The three attackers were Arab citizens of Israel, also a rarity in a rash of Palestinian attacks on Israeli civilians and soldiers that erupted about two years ago, in part over tensions at the holy site.

Jerusalem police commissioner Yoram Halevy said the attack was well planned: The assailants had obtained automatic weapons and stayed at the holy compound the night before. He said they marked their targets in advance and after shooting them ran back inside the compound.

Guns, churches, immigrants: What's in spending bill?

WASHINGTON

Out of the spotlight, a House panel has taken steps to help victims of gun violence and allow robust politicking from the pulpit.

The Republican-led House Appropriations Committee passed a \$20 billion spending bill Thursday to fund the Treasury Department, the Judiciary and other federal agencies.

Quietly tucked inside were numerous provisions that have little to do with

funding the federal government. These are called riders. The bill now goes to the full House. A look at some of the provisions:

YOUNG IMMIGRANTS

The bill would allow young immigrants enrolled in former President Barack Obama's Deferred Actions for Childhood Arrival program to apply for jobs with the federal government.

Rep. Pete Aguilar, D-Calif., said young people brought into the country as children

"identify as Americans." For many, he said, the U.S. is the only country they have ever called home.

The DACA program gives hundreds of thousands of young people illegally brought into the U.S. as children a work permit and protection from deportation.

POLITICAL CHURCHES

One provision prevents the IRS from enforcing a 63-year-old law that prevents churches and other nonprofits from backing po-

litical candidates. Under the law, nonprofits could lose their tax-exempt status if they get directly involved in political campaigns, either by donating to them or publicly endorsing candidates.

The law doesn't stop religious groups from weighing in on public policy or organizing in ways that may benefit one side in a campaign.

The provision forbids the IRS from spending money to enforce the law against "a church, or a convention or association of churches,"

unless the IRS commissioner signs off on it and notifies Congress.

GUN VIOLENCE

The bill encourages states to use funding from the Crime Victims Fund to establish or expand hospital-based programs that help victims of gun violence.

Under such programs, gunshot victims receive counseling at hospitals to help them access community services and avoid getting shot again.

Travel ruling paves way for more refugees, but appeal awaits

WASHINGTON

A court decision on President Donald Trump's travel ban has reopened a window for tens of thousands of refugees to enter the United States, and the government is looking to quickly close it.

The administration late Friday appealed directly to the U.S. Supreme Court after a federal judge in Hawaii ordered it to allow in refugees formally working with a resettlement agency in the United States.

U.S. District Judge Derrick Watson also vastly expanded the list of U.S. family relationships that refugees and visitors from six Muslim-majority countries can use to get into the country, including grandparents and grandchildren.

The ruling was the latest twist in a long, tangled legal fight that will culminate with arguments before the nation's high court in October.

It could help more than 24,000 refugees who had already been vetted and approved by the United States but would have been barred by the 120-day freeze on refugee admissions, said Becca Heller, director of the International Refugee Assistance Project, a resettlement agency.

"Many of them had already sold all of their belongings to start their new lives in safety," she said. "This decision gives back hope to so many who would otherwise be stranded indefinitely."

Citing a need to review its vetting process to ensure national security, the administration capped refugee admissions at 50,000 for the 12-month period ending Sept. 30, a ceiling it hit this week.

The federal budget can accommodate up to 75,000 refugees, but admissions have slowed under Trump, and the government could hold them to a trickle, resettlement agencies say.

"Absolutely this is good news for refugees, but there's a lot of uncertainty," said Melanie Nezer, spokeswoman for HIAS, a resettlement agency. "It's really going to depend on how the administration reacts to this."

Attorney General Jeff Sessions said the administration will ask the Supreme Court to weigh in, bypassing the San Francisco-based 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, which has ruled against it in the case.

The Supreme Court allowed a scaled-back version of the travel ban to take effect last month.

The justices now are scattered during their summer recess, so any short-term action would come in written filings.

The administration has lost most legal challenges on the travel ban, which applies to citizens of Syria, Sudan, Somalia, Libya, Iran and Yemen.

How hot is too hot aboard an airliner? The law doesn't say

DENVER

Every day, tens of thousands of U.S. airline passengers settle into their seats, lower the window shades and reach up to twist the air vents without the benefit of something that might do even more to keep them cool: a rule setting temperature limits inside the cabin.

Airlines have their own guidelines — some allowing the mercury to hit 90 degrees Fahrenheit — and federal regulations cover air flow and, more generally, passenger safety and comfort.

But nowhere do authorities say how hot is too hot when a plane is sitting on the ground — a fact illustrated this summer when a mother holding her beetered infant had to plead to be let off a broiling regional jet stuck on the tarmac at Denver International Airport.

Emily France said she and her 4-month-old son, Owen, sweltered aboard the 50-seat "oven with wings" for more than an hour June 22 before it returned to the gate and passengers were allowed off briefly.

When they re-boarded the United Airlines flight to El Paso, Texas, the cabin felt even warmer, France said.

With the flight delayed again, she stripped off Owen's clothing and applied ice bags brought by flight attendants, but his condition deteriorated.

"I heard a cry from my son that I have never heard before, and his skin looked a color that I had never seen before, and I knew he was in trouble," she said. "Then he just stopped crying. And he went limp in my arms."

"I said, 'Get an ambulance and get me off the plane,'" she recalled.

She and the boy were taken away by ambulance. Doctors determined the baby suffered no lasting effects.

France said she hopes federal regulators take note, and she has hired a lawyer who specializes in airline-safety law. He is demanding an explanation.

"There is no reason why heat bad enough to cause people to pass out is happening in cabins," said the attorney, David Rapoport.

The FAA declined to comment on the need for specific rules on cabin temperature when a plane is on the ground.

FBI: Fugitive lawyer linked to Social Security fraud spotted

LOUISVILLE, KY.

Federal agents tracking a fugitive Kentucky lawyer involved in a massive Social Security fraud case released surveillance photos Friday indicating that his escape route took him to New Mexico.

The FBI said the weeks-old photos showed Eric Conn at a gas station and a Walmart in New Mexico. The photos were revealed on the same day the flamboyant disability lawyer was supposed to be in federal court to face sentencing.

The sentencing proceeded in Lexington, Ky., without Conn. The man who once was one of the country's top disability lawyers was given a 12-year prison term — the maximum possible.

The FBI, meanwhile, revealed more details about Conn's escape, and the path he took to so far elude authorities.

Conn cut off his electronic monitor and fled on June 2 by using a truck registered by a co-conspirator to a dummy company in Montana, Amy Hess, the FBI's top agent in Kentucky, said in a statement Friday.

"The FBI traced the truck to where it was ultimately abandoned for us to find in New Mexico near the border," Hess said.

There's no indication Conn crossed into Mexico, she said.

The FBI did not identify Conn's alleged accomplice.

Conn had been on house arrest, but was in Lexington to meet with prosecutors to plan for his testimony in a related case.

Conn pleaded guilty in March to stealing from the federal government and bribing a judge in a more than \$500 million Social Security fraud case. A \$20,000 reward is being offered to information leading to his arrest.

In a recent email exchange with the *Lexington Herald-Leader*, a person claiming to be Conn said he fled the U.S. using a fake passport, escaping to a country that does not have an extradition agreement with the U.S.

