



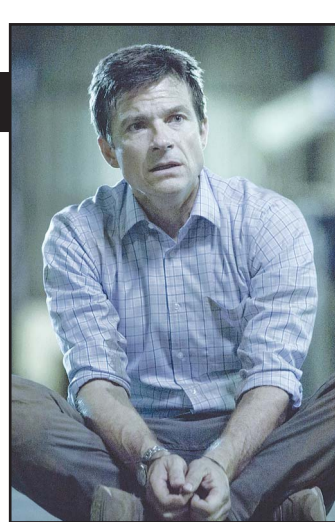

UAW, GM discuss impact of some models' sales slump

Cruze not cited, but report characterizes Lordstown plant as 'underused' facility

LORDSTOWN
The president of the United Auto Workers union, Dennis Williams, said in a Thursday news release that there have been discussions

with General Motors concerning the future production of plants that primarily produce "slower-selling" vehicle models.
According to a Reuters report, which cites anonymous sources "familiar with the

plans," GM is considering "killing" six slower-selling models, including the Buick LaCrosse, Cadillac CT6 and XTS, and Chevrolet Impala, Volt and Sonic.
The GM Lordstown Assembly Complex, as well as

the Hamtramck Assembly Complex in Michigan, were mentioned by name in the report and were characterized as "underused" facilities.

Though the Lordstown plant does not produce any of the six brands mentioned in the report – it produces only the Chevrolet Cruze – workers at the plant have felt

the impact of a recent shift in consumer preference toward larger vehicles such as SUVs and crossovers.

The Lordstown plant's third shift was cut last year, and Monday will be the first day back for Lordstown workers after a five-week shutdown caused in part by

New motions in Hamad case focus on possible death penalty

Several of the motions filed by attorneys for Nasser Hamad in his aggravated-murder case focus on reducing the chance that Hamad could get the death penalty if he's convicted of killing two people at his Howland home in February.

Hamad, 48, of state Route 46, is charged with aggravated murder in the shooting deaths of two people and attempted aggravated murder in the wounding of three others who police say went to his house Feb. 25.

Police say Hamad shot all five after a day of Facebook taunts among Hamad and some of the victims, which caused the five to drive to his house for a fistfight.

After a fistfight between Hamad and one of the five, Hamad went into his house, got a gun, returned to the front yard and fired at the five, police said.

A recent motion by his attorneys asks that Judge Ronald Rice of Trumbull County Common Pleas Court order prosecutors to turn over any evidence they possess that is favorable to Hamad's defense, especially that which "tends to mitigate the penalty or extenuate the circumstances of the crime."

The filing adds that an example is "any evidence that

Y-town Thermal customers will face surcharge

Company's problems prompt PUCO's order

YOUNGSTOWN

Youngstown Thermal customers will face surcharges due to the company's flagging finances.

The Public Utilities Commission of Ohio voted during a special meeting Friday evening to establish the emergency surcharge on rates.

The amount of the surcharge is not yet determined, but an order issued Friday states it must bring in sufficient revenue to allow the company to compensate its skilled workers. Youngstown Thermal recently has had problems making payroll on time.

"Youngstown Thermal is in imminent danger of insolvency and an emergency surcharge is necessary to maintain heating and cooling service to downtown Youngstown," the order states.

PUCO's staff will file a recommendation within seven days regarding the surcharge amount. The commission will then vote on the issue.

Friday's order also directs Youngstown Thermal to establish a segregated escrow

Fire department dedicates truck to the late John Fritz

AUSTINTOWN

A newly purchased fire engine heads toward Austintown as firefighters Nick Reed and Lt. Dave Schertzer drive the vehicle home. Set between them on the dashboard is the helmet belonging to the late John Fritz.

Fritz died at 48 on June 27, 2016, while on duty. About a year later, the fire department purchased a new en-

gine that bears Fritz's name and his retired unit number, 181, on its side.

Assistant Chief Bob Williams said the decision to put Fritz's name on the engine was a given.

"John was the kind of guy that if somebody needed help, he would be there," said Jill Ferrone, Fritz's sister.