The FBI on Friday released two photos that it said showed Conn buying food and water at a gas station in Santa Rosa, N.M., and pushing a bike at a Walmart in Deming, N.M., in early June.

Pittsburgh's weird concert boat could soon be dismantled

Point Counterpoint II, a 195-foot-long, self-propelled, otherworldly concert boat, has brought music from the rivers of Pittsburgh to small towns throughout America to the great capitals of Europe for 41 years.

Soon, however, it may be headed for a new destination — a shipyard in Louisiana — and a new destiny, as a regular old crane barge.

Yo-Yo Ma, the world's most famous cellist, and Robert Austin Boudreau, an eccentric 90-year-old conductor who lives on a farm in Mars, are trying to save it from that fate.

Point Counterpoint II is a true Pittsburgh story, featuring cameos by H.J. Heinz II, U.S. Steel and the vessel's designer, Louis Kahn, one of the greatest architects in American history.

Boudreau, the boat's owner, is the music director of the American Wind Symphony Orchestra, which has performed on Point Counterpoint II since 1976. He's tried to find a new owner for two decades.

"It's getting to be 50 years old," Boudreau said by phone from Manistique, Mich., a stop on the AWSO's current and perhaps final tour. "And boats don't last forever."

So Ma has tried to drum up interest in Point Counterpoint II. After an article about Kahn appeared in the *New York Review of Books* in June, the cellist submitted a letter to the publication to make his plea.

"Robert Boudreau just turned 90," Ma wrote in the as-yet-unpublished letter. "He and his wife, Kathleen, have decided that they cannot keep running the barge, and he cannot find a new guardian for it. I humbly ask that your readers join Robert and me in finding a new home for Point Counterpoint II."

Move quickly, responsibly to repurpose former YDC

NOW THAT THE OHIO GENERAL Assembly has demonstrated the eminently good sense in preserving a perk for the Mahoning Valley in its \$65 billion 2018-19 state budget, it now falls on local leaders to maximize the benefits and impact of that perk.

That benefit, wisely added to the state spending blueprint by State Sen. Joe Schiavoni of Boardman, D-33rd, came in the form of a transfer in ownership of the 36-acre property in Austintown that until last month stood as the state-operated Youngstown Developmental Center to the Mahoning County Mental Health and Recovery Board. The state-mandated final shutdown of the center that treated developmentally disabled individuals took place June 30.

From our vantage point and that of social-service agency leaders, the property wields massive potential to assist vulnerable populations throughout the Valley. That's why there is no time to waste toward pinpointing, planning and implementing the most valuable uses for the greatest number of people for the former YDC campus. That expansive gift from the state includes thousands of square feet of office space, residential buildings, a gymnasium and an industrial-sized kitchen among other amenities.

Leading the campaign of transformation is Duane Piccirilli, executive director of the Mahoning County mental health board, and officials of the privately-run Meridian HealthCare.

Meridian, a well-respected comprehensive drug-addiction treatment center, is expected to act as property manager for the yet unnamed social-service campus that straddles the Austintown-Mineral Ridge border.

Larry Moliterno, Meridian president and CEO, said the goal is to have several social-service organizations sharing the facility. "We've never had anything in the Valley like that," he said. "It's pretty unique."

ENDLESS POSSIBILITIES

Yes, and the possibilities are seemingly endless. Among ideas bandied about so far include using housing units for independent living for those in the later stages of recovery, adults with developmental disabilities or assisted living for senior citizens. A hodgepodge of nonprofits could populate office space. An industrial kitchen could be used to serve Head Start programs in the Valley, and the gym could be used for recreation and social events for the disabled and other targeted groups.

Now that potential tenants are being courted to achieve those or other ends, the board and Meridian should keep foremost in mind pledges made during the drive to win legislative approval for the property swap.

Prime among them was the plan to gather maximum public input on what shape the campus should take. That would include recommendations from those who need and provide services as well as residents who live near the former YDC. Already, they've received a promise that no detoxification programming will take place there and that the social-services complex will serve as a "good neighbor."

The sooner such public meetings take place, the sooner more concrete plans can take shape and a time line for the property's repurposing, opening and operational financing can take place. Leaders also have pledged to spend not one red penny of local taxpayer dollars on the project. That's a pledge they must equally respect.

Responsibility should guide every step of the way for the valuable project. Its centralized Valley location, its promise of one-stop social-service shopping and its insurance that the former YDC will not morph into a public eyesore all should energize the project into high gear.

Robocall crackdown – at last

Chicago Tribune: If you've ever had your dinner interrupted by an annoying robocall sales pitch - and who hasn't? - this will make you smile: The Federal Communications Commission is proposing a \$120 million fine for a Miami man accused of duping customers in an alleged vacation telemarketing scam in 2016. Victims were told that the trip packages or time-shares came from well-known travel companies, authorities say. They didn't.

That epic fine, the largest proposed in FCC history, is for more than 96 million illegal phone calls made in just three months.

That fine sounds about right to us. We hope other scammers get the message. Ditto for companies that ring cellphones without the owner's consent. On Thursday, the FCC fined a New Mexico-based robocalling company \$2.88 million for robocalls to cellphones without prior consent.

"This is the latest step we've taken to stop the scourge of illegal robocalls," FCC Chairman Ajit Pai said. "But it won't be the last."

Sometimes, it takes a sheer act of will to turn right, not left, at a certain point on our evening walk. Other times, will fails and longing wins.

My husband and I have not lived in what we call "our real house" for 15 years. We've lived eight-tenths of a mile away from it for that long.

But some gravitational force, especially on soft summer nights, propels us back to that street and that house where like love-struck teens, we stop and gaze at the old Tudor – the "old girl," we called her – where we spent 28 years. We left only when it was painfully clear even to us that the place was just too big, too complicated and too demanding for the likes of us.

But homes retain their claim on us. Enclosed within are memories. Matters of the heart and the soul. A fondness that for us reached all the way to love.

For my husband, it was the stairway, brazenly uncarpeted, grand in a 1920s kind of way, that let him surrender to a house that was always going to be demanding. For me, it was the sparks of color when the sun hit the stained-glass den windows in the afternoon. For our school-age kids, there was no better house in the universe for hide and seek.

Our kids begged us to stay put even after they left for college. And again when they returned to the area. Their dream was to be married in our backyard.

"They'll change their minds when the time comes," I assured my husband. I was wrong.

And it came to pass that Jill, Amy, and Nancy all got their wish. On three June days a few years apart, the Friedman brides walked down that staircase that had seduced us from the start.

Then each was escorted by her father down the path from the front door to the old beech tree in the yard. It wasn't planned. He ad-libbed the circling of that much-loved tree for the first wedding, and it was a required ritual for the second and third.

Then a few years passed, and we sensed it was time to part from the "old girl." Even our daughters – and their husbands and even friends – prodded us with a well-meaning clarion call for change. Ready or not.

My husband had retired. We were grandparents. And this was the time to sell, the local Realtors kept reminding us.

So the potential buyers came. One couple talked about spreading wall-to-wall carpeting on our old oak floors. Another muttered about the impractical "traffic flow." Wildly impartial, we vowed we'd never sell to them.

Then along came a couple who were as smitten as we had been. But we had to be out in eight weeks. So we were – because we wanted them to be the next custodians of that tyrannical old Tudor.

We signed the papers on one of the worst days in American history: 9/11/2001. It truly felt as if we were moving from one universe into another.

We have been back. An even newer set of owners graciously invited us to their holiday party and let us roam. The rooms were wonderful – but not the same. The kitchen was beautiful and modern – but the photos on the shelves in the living room were not of our kids.

Other guests at the party knew of our connection and gave us space and privacy as we wandered. But if they watched this elderly couple, chances are they saw us wiping away a tear or two along the way.

Certain homes have souls, so yes, on summer nights when we can't resist, we walk past, and pause just to look – and remember.

Trump minimizes importance of Russia's assault on US democracy

For a president who lies more than any of his predecessors – even Lyndon B. Johnson and Richard Nixon – Donald Trump can also be candid to a fault. Recall how, after firing FBI Director James B. Comey, he blew apart the spin that this had nothing to do with any investigation of the Trump campaign by openly admitting that he acted because of the "Russia thing." Over the weekend he did it again – and at the most damaging time imaginable: just before the blockbuster revelations about Donald Trump Jr. exclaiming "I love it" at the prospect of getting election help from the Russian government.

Trump's aides claim he was tough on Russian President Vladimir Putin when they met in Hamburg, Germany. Secretary of State Rex Tillerson said Trump "pressed" Putin "regarding Russian involvement." Anonymous U.S. officials deny Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov's assertions that Trump "accepted" Putin's false assurances that Russia was not behind the hacking and leaking of Democratic Party documents last year.

PRESIDENT'S OPINION

But then on Sunday morning Trump took to Twitter to essentially confirm what Lavrov said: "I strongly pressed President Putin twice about Russian meddling in our election. He vehemently denied it. I've already given my opinion..." Yes, he did: In Warsaw, the day before his meeting with Putin, Trump opined, as he has many times before, "I think it could very well have been Russia, but I think it could well have been other countries. Nobody really knows. Nobody really knows for sure."

This is, as the British say, bollocks. We do know for sure: the FBI, CIA, NSA and the Office of the Director of National Intelligence issued a unanimous "high confidence" assessment in January that Russia was behind the hacking last year, and that its intent was to hurt Hillary Clinton and to help Donald Trump. Trump's misleading assertions that it was "three or four" intelligence agencies, not all 17, are meaningless, because there was no dissent from the other

intelligence agencies. And, as former Director of National Intelligence James R. Clapper said, "We saw no evidence that it was anyone involved in this other than the Russians."

Yet, despite all evidence to the contrary, Trump refuses to accept reality. In Hamburg, he even discussed with Putin an Alice-in-Wonderland proposal of forming a joint U.S.-Russian "Cyber Security unit" so that election hacking, & many other negative things, will be guarded." As Sen. John McCain noted sarcastically Sunday, "I am sure that Vladimir Putin could be of enormous assistance in that effort since he's doing the hacking." The idea is so inane that by the end of the day even Trump had disowned it, leaving his Treasury secretary, Steven T. Mnuchin, who had loyally called the cybersecurity partnership "a very significant accomplishment for the president," twisting in the wind.

BASELESS CLAIMS

Trump's denial of Russian election-meddling is all the more startling when contrasted with his reckless promulgation of baseless claims that millions of illegal ballots were cast in the presidential election. There is not an iota of evidence to support this assertion. It is an entirely imaginary scandal manufactured by Trump because his fragile psyche can't handle the fact that Hillary Clinton won more popular votes than he did.

Yet Trump is pursuing nonexistent evidence of wrongdoing with all the powers at his disposal, setting up a voter fraud commission, headed by Kansas Secretary of State Kris Kobach, that is itself fraudulent. Pretty much every state has declined to share voter information with this politically motivated commission because doing so would violate voters' privacy and could open the way to genuine large-scale fraud – imagine if hackers could break into a single database containing all of the nation's voter information.

How to explain the discrepancy, with Trump ignoring a real scandal and doggedly pursuing a phony one? The answer is pretty simple: Trump doesn't care a whit about the national interest. All he cares about is his self-interest.

No matter what Donald

Earl reportedly answered the ad June 14, and knowingly conversed with an undercover officer posing as a 15-year-old boy, said Detective Jeff Solic of Austintown police.

Warrants were drafted for Earl's arrest shortly after he answered the ad, Solic said, and they set up a meeting.

Solic said department surveillance had Earl at an Austintown hotel coaxing the minor to visit him.

"Earl continued to converse for the sole purpose of engaging in sexual activity," Solic said.

Earl's court date is set for Monday at 1 p.m.

Kasich: Both parties needed for successful health care bill

Ohio Gov. John Kasich says the latest version of the Senate's health care bill remains unacceptable - and he blames partisanship.

The outspoken Republican said in a statement Friday the legislation is flawed because it cuts Medicaid too deeply, fails to give needed flexibility to states and doesn't do enough to stabilize the insurance market.

Kasich has preached cooperation between the parties since running for president last year, including in a book published after dropping out of the campaign.

He's among a bipartisan group of governors he says is standing ready to help Washington lawmakers craft acceptable legislation repealing and replacing President Barack Obama's Affordable Care Act.

Kasich said bringing solutions from both sides is necessary to "ensure we aren't simply replacing one divisive plan with another."

Bond of \$1M set in murder case

WARREN

A judge set bond of \$1 million for Arteum P. Brodeur, 24, after he was indicted in the stabbing death of Michael Krevas, 31, July 8.

The men lived about a block from each other, and the stabbing took place in an apartment parking lot next to Brodeur's home, which is only a block north of the jail where Brodeur now lives.

Brodeur, of North Park Avenue, pleaded not guilty to charges of murder and tampering with evidence before Judge W. Wyatt McKay of Trumbull County common pleas court. If convicted, the penalty would be 15 years to life in prison.

Police have not said what led up to the 9:30 p.m. stabbing, but Chris Becker, assistant county prosecutor, said the killing is "not what I would consider a drug-related case," though drugs are an "overlay" to much of

the crime in the county. Brodeur was arrested late July 8, a few hours after Krevas was found stabbed. Krevas lived on Washington Street Northwest.

The sheriff's office confirmed that Brodeur was assaulted early Wednesday in the jail and was taken to St. Joseph Warren Hospital for treatment of minor injuries to his head.

Two men were charged Friday in Warren Municipal court in the assault. Kashuan Williams, 23, of Sweetbrier Street Southwest, and Marquis D. Porterfield, 20 of Belmont Street will both be arraigned at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday on misdemeanor assault charges.

A jail incident report says Williams assaulted Brodeur with fists and a plastic garbage can while Brodeur was lying on a cot. Porterfield was not mentioned, but the incident

was recorded on surveillance video.

Jail officials said it's not known what the fight was about. Brodeur did appear to have bruising in various places on his head when he appeared in court Friday.

Meanwhile, Jacob Larosa, 17, charged with the murder of his elderly neighbor, may be closer to going to trial after a pretrial hearing in Judge McKay's courtroom Friday.

Larosa, of Lafayette Avenue in Niles, is accused of killing Marie Belcastro, 94, at her home on Cherry Street in Niles March 31, 2015.

A competency evaluation has been conducted on Larosa to determine whether he's competent to stand trial, but it may be necessary to have a second evaluation, court officials said.

At the next hearing, at 9 a.m. Aug. 4, officials expect to know whether any additional evaluations will be needed or whether the trial can proceed early in 2018.