She and her father, Richard Fritz, said John was constantly working on projects

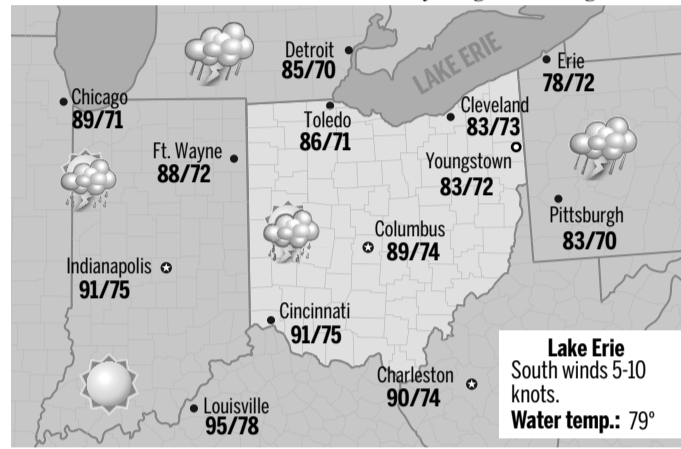

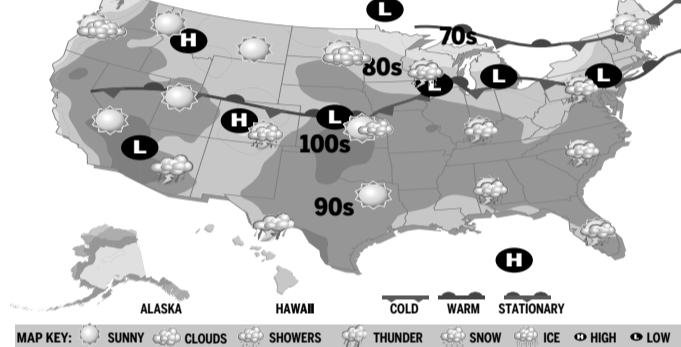

The departing spokesman said the president "could benefit from a clean slate" as he seeks to steady operations amid the Russia investigations and ahead of a health care showdown.

Easing the burden

YOUNGSTOWN

For the second year, the Youngstown City School District will buy school supplies for students.

"This is a way that we can ease that burden on our families. We want all of the students to be prepared for the start of the school year, and we want to help with that," said CEO Krish Mohip.

The 2017-18 school year also will be the second year that the district opted against school uniforms. Uniforms had been in place in YCSD for several years, but Mohip, after convening a panel of stakeholders before the start of the 2016-17 school year, decided to eliminate that requirement. A school dress code, however, remains in effect.

Park improvements

YOUNGSTOWN

Mill Creek MetroParks will begin the East Cohasset Improvement Project early next month with an expected completion date of late October. The project will close the East Cohasset Bike and Hike trail from the Ottawa Entrance to Old Furnace Road for the duration of the construction. Planned improvements include drainage maintenance and installation and trail surfacing upgrades.

Charged with OVI

YOUNGSTOWN

Police charged a Girard man who drove his car off the side of a West Side street Thursday with drunken driving after a blood-alcohol test showed he was just over three times the legal limit for impaired driving.

Reports said an officer found a car about 6:45 p.m. off the side of the street at Calvary Run and South Belle Vista Avenue driven by Ewen Berwick, 36, of West Liberty Street, who said he had just come from a West Side bar and had "three pints and three shots."

Berwick smelled of alcohol, was staggering in the street and had slurred speech, reports said. Reports said he failed a field-sobriety test and took a breath test, which showed a blood-alcohol content of .328. In Ohio, a person is considered driving drunk if they have a BAC of .08 or higher.

Berwick was issued his citations and released to his mother-in-law, reports said.

Lane restrictions

State Route 11 between the Interstate 80/Interstate 680 split and U.S. Route 224 in Austintown and Canfield townships will have various daily lane restrictions for resurfacing and pavement repairs until further notice, said the Ohio Department of Transportation.

This work is part of a \$3.8 million project to resurface Route 11 between Route 224 and the I-80/I-680 split. The project also includes bridge repairs. The entire project is scheduled to be completed by August 2018.

More road work

Beginning today, state Route 11 between King Graves Road and state Route 5 as well as state Route 534 between U.S. Route 422 and just north of state Route 88 will have lane restrictions until further notice, announced the Ohio Department of Transportation.

The work is part of a \$1.1 million project to make pavement repairs in Ashtabula, Mahoning and Trumbull counties scheduled to be completed by late August.

Beginning Monday, state Route 7 in Hartwood Township will be closed between state Routes 82 and 305 through Wednesday for a culvert replacement.

a decline in Cruze sales.

Cruze sales have dropped 30 percent since last year, though individual retail sales are up 3.3 percent, according to a recent report from GM.

Glenn Johnson, president of UAW Local 1112 at Lordstown, said he wasn't aware of any plans by GM to change the product at the Lordstown facility.