Police: No suspects in early Friday shooting

Bobovnyk also would not say if anything was taken.

There were other family members present when Bell was shot and they called 911, Bobovnyk said.

Bell was placed on life support in the hospital, Bobovnyk said.

Ex-teacher stipulates to probation violation

A former Boardman teacher who was on probation for sexual-battery charges stipulated Friday that he violated one of the terms of his probation.

Jay Dana, 60, is jailed pending a probation violation hearing Aug. 11 in Mahoning County Common Pleas Court before Judge Maureen Sweeney. He served a 75-day jail sentence in 2015 on the charge.

Dana admitted to being twice away from his GPS monitoring while he was in Florida. Under the terms of his probation, he was not allowed to be away from his monitoring device.

Dana was indicted on charges in 2013 he molested three women after he slipped something in their drinks that rendered them ill.

Dana had retired as a

teacher in 2011.

Two of the victims in the case were attacked in 2006 and a third was attacked in 2011.

Dana pleaded guilty June 15, 2015, to two counts of sexual battery, a third-degree felony and a count of attempted sexual battery, a fourth-degree felony. Dana also must register as a Tier 3 sex offender.

The stipulation came after talks between prosecutors, his attorney and Judge Sweeney.

He will remain in the county jail until his probation-violation hearing.

Ohio St. facing licensing lawsuit

Spielman says images used for marketing without permission

COLUMBUS

One of Ohio State's most famous football stars sued the university Friday over a marketing program he says used athletes' images without permission and robbed them of compensation.

Linebacker Chris Spielman filed the class-action lawsuit in federal court in Columbus on behalf of current and former Ohio State football players.

The antitrust complaint targets Ohio State marketing programs and contracts that promote the university using likenesses of athletes, including a Honda-sponsored program of 64 banners hung around Ohio Stadium featuring photos of former players.

In addition to Spielman, some of the other Ohio State greats whose pictures appear on those banners include running back

Archie Griffin, who won the Heisman Trophy in 1974 and 1975; lineman Jim Stillwagon, who played on the 1968 national championship team; and Mike Doss, a safety who played on the 2002 national championship team.

All are among the athletes Spielman is suing on behalf of, said Brian Duncan, a Columbus attorney who represents Spielman.

The lawsuit names Ohio State and talent management giant IMG as defendants and names Honda and Nike as co-conspirators. Nike is targeted for its "Legends of the Scarlet and Gray" vintage jersey licensing program and other apparel contracts with Ohio State.

The lawsuit accuses the university and the companies of "unjust and monopolistic behaviors" and asks for compensation above \$75,000, as is typical in such complaints, while noting Ohio State makes millions in revenue from merchandising programs involving ex-athletes.

"Former OSU student-athletes do not share in these revenues even though they have never given informed consent to the widespread and continued commercial exploitation of their images," the lawsuit said.

The university is aware of the lawsuit and is reviewing it, athletic director Gene Smith said Friday.

"We immensely value our relationships with all of our former student athletes,"

"It was cool," Bell said. "The lights go off and come back on, you're rounding third and you see all your teammates at home."

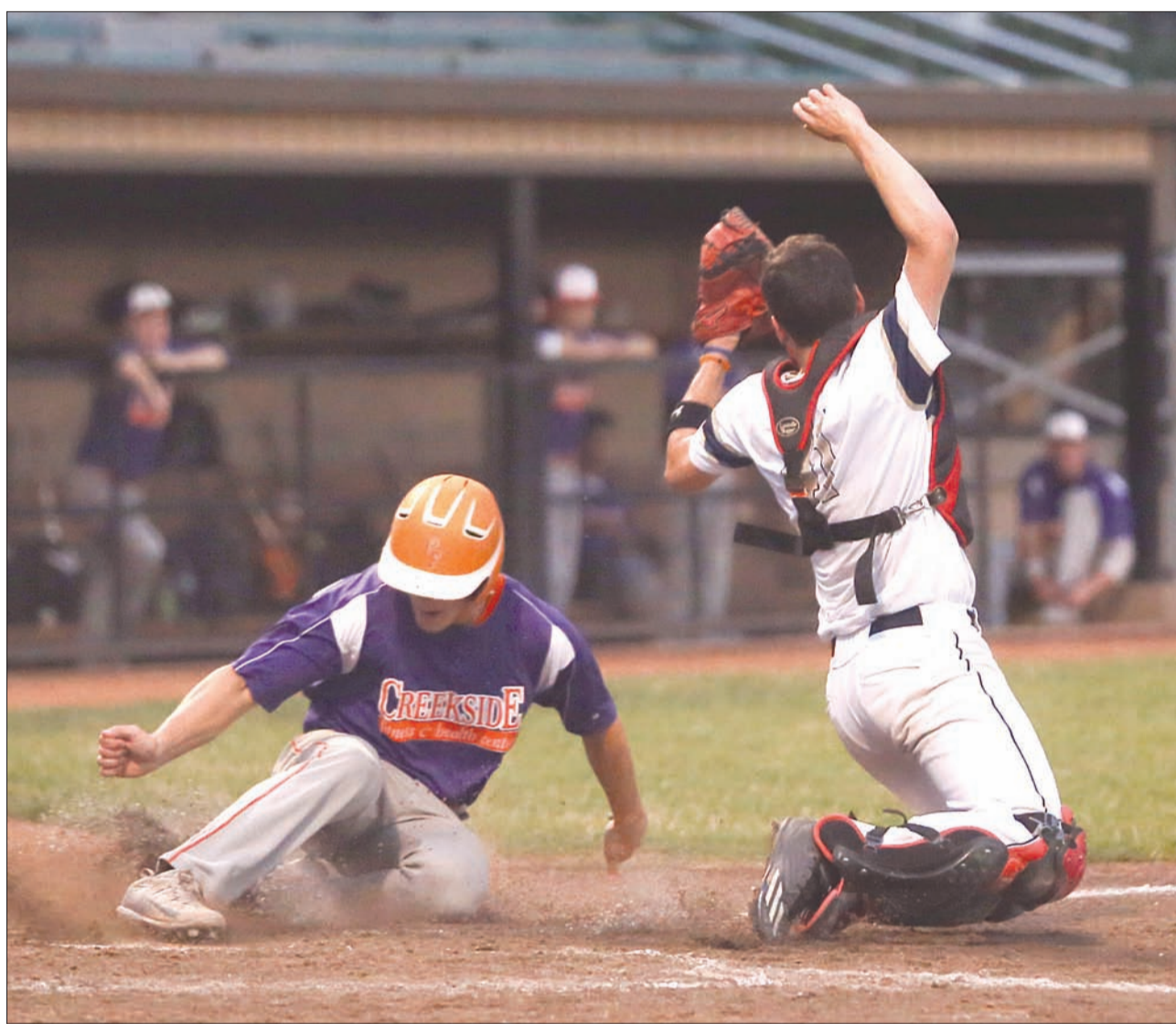

They love their history around these parts and they love Roger Federer and, above all, they love watching him make history.

Now he stands one victory from an unprecedented eighth Wimbledon men's singles championship after qualifying for his 11th appearance in the final, breaking a record he already held.

Just weeks from turning 36, and a father of four, Federer continued his resurgent season and unchallenged run through this fortnight at the All England Club by conjuring up just enough brilliance to beat 2010 runner-up Tomas Berdych 7-6 (4), 7-6 (4), 6-4 in the semifinals Friday.