"It's GM's decision for where they put their product," Johnson said. "If we get a reallocation, we're just going to show what a great team we've

got here at Lordstown and that we've got the right people in place to make it work here."

Jim Cain, national spokesman for GM, said he couldn't confirm the discussion cited by Williams in the Reuters report, but he could confirm that consumers prefer larger vehicles – and that it will impact

GM's production priorities moving forward.

"We've got a strong economy right now and gas prices are low, so we're seeing growing interest in crossover models and the enduring popularity of trucks," Cain said. "Naturally we want to stay as closely in line with customer demand as possible."

might not have the resources to go to a zoo or aquarium is great. And it's necessary for people to realize how important conserving our environment is."

A focus of the presentation was on the penguin's endangered-species status.

The African penguin is native to South Africa. Its beach habitats are threatened by local vacationers, fishing and agricultural industries.

Buildings along the beaches and beachgoers have displaced the bird, leaving the animals unable to breed on swaths of beaches claimed by people.

Guano – excrement from the penguins – used to build the bird's nest is harvested and used as fertilizer. Overfishing has left the penguins with fewer options for food.

"They actually eat more than any other animal in the aquarium," Weber said.

Conservationists have designated parts of the South African coast as safe havens for the penguins,

but their population is still an estimated 50,000. In the early 1900s, there were an estimated 1.5 million birds.

The Wave Foundation is composed mostly of volunteer staff members who conduct outreach via presentations, camps and job-shadow programs.

"We have a lot of great people that do a lot for us," said Wave instructor Devin Magner.

Magner said preserving and educating the public about African penguins is a large part of the foundation's focus.

Hamad had been threatened previously by the victims in prior incidents or that police located evidence suggesting that people on the scene carried weapons or instruments that could be used or construed as weapons."

A separate filing asks for police reports prior to Feb. 25 that mention threats to Hamad by the victims. The filing says the reports "may suggest that a sentence of less than death is appropriate."

A reply by prosecutors says: "It is the State's position that any information deemed relevant by defense counsel can and should be

obtained through a public records request."

Hamad and his legal counsel have stated that Hamad acted in self-defense, though a legal expert interviewed by *The Vindicator* says Hamad appears to have had a duty to retreat despite the five coming onto his property.

Hamad was in court Friday for a pretrial hearing in the case. Judge Ronald Rice set another pretrial hearing for 1:30 p.m. Sept 19. Hamad's jury trial is set for 9 a.m. Oct 10.

Three of the newest motions also argue that Ohio's death penalty is unconstitutional and that it violates international law.

Another one argues that the Ohio law is unconstitu-

tional in that it places the burden of proof on Hamad to establish that he acted in self-defense, even though every person accused of an offense is presumed innocent until proved guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

Prosecutors say Hamad's attempt to use the Second Amendment to keep and bear arms is insufficient to overturn Ohio law regarding self-defense.

Hamad has also asked for the case to be moved to another county, saying that news accounts in the case has "left little room for fact finding at trial."

Judge Rice had not ruled on any of the new motions by the end of the day Friday.

benefiting others.

"He would probably rather not have his name on there," Richard Fritz said. He said his son wasn't much for receiving recognition, and public service was in John's nature. "He'd wanted to be a firefighter his whole life."

He had walked to the Cleveland Clinic in full firefighting gear to raise money for spina bifida research – twice. The spinal condition affected his oldest daughter, Riley.

"He was a fireman's fireman," Capt. Tim O'Hara said. "He took the job very seriously, to the point where it wasn't a job. It was a lifestyle."

Fritz taught firefighting classes with O'Hara at the Mahoning County Career and Technical Center as well.

The new fire engine made its initial public debut at the township's Fourth of July parade with Fritz's children riding inside. O'Hara said the crowd's reaction to the fire engine was different from those in past years.

Instead of solely clapping, people in the crowd were

pointing to the side of the truck, noting Fritz's name.

"If your eyes don't fill up with tears when you see it, you're not human," said township Trustee Jim Davis. "I knew John as his boss, but I know what he means to those guys at the fire station. That's what gets me, just knowing what he meant to the community."

Fritz was a black belt in karate, scuba diver and an adept tuba and sousaphone player, to the point that he couldn't fit all of his music awards on his band uniform.

Richard Fritz, Ferrone and O'Hara all agreed John was serious at work, but playful

by nature. When the lights are out in the kitchen and captain's room of the fire department, glow-in-the-dark smiling faces are on the walls. They were Fritz's doing.