"It's great, but it doesn't give me the title quite yet. That's why I came here this year," Federer said. "I'm so close now, so I just got to stay focused."

He has won every set he's played in six matches, and while he did not exactly dominate against the 11th-seeded Berdych, Federer was never in much trouble.

On Sunday, Federer will face 2014 U.S. Open champion Marin Cilic, who reached his first Wimbledon final by eliminating

Smith said in a statement. A message seeking comment was left with New York-based IMG. Brian Strong, a spokesman for Beaverton, Oregon-based Nike Inc., said Friday the company is aware of the lawsuit but doesn't comment on pending litigation.

Honda said it has a three-decade-old relationship with Ohio State, and "we hope this matter will be resolved quickly."

Spielman sued in his own right and on behalf of a newly formed company, Profectus Group Inc., created by ex-Ohio State wrestling standout Mike DiSbato, representing former college athletes. Griffin is also affiliated with the company, Duncan said.

The filing comes after eight months of unsuccessful negotiations with the university, Duncan said.

Spielman said he'll donate any money he receives from the lawsuit directly to the university's athletic department. He called the ability to negotiate corporate use of his name and image "a basic human right."

"Ohio State is more than welcome to always use my name and image in any way they want to use it," Spielman told 610 WTVN Radio on Friday.

"The problem comes in when they slap a corporate sponsor on my name and image without my permission, or without giving me the ability to negotiate — or any of our ex-players to negotiate — with that corporation," he said.

Spielman also said attaching his name to Honda puts him in a difficult situation given a separate sponsorship deal he has with a local Mazda dealership.

Griffin told The Associated Press he fully supports the rights of former athletes to receive compensation from corporations and universities that benefit from the unauthorized use of players' names and likenesses.

"There is no greater supporter of collegiate athletics than me, and I will be forever grateful for the opportunities provided to me as a former student athlete," Griffin said in a statement. "However, the recent landscape of collegiate athletics has changed, and these institutions and corporations have a duty to treat all former athletes fairly."

Griffin plans to donate his proceeds to a non-profit affiliated with the Profectus Group, which will serve as a players assistance fund for ex-Ohio State athletes in need.

The lawsuit is the latest development in a trend of athletes fighting for compensation they say they're owed as a result of their participation in intercollegiate sports.

Earlier this year, the NCAA and 11 major athletic conferences announced they agreed to pay \$208.7 million to settle a federal class-action lawsuit filed by former college athletes who claimed the value of their scholarships was illegally capped.

Last year, the U.S. Supreme Court left in place lower-court rulings that said the NCAA's use of names, images and likenesses of college athletes without compensation violated antitrust law. The lawsuit was originally brought by former UCLA basketball star Ed O'Bannon and later joined by other athletes.

After that ruling, athletic departments should know better than to undertake the kind of licensing arrangements with former athletes that Spielman is targeting in his lawsuit, said John Grady, a University of South Carolina professor of sport law.

"You can't use someone's image from however many years ago without compensation, given O'Bannon," Grady said Friday.

Rodgers grabs 2-stroke lead

Patrick Rodgers shot a 7-under 64 on Friday to take a two-shot lead after the second round of the John Deere Classic.

Rodgers had eight birdies and a bogey to finish at 13-under 129 at TPC Deere Run. Finishing on the front nine, he had five birdies in a seven-hole stretch before closing with a bogey on the par-4 ninth.

"It was nice to keep making birdies and keep the gas pedal down," Rodgers said. "It was tricky with some breeze, but I know 13 under is not going to win the golf tournament. So, I got to keep that same mindset for the next two rounds."

Bryson DeChambeau was second after a 65.

Local favorite Zach Johnson, the 2012 winner, had a 67 to join Charles Howell III, the co-leader after the first

round, at 10 under. Howell followed his opening 63 with a 69.

Kevin Tway (63), Chesson Hadley (64), Chad Campbell (68) and J.J. Henry (64) were 9 under.

Tway had nine birdies in a 10-hole stretch en route to the best round of the day.

Hadley is coming off a victory Sunday in the Web.com Tour event in New York.

Rodgers, the 25-year-old former Stanford star who is winless on the PGA Tour, has followed the formula that many players have used to win at TPC Deere Run — converting makeable birdies and largely avoiding mistakes.

Rodgers also made his fair share of tough shots, notably chipping in from 50 feet on the par-3 third hole and holing a 50-foot birdie putt on the seventh hole.

"I put together a really nice round. Was very much

in control. Rolled in some nice putts and stayed very patient," Rodgers said.

DeChambeau, who was just above the FedEx Cup playoff cut line entering the weekend, survived a pair of early bogeys to grab second place.

Tway was struggling to stay above the cut line when he went on his birdie binge, making seven in a row at one point. But Tway's tee shot on his 17th hole found the rough and he was forced to settle for a bogey.

Tway's round, the best of his career, was highlighted by a 28-foot birdie putt on the forgiving third hole.

"I was kind of hoping it would never stop," Tway said. "You've got to make a lot of birdies around here."

Hadley said after his bogey-free round that he felt like he was playing with "house money" after wrapping up a PGA Tour for next

season card last week.

"I've been heading in the right direction for a while, and I think it kind of starts with your attitude, how you think about and handle things," Hadley said. "So I kind of finally got that right, and then everything came together last week obviously."

First-round co-leader Ollie Schniederjans had a 74 to drop eight shots behind Rodgers.

Two-time Masters champion Bubba Watson shot a 70 to make the cut at 3 under, as did Davis Love III (68). Three-time tournament winner Steve Stricker (67) made the cut on the number at 2 under.

Defending champion Ryan Moore shot a 71 and missed the cut, finishing at 3 over after two rounds. Moore missed the previous five weeks with a left shoulder injury.

of criticism for failing to move the tournament when comments made by Trump about women came to light in the past year.

It also was suggested that if the president attended the event it would take the spotlight from the players.

VOICES OF FAITH Q & A

The Kansas City Star (TNS)

Q What part of the Bible do you go to first when congregants make a mess of their lives?

The Rev. Betty Hanna-Witherspoon:

A When I received this question, I could only ask, "What Scripture do I go to when I mess up my life?"

The Scripture is Psalm 51. The annotation above the psalm says that it is the psalm of David when the prophet Nathan came to him after David had committed adultery with Bathsheba.

Psalm 51 is the psalm read on Ash Wednesday as the Lenten season begins. It allows the penitent believer to ask for mercy, to acknowledge transgressions, to ask for cleansing from sins and a return to joy after the pain of separation from God.

The psalm offers the way back to a right relationship with God, to a clean heart and a clean spirit.

The path back is an attitude of humility as manifested in a broken spirit, for God does not despise such an attitude. This psalm allows all of us to acknowledge our sins, take responsibility for them, and ask God to forgive us.

The next Scripture is John 21:15-19. It tells the story of Jesus reinstating Peter.

Peter had denied him

at the time of the crucifixion, but Jesus asks him one question three times, "Do you truly love me?"

Our response to that question gives us the ability to move beyond our messing up and into the next season of our lives.

Rabbi Mark H. Levin, founder, Congregation Beth Torah:

A I turn to Psalms, which I recall the sufferings of our ancestors who believed in God. It's natural for humans to err. Sometimes we blunder because we don't know any better. Other times we know better but proceed anyway.