The fire engine is still being outfitted, but Williams said it likely will be in service in August. The truck is equipped with a train horn, due to soundproof vehicle interiors.

account for depositing future customer payments. The order states the account is necessary because of the company's "poor record-keeping" in the past.

Youngstown Thermal is a utilities company that uses steam for heating and cooling. Carl Avers, chief executive officer of Youngstown Thermal, contacted PUCO, a state regulator, in June about a potential "energy crisis" in downtown Youngstown due to the company's inability to meet expenses in a timely manner.

PUCO has since asked the Ohio Attorney General's Office to step in and appoint a receiver to right Youngstown Thermal's finances. That matter is ongoing in the Mahoning County Court of Common Pleas.

PUCO has not taken that type of legal action with a utilities company since 1987.

"It is rare," said PUCO spokesman Matt Schilling.

Youngstown Thermal has about 40 Youngstown customers, including *The Vindicator*, the city of Youngstown and the Youngstown Business Incubator.

Barb Ewing, chief executive officer of the Youngstown Business Incubator, said the company anticipated surcharges due to Youngstown Thermal's financial problems.

She said there is "no chance" the YBI will seek another heating and cooling provider.

"It is simply too expensive for us to retrofit the building for a new system," Ewing said.

Avers said he is not concerned customers will leave Youngstown Ther-

mal due to the surcharges. Avers said customers will see lower prices in the future because of new fuel sources and technology.

Avers added that Youngstown Thermal is working with PUCO to "solve the short-term and long-term situation" and emphasized that services will not be interrupted. He also termed record-keeping issues as "minor."

The company has attributed its financial problems, in part, to the loss of its largest customer, Youngstown State University. The company also has pointed to the failure of several customers to pay their bills.

Youngstown Thermal contends the city of Youngstown owes \$141,570 due to years of underbilling, stemming from a broken meter. The city disputes that figure.

Friday's order states PUCO's staff will review disputed bills and make recommendations for each situation. If a customer does not agree with a recommendation, the customer will have the opportunity for a hearing before the commission.

Youngstown Thermal put its assets up for sale in June.

Ford says it will fight latest Takata recall

Ford is fighting the latest expansion of the Takata air-bag inflator recall.

Earlier this month, Takata filed documents with the U.S. government adding 2.7 million vehicles to the recall from Ford, Nissan and Mazda. All have inflators with a drying agent that previously were thought to be safe.

But the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration has said that Takata tests showed the inflator propellant can degrade and will pose a safety risk if the inflators aren't replaced.

Nissan agreed to recall about 515,000 Versa cars, but Ford and Mazda filed petitions to avoid a recall.

Takata inflators can explode with too much force and spew shrapnel into drivers and passengers. As many as 18 people have died and more than 180 injured due to the problem.

The inflators have caused the largest automotive recall in U.S. history with 42 million vehicles and up to 69 million inflators being called back for repairs.

Takata uses the chemical ammonium nitrate to inflate air bags. But it can deteriorate when exposed to

DIESEL RECALLS WIDEN

German automaker Audi says it will fit up to 850,000 diesel cars with new software to improve their emissions performance, following a similar move by rival Daimler as the auto industry tries to get ahead of public controversy over the technology.

Audi, the luxury brand of the Volkswagen Group, announced the voluntary retrofitting program Friday. The company said in a statement that it "aims to maintain the future viability of diesel engines" and believes the program "will counteract possible bans on vehicles with diesel engines."

The free program will apply to Europe and other markets outside the U.S. and Canada.

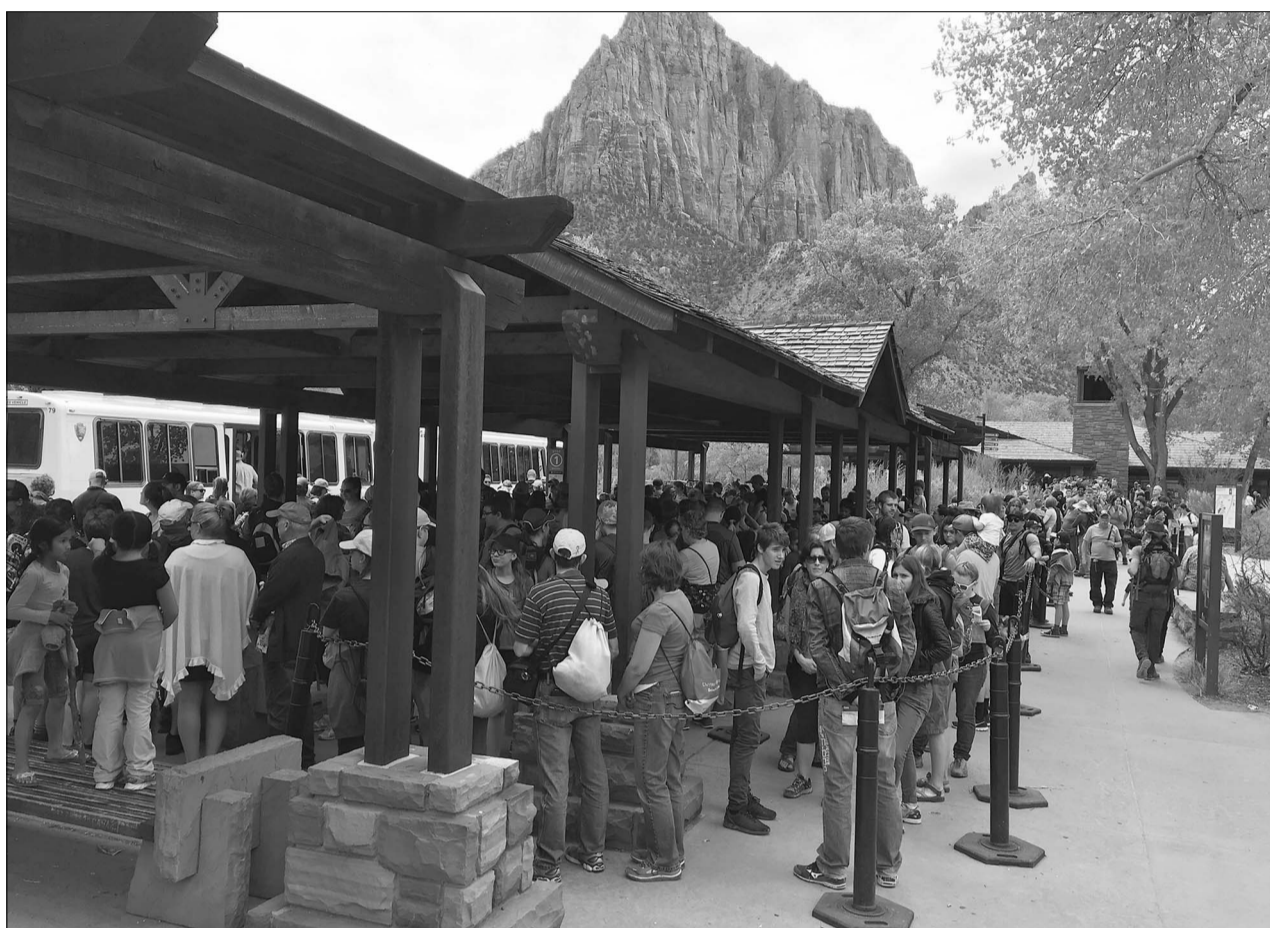
high airborne humidity and high temperatures. Previously the company believed that a drying agent called a desiccant stopped the

chemical from degrading. Ford, which has more than 2 million vehicles involved in the latest recall, says the propellant has not

deteriorated in any of its inflators taken from vehicles in the field.

The company says it will file a petition with NHTSA to further study its inflators. "At this point there is no data to suggest a recall is needed," the company said in a statement.

Takata also identified about 6,000 Mazda B-Series pickup trucks from 2007 through 2009 that also have the potentially faulty inflators. Mazda, which used to be owned by Ford, said its trucks are based on Ford's Ranger, so it decided to follow Ford in seeking a recall exemption.

Check in to get away

ZION PARK AIMS TO REQUIRE RESERVATIONS

SALT LAKE CITY
It would be a first for a U.S. national park: requiring reservations to get in. But it's an option that Zion National Park is considering to manage an overwhelming surge of visitors to its sweeping red-rock vistas and canyons in Utah.

Zion, which welcomed 4.3 million people last year, is weighing online reservations for those who want to explore its main canyon. National Park Service rangers struggle to cope with overcrowded tour buses and alleviate damage to Zion's natural wonders, including soil erosion and human waste near trails.

People without reservations could pay an entrance fee and drive through the park, but they couldn't stop to hike or picnic.

"We have to do something," said

park spokesman John Marciano. With limited budgets, Zion's Park Service rangers routinely see long lines and plants trampled by visitors who also have cut some 30 miles of their own trails.