Psalm 130, particularly the first three verses, I find personally meaningful. I sometimes call out from the depths. The verse "Let your ears be attentive to my supplications" is particularly helpful because God does not hold onto our transgressions or we could not stand.

Human beings may re-

fuse to forgive, even when we repent and apologize. We hold grudges. But God forgives and lets go while sustaining us. I have experienced God's mercy.

Psalm 27 also helps. Knowing the shelter of God's house comforts me. When all others abandon me, God remains my haven.

I also turn to those parts of the Bible that remind me that others greater than I messed up. King David (2 Samuel 11) committed egregious sins both with Bathsheba and against her husband, Uriah.

In recompense David suffered the death of his child, the rape of his daughter, the murder of his son by another son, rebellion and had to flee for his life. Yet David remained steadfast in his faith before God and was rewarded.

Perhaps God also will forgive and comfort me of lesser sins.

Dealing with a problem drinker

Dear Annie: I'm a 16-year-old high-school sophomore. I'm a straight-A student, the president of my school's National Honor Society chapter and a soccer player, and I help teach Sunday school at my church. My parents and I live in a big house in a nice neighborhood. By all outside appearances, my life is great. But I'm holding in a secret: My father is an alcoholic.

Every weekend, my dad gets drunk and does embarrassing things. If we try to go out to dinner, it ends in a big scene, with him upset about something or other. Often he gets really mean to my mom when he's drunk. I try to stay out of the way and hide in my room and listen to music.

My mom has instilled a sense of shame in me about it, so we keep it a secret. Even my closest friends don't know. Recently, I had friends over for a sleepover. The girls were downstairs watching a movie, and I went upstairs to get some blankets. I found my dad passed out in the hallway. I heard the girls coming to see what was taking me so long, and I had to make up an excuse to get them to stay away until I could wake my dad up and get him to go to bed.

I am so tired of feeling so nervous all the time and not knowing what I'm going to find when I get home. My dad manages to hold down a job that pays well. When he's drunk and I tell him I wish he'd stop, he tells me how he works a job he hates just to support me and buy me nice things, adding that he's allowed to do what he wants in his free time.

I guess I'm writing to you because there's no one else I can talk to about this. My mom doesn't even want to talk about it when I bring it up. It's really starting to get to me, and I've been crying myself to sleep at night. How can I get my dad to stop?

SICK AND AFRAID

Dear Sick and Afraid: There is nothing that you can do to get your dad to stop drinking. That is not your burden to bear, even if you'd like to bear it. He must come to the decision to get sober on his own, and I hope that one day he does.

But you can help yourself today by attending an Alateen meeting. There you'll be able to hear the stories of other teens who know exactly what you're going through, and you'll be provided tools for dealing with the anxiety that comes from living with a problem drinker. Dear Annie: I am replying to your column about "So Lost and Lonely," the woman who divorced and whose daughter is so angry with her. I would like to say to her that I had a similar situation. It took a very long time to get past it, but eventually we did. When my daughter was in her early 30s, she simply told me, "I finally grew up." It didn't erase all the tears shed and the pain and anguish experienced. But now that she is a mom, we have a good relationship. Just hang in there. It will get better.

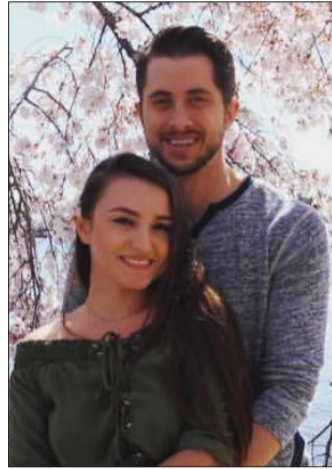

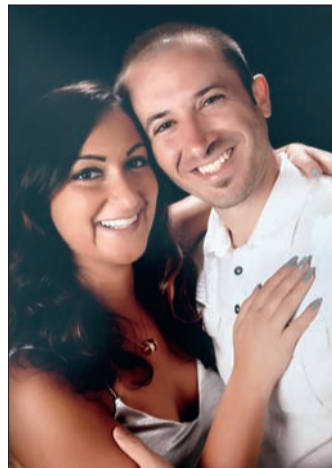

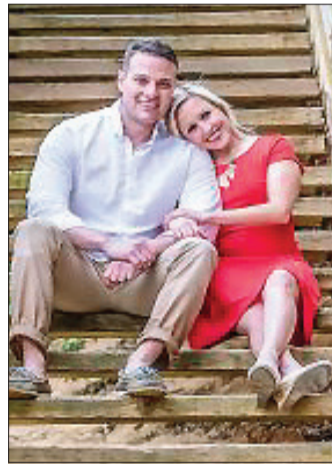

'Dunkirk' director talks movies, message

NEW YORK

Excerpts from an interview with "Dunkirk" director Christopher Nolan:

Q. Because you're such an advocate of the big-screen experience, you're often asked about concerns about the demise of movie theaters. Is that tiresome?

A. I will say it's tiresome. Now it's streaming. Last film, it was television. Ten years ago, it was video games. People love video games. But people also need and love washing machines and they sell a lot of those. It's just not relevant. We've always had TV movies, we've always had miniseries, we've

always had straight-to-video movies. We're making movies for the theater. And theatrical experience isn't just about the size of the screen or the technology behind, although that's a big part of it. It's about an audience, the shared experience. What cinema gives you, unlike any other medium, is this fascinating and wonderful tension and dialogue between this intensely subjective experience you're having from the imagery the filmmaker has put up there, and this extraordinarily empathetic sharing of that with

audience around you. It's a remarkable medium for that and that's what defines it. What's a movie? The only definition of a movie, really, is it's shown in a movie theater.

Q. Did you always conceive of yourself as a filmmaker drawn to epic and to scale?

A. When I was about 15 or 16, I saw an IMAX film – it was actually an Omnimax film – and I was just mesmerized. I said why doesn't Hollywood make features this way? On "The Dark Knight," I was finally able to be the first filmmaker to use IMAX cameras for a Hollywood feature film, and I've sort of built on that.

Q. Does the story of Dunkirk about living to fight another day hold particular relevance today?

A. Dunkirk sustains as an extraordinary resonant story for humanity because it's a bit of a Rorschach test. What was important to me, what I get from the story, and why I think it's a very important story to tell now, I think we live in an era that overemphasizes individuality at the expense of what we can do together. Whether you're talking about in American industry, the fetishization of the individual billionaire versus a union, just to give you one example. What Dunkirk shows you is: We can do so much

more with communal heroism. That's what makes it an unusual war story, of civilians and military coming together. But I think that's why it resonates. We are stronger working together, and for some reason, that's become unfashionable.

Q. Does it strike you that you've made three films in a row about getting home?

A. The concept of home, there's nothing more universal than that. As a filmmaker, I've become interested in primal ideas – ideas that are very simple and can resonate and speak to people in very simple ways but have complex roots to them.

Horror is unintentionally hilarious in 'Wish Upon'

So bad, it's good

What to make of the curious, ridiculous horror-lite "Wish Upon"?

This is a spooky teen story that's not particularly heavy on the scares and overdelivers on the unintentional giggles, almost ensuring it a spot as a cult movie, like the hilariously misguided "The Room," though this sports a far bigger budget and higher-profile names among the cast and crew.