Zion isn't the only U.S. national park with swelling numbers of tourists, and at least two national parks, in California and Hawaii, are testing more limited reservation systems for parking. Overall, more than 330 million people visited U.S. national parks in 2016, a record. Visits were bolstered by the improving economy, cheap gas and marketing campaigns for the National Park Service's 2016 centennial.

Zion is the fifth-most-visited park in the national park system. It's particularly susceptible to overcrowding because many of its iconic cliffs and trails are located in the narrow, 6-mile-long Zion Canyon.

The park already urges visitors to take a shuttle between March and November.

After a series of public meetings, Zion rangers are proposing an online reservation system, similar to the way campsites are reserved now. While certain hikes and activities require permits or reservations, the new system would apply to the entire main corridor of the park.

The number of reservations would be based on capacity, would vary by season and could fall somewhere between a manageable 10,000 people a day and an overpowering 30,000 people a day, Marciano said.

One option would require a single reservation to enter and explore the park. A second would allow tourists to enter the park at a specific time and visit specific trails such as Angel's Landing.

Manafort, Trump Jr. in talks with Senate panel

President Donald Trump's eldest son and his former campaign chairman have agreed to discuss being privately interviewed by a Senate committee investigating Russia's meddling in the 2016 election, the panel confirmed Friday.

The top Republican and Democrat on the Senate Judiciary committee said Donald Trump Jr. and Paul Manafort agreed to negotiate with the committee about being interviewed by members and staff as well as to discuss the possibility of turning over documents.

The joint statement from Sens. Chuck Grassley, R-Iowa, and Dianne Feinstein, D-Calif., said the committee will not subpoena the two men to force them to testify publicly next week, though it could do so in the future.

Both men face questions about attending a Trump Tower meeting with a Russian lawyer in June 2016 that was described to Trump Jr.

in emails as part of a Russian government effort to help his father's campaign.

Trump's son-in-law, Jared Kushner, is scheduled to speak behind closed doors with the Senate intelligence committee Monday and with the House intelligence committee Tuesday.

In other Russia probe news, *The Washington Post* reports the Russian ambassador to the U.S. has said he discussed election-related issues with Sen. Jeff Sessions when the two men met during the 2016 presidential race. *The Post* is citing anonymous U.S. officials who described U.S. intelligence intercepts of Ambassador Sergey Kislyak's descriptions of his meetings with Sessions.

Minneapolis police chief resigns in wake of shooting

Minneapolis police Chief Janeé Harteau resigned Friday amid calls for new leadership in the department following last week's shooting death of an unarmed Australian woman by a police officer.

In a statement released Friday, Harteau said: "I've decided I am willing to step aside to let a fresh set of leadership eyes see what more can be done for the MPD to be the very best it can be."

Minneapolis Mayor Betsy Hodges said she asked for the chief's resignation.

"I've lost confidence in the Chief's ability to lead us further ... it is clear that she has lost the confidence of the people of Minneapolis as well," Hodges said. "For us to continue to transform policing - and community trust in policing - we need new leadership at MPD." Harteau said she was

proud of the work she accomplished, but the shooting of 40-year-old Justine Damond by one of her officers, and other incidents, "have caused me to engage in deep reflection."

She added, "Despite the MPD's many accomplishments under my leadership over these years and my love for the city, I have to put the communities we serve first."

Harteau was out of the city on personal time for nearly a week following Saturday's shooting of Damond, a 40-year-old life coach and bride-to-be who was killed by an officer responding to her 911 call of a possible rape.

The state is investigating the shooting. In Harteau's first remarks on the case Thursday - when she returned to work - she was sharply critical of Officer Mohamed Noor while defending his training.

ADD OUR VOICE TO THE FLOOD of hope-filled and heart-felt expressions of support that continues to rush westward to Arizona's senior U.S. Sen. John McCain, diagnosed this week with glioblastoma, an aggressive brain tumor.

U.S. Sen. Sherrod Brown, a progressive Democrat from Cleveland, wrote, "John has more fight in him than anyone I know, and I look forward to having him back in the Senate soon. Connie [his wife] and I are thinking of John and his family as we wish him a full recovery."

Likewise, U.S. Sen. Rob Portman, a conservative Republican from the Cincinnati area, also publicly wished McCain well: "Jane & I are sending our love and prayers to @SenJohnMcCain & Cindy [McCain's wife] tonight. We know he will prevail in this fight."

The nearly identical respect and admiration shown by Brown and Portman toward McCain, the Grand Old Party's 2008 presidential nominee, serve as an apt microcosm of the broad-based nationwide outpouring of respect and sincere good wishes for the senator and his family at this most difficult time.