Written by Barbara Marshall and directed by "Annabelle" helmer John R. Leonetti, "Wish Upon" plays on the haunted object premise, with a mysterious Chinese wish box wreaking havoc on the life of Clare (Joey King), who can't stop making wishes, even as her loved ones drop dead around her.

Young Clare has had a hard life. Her mother (Elizabeth Rohm), as we see in a prologue, committed suicide, and things haven't been easy since then. Her dad (Ryan Phillippe) dumpster dives for scrap metal, and Clare is a bit of a misfit at school, a target of violent, crazy outbursts from the local mean girl (within the first 15 minutes, a truly epic cafeteria cat fight goes down).

When dad brings home a dumpster treasure – a mysterious box engraved with Chinese characters – Clare facetiously uses it to wish ill upon her enemy.

And that wish comes true, gruesomely. So Clare keeps wishing for things like popularity, love and money. Later, she claims that she just wanted to feel "normal," though it's unclear how she wasn't normal before, and how suddenly becoming a wealthy, popular girl overnight somehow is "normal."

Things would be ideal if all these people around her weren't meeting untimely deaths in unlucky circumstances. But by the time Clare gets the ancient Chinese characters translated, the box has turned her into its Gollum.

"Wish Upon" is an odd horror film, because the monster is also our heroine. It's not like the box itself is all that terrifyingly compelling; the worst thing is how it transforms its owners.

So even though she willingly puts her friends and family in fatal danger because she wants to keep making out with the popular guy, we have to keep rooting for her.

"Wish Upon" isn't over-the-top wacky or campy, and in fact, feels slightly low-energy at times, but it's the kind of simple filmmaking coupled with absolutely insane writing and plot points that make it an ideal candidate for so-bad-it's-good viewing.

There are so many opportunities for midnight-movie audience interaction too – bizarre and strange

little motifs practically screaming out for a handful of popcorn to be thrown at the screen. Clare wishes her dad were less embarrassing, and he starts playing sweet, sweet sax solos around the house. What?

There's an exceptionally ghastly unfinished painting of a woman's head on a surreal green landscape that keeps hanging around in the background of Clare's bedroom and is beyond distracting. And every line uttered by Paul (Mitchell Slaggert), the dum-dum popular guy, deserves the chant-a-long treatment, from "haters gonna hate" to "I was trying to think of something dope to say before I kissed you."

"Wish Upon" is an entirely harmless, defanged horror flick for the younger set.

It's never all that scary, but it is pretty darn funny – a curio to be enjoyed for its silliness more than anything else.

LORDE

- ◆ **Album:** "Melodrama"

Being wise beyond your years gets old before you know it, Lorde finds out on "Melodrama."

The New Zealand songwriter was 16 in 2013 when she took the charts by surprise with "Royals," a song that signaled that she was an uncommonly accomplished teenage crafts-woman not the least bit interested in the accoutrements of commercial success.

"Gold teeth, Grey Goose ... ball gowns, trashin' the hotel room": the singer born Ella Yelich-O'Connor was having none of it.

Four years later, and Lorde is now a celebrity megastar finally releasing a follow-up album that announces itself as autobiographical and that often makes the emotional cost of too many

nights on the town its subject.

Working with producer Jack Antonoff of Bleachers (and, yes, Lena Dunham's boyfriend) the now-20-year-old songwriter's task on this breakup album that mixes electro-beat euphoria and self-examination is not to prove she's an artist of depth. She did that already.

Instead, it's to maintain a credible outsider's perspective while still coming up with catchy, alienated songs that move in the disorienting grown-up world of strange bedrooms and broken hearts. Lorde uses those experiences, and other emotional torments, to continue to make compelling alt-pop.

FLEET FOXES

After two acclaimed albums of lush, heavenly harmonies and

gentle, Laurel Canyon orchestration, Fleet Foxes went into hibernation.

"Crack-Up" is their first since 2011; in the interim, leader Robin Pecknold took classes at Columbia, and their former drummer Josh Tillman grabbed the spotlight as Father John Misty.

"Crack-Up" is a more complex, darker album than their first two. Songs are full of questions: "If I don't resist / will I understand?"; "Who stole the life from you?"; "Can you be slow for a little while?"

Several songs are suites that stretch past seven minutes and move from lonely, solo ruminations into densely orchestrated grandeur, but whereas in the past the tone was triumphant and affirming, here it is often dissonant and conflicted.

The signature harmonies are still there, as are moments of

beauty in songs such as "If You Need to, Keep Time on Me" and the title track.

The sun-dappled melodies have given way to something deeper and more demanding but still rewarding.

BIG BOI

Now that Andre 3000 is officially lost in the ozone of innovative music greats who just can't seem to get it together to make that solo move, we leave it to the other member of OutKast, the smooth and salty voiced Big Boi, to represent the ATL and all its sweet, funky, spacey virtues.

For the most part, Big has provided soul-sonic hip-hop listeners with a George Clinton-like array of purplish psychedelico-funk touches — save for 2012's "Vicious Lies & Dangerous Ru-

mors" and 2015's "Big Grams," which both dabbled lamely in the indie-hop and blip-rock worlds, respectively.

"Boomiverse" brings Big back — firmly — to Parliament-Funkadelic-style rap attacks with the braggadocio of "Get Wit It" and the still-life piano plinking "All Night" being prime examples of what he's always done best.

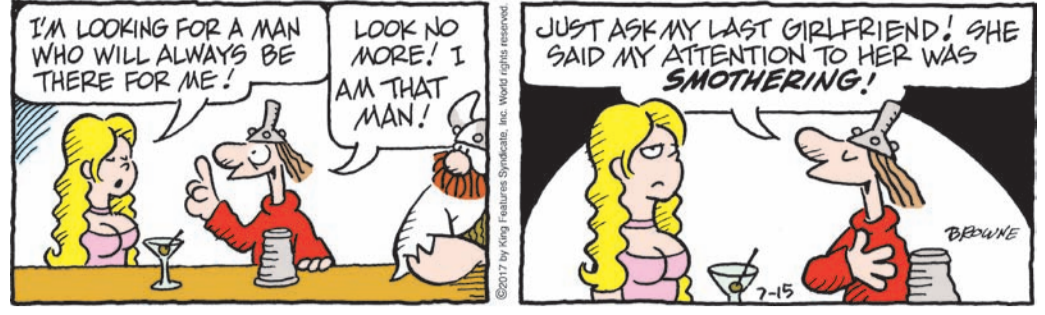
Big Boi ups the ante on "Kill Jill" with fellow ATL pals Killer Mike and Jeezy — not so much a battle track as it is a loud, boastful party where each man seeks to out-South the other.

The only time "Boomiverse" falters is when Big Boi attempts to go all-pop with Caucasian love child Adam Levine doing his usual blue-eyed soulless thing.

Other than that, Boomiverse is a place of old-world charm and alarmingly funky hip-hop.

The sitcom days when Craig Ferguson 'Drew' upon his humor

Q. Was Craig Ferguson always a regular on "The Drew Carey Show"? — Pete Ralston, Columbus, Ohio

A. He joined the ABC sitcom (now seen in repeats on Laff) in its second season, in 1996 — as the fictionalized Drew's boss, Mr. Wick — and remained a regular cast member through the eighth, then made two guest appearances in the show's ninth and final year.