The otherwise hearty 80-year-old was hospitalized July 14 for treatment of a blood clot. During that treatment, doctors detected the brain cancer and performed emergency surgery to successfully remove it. But McCain is far from out of the woods.

That ruthless and unforgiving brain cancer oftentimes returns, as it did in 2009 with U.S. Sen. Ted Kennedy and in 2015 with Beau Biden, son of former Vice President Joe Biden, before ultimately taking their lives.

Yet in the true indomitable McCain spirit, the senator will have none of any doomsday talk. In a Twitter posting on Thursday, in fact, he warned his fellow members of the upper chamber of Congress: "I greatly appreciate the outpouring of support – unfortunately for my sparring partners in Congress, I'll be back soon, so stand-by!"

That in-your-face retort typifies McCain's firebrand demeanor of fighting tooth and nail for something he believes in. It complements his other productive qualities of maturity, cooperation and resilience.

Sadly, those critical prerequisites for successful statesmanship have been sorely lacking in recent years from Congress and the entire Washington power structure. The sooner McCain recovers sufficiently to return to Capitol Hill, the sooner his status as a role model for true bipartisanship and patriotism can resume.

Take his maturity. Unlike many of his colleagues on both sides of the political aisle, McCain rarely stoops to ad hominem attacks and juvenile name-calling. When he disagrees – and he disagrees often – with Democrats and those of his own party, he generally does so with logic, reason and civilized discourse. His numerous biting criticisms of President Donald J. Trump's behavior and style serve as foremost cases in point.

That quality feeds directly into his spirit of compromise and bipartisanship. Though he will battle vociferously for causes he believes in, he also will – when appropriate for progress – sit down with opponents and forge plans based on give and take.

A RESILIENT AMERICAN HERO

Finally, take McCain's resilience. Perhaps nothing better illustrates that trait than his grueling military service. As many recall, the former U.S. Navy aviator was shot down, seriously injured, and captured as a prisoner of war by the North Vietnamese in 1967. For the next seven years, McCain was subjected to unrelenting torture yet refused an offer to be freed early out of fairness to his other captured comrades.

That same resilience and sense of fairness has served him and the nation well in his 34 years in the U.S. Congress.

Though we have not always agreed with the policy directions that McCain has driven, we have long respected his stature as a hero and a statesman. Even in our October 2008 endorsement of his Democrat opponent Barack Obama for president, *The Vindicator* offered this noteworthy concession: "John McCain has performed with distinction in military service and in Congress."

Few could disagree that Congress today desperately needs that distinctive brand of bipartisanship and maturity to move forward. As such, we wish McCain Godspeed and look for his signature fighting spirit to once again marshal the requisite will and strength to conquer this latest adversity to cross his path.

Jane Austen, the beloved Regency novelist, died 200 years ago on July 18. Given the state of the contemporary publishing industry in this era of celebrity, I can only imagine what it would be like if Austen were writing today:

Best-selling author Jane Austen is reported to be engaged in a bidding war for a three-book contract. Record sums are expected.

"Two hundred years is a long time to be in print," commented one industry expert. "Editors want assurance of that kind of longevity when they sign book contracts these days."

Austen, who has penned six novels in the so-called chick-lit genre, is acclaimed for creating compelling romantic plots without resorting to sexually explicit material. Her works have been positively cited by such groups as the Mothers Affirming Modesty Association (MAMA).

The three books under negotiation are said to depart from Austen's trademark style. According to Cassie Austen, spokeswoman for her sister, "Jane is tired of being the spinster aunt of romantic fiction."

Austen herself, in a recent appearance on "The View," told Whoopi Goldberg: "It may surprise you to know that I've had sex, I like sex, and I think sex is fun."

Goldberg responded enthusiastically, but Joy Behar expressed the hope that Austen would remain true to her previous, tasteful plots. "It's nice to leave something to the imagination," said Behar, "though I know I'm showing my age."

Cassie Austen explained: "I trust that my sister will find a narrative framework that will allow her to address material heretofore unexplored."

NEW GROUND

The three books under discussion include two novels that would capitalize on the Austen brand while breaking new ground. Among titles rumored to be under consideration are: "Prose and Prostitution" – about two sisters, one getting a Ph.D. in literature and the other paying the bills by working as a lady of the night; and "Domination" – a sequel to "Persuasion" – that follows heroine Anne Elliot as she attains fulfillment through kinky sex with her husband, Capt. Frederick Wentworth.