The two performers have maintained ties to each other since, a very notable example being the switch they made between their CBS shows on April Fools' Day in 2014. Ferguson filled in for Carey as host of that day's episode of "The Price Is Right," while Carey sat behind the desk that night on the then-Ferguson-hosted "Late Late Show."

Q. Who plays the magazine boss on "The Bold Type"? She looks familiar. — Casey Shaw, via e-mail

A. She should, since she's been a television presence for many years. Melora Hardin also has been seen recently in Amazon's acclaimed "Transparent," for which she earned an Emmy nomination, but her home-screen career sates back to the 1970s and such shows as "The Love Boat" and "Police Story."

Other major stops along the way for her have included CBS' short-lived series version of "Dirty Dancing" (as Baby), NBC's "The Office" (as company executive Jan Levinson), the USA espionage show "Cover Me" and the latter network's "Monk," in which she played the title character's late wife. Hardin also has been seen in a number of movies such as "27 Dresses," "Hannah Montana: The Movie" and "Self/less."

Q. Is "The Last Ship" going to be renewed? — Nancy DuPree, Port Orange, Fla.

A. It already has been, at least for this year. In fact, TNT launches Season 4 of the drama series with a two-hour premiere Aug. 20. The new episodes will prove there's no rest for the weary, since the virus that was fought by the crew of

the U.S.S. Nathan James now threatens the world's food supply — and forces Tom Chandler (played by Eric Dane) back into action.

"The Last Ship" also has been renewed for a fifth season. Normally, that would be expected to debut next summer, but a production hiatus delayed the start of filming of those episodes. Exactly when those will arrive on screens remains to be seen, then, but an announcement on that wouldn't be likely until next spring anyway.

Q. Is it true that "Criminal Minds: Beyond Borders" was canceled? — Marcia Bradley, Reading, Pa.

A. It is, meaning that the original CBS show now has outlasted two spinoffs, also including the Forest Whitaker-starring "Criminal Minds: Suspect Behavior." However, one of the "Beyond Borders" characters has survived: Daniel Henney will reprise his role from that series as Matt Simmons as a cast regular in Season 13 of "Criminal Minds," having already made several crossover appearances on the original drama.

Q. Are Dean Butterworth and the Scorekeepers, of "Hollywood Game Night," an actual band? — Gary Miller, via e-mail

A. The Scorekeepers is a house musicians on the NBC show, but Butterworth is a noted drummer who has been a member of the group Good Charlotte for more than a decade. He also performs with Sugar Ray, and he has worked with such other artists as Ben Harper and Morrissey.

The Scorekeepers aren't meant to be overly slick, since "Hollywood Game Night" intends to evoke the feeling of a house party, so it could be argued that Butterworth's other projects really are where his musicianship comes through.

Shantel VanSanten's aim remains true in 'Shooter' Season 2

If a series with the title "Shooter" ups the action stakes in its second season, that comes as no surprise to its female lead.

Shantel VanSanten was directly in the line of fire as military veteran and skilled sniper Bob Lee Swagger's (Ryan Phillippe) wife Julie as Season 1 of the USA Network drama series ended. The former "One Tree Hill" and "The Messengers" actress, who says she loves "action that engages you physically and mentally," came back "happy and willing" for even deeper involvement in the show's sophomore round that begins Tuesday, July 18.

While plot details have been scarce, the new "Shooter" story arc evidently brings danger right to the ranch of the Swaggers and their young daughter Mary (Lexy Kolker). "Our writers are really wonderful at constructing character arcs within the action," VanSanten notes, "the slow burn of getting to know Julie and Bob Lee and their relationship and, by the end of Season 1, being able to see where her heart and her strength really lie.

"That's in protecting her family and, obviously most importantly, her daughter. To see them as a family unit and a team is what I think is the core and the heartbeat of the show. That's what they fight for, what has kept Bob Lee and so many Marines I've spoken to alive, seeing your family and having that moment when your kid runs into your arms. Now, the fight gets brought to our front door, rather than being on a bigger scale." VanSanten hints that she "did a lot of gun training" to prep for the return.

With co-stars Omar Epps, Cynthia Addai-Robinson and Eddie McClintock also back, "Shooter" — inspired by the 2007 movie

starring Mark Wahlberg, an executive producer of the series, and Stephen Hunter's novel "Point of Impact" — has notable Season 2 cast additions. Desmond Harrington ("Dexter"), Beverly D'Angelo, Harry Hamlin ("Mad Men"), William Fichtner (recently of "Mom") and WWE's Randy Orton appear in the new stories.

"Shooter" faced several telecast delays last year due to real-world shootings. "I respected our studio's and our network's decision to postpone the show out of respect for the lives lost," VanSanten reflects. "It's hard, because some of our art is going to mimic life, and life is going to mimic art ... but there is a time and a place, and

a respectful way of doing things. We all had faith, and we knew the story we were telling was an important one."

Before she began "Shooter," VanSanten played police detective Patty Spivot on The CW's "The Flash." She says she remains very open to returning to that adventure if the producers can fit her in.

"I haven't had a conversation with them," she allows, "but what's cool is that with our shooting schedule now, I am free. They start in July and we finish in July, so if they wanted to bring me back, I'll shout from the rooftops that I would love nothing more than to go and reprise that role."

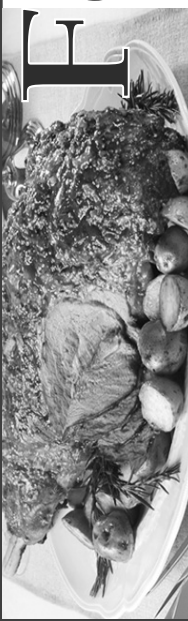

Mariah ran into Sharon at Crimson Lights and asked whether she thought it was really possible to get over the love of your life, leading Sharon to wonder whether

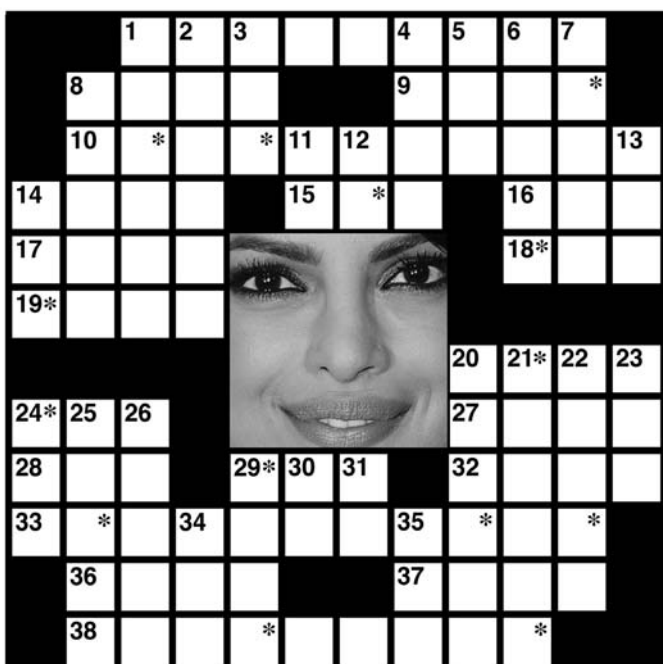