Cassie Austen has hinted that a lingerie line, designed by Jane herself ("elegantly steamy," according to industry insiders) will be in the stores in advance of publication.

The third and most anticipated book will be a memoir, tentatively titled: "Tempest in a Teapot: Jane Austen Tells All."

The book will feature surprising events in Austen's seemingly uneventful life. Some of the highlights to be addressed include:

The secrets of multitasking: How to write six literary masterpieces while crocheting, serving tea and engaging in inane conversation.

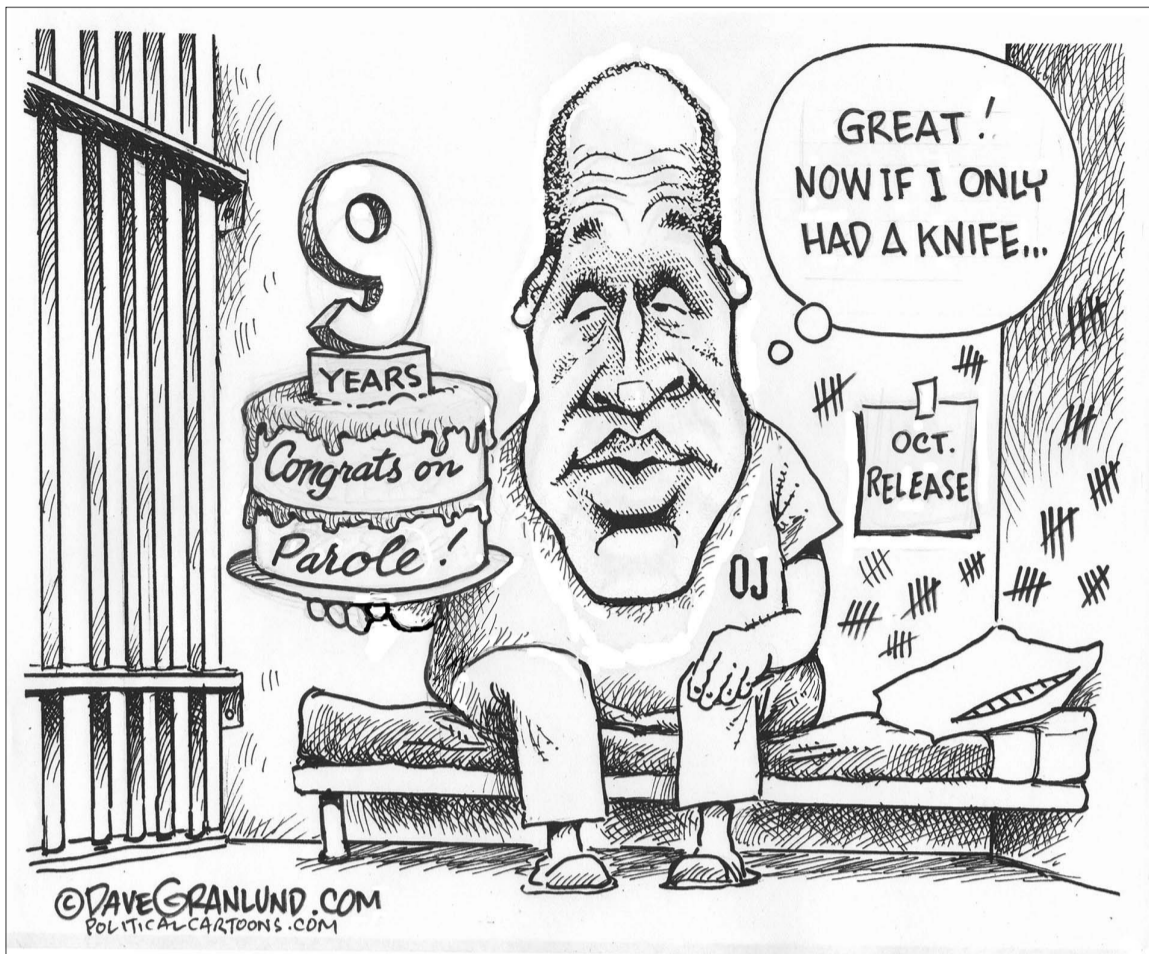
A who's who for the novels: Discover the real nincompoop behind Mr. Collins; the annoying cad who inspired Frank Churchill; the bitch who was the model for Mary Crawford.

The conundrum of the portrait: Was malice or lack of talent behind Cassandra's portrayal of her sister – because we all know that Jane Austen looks exactly like Keira Knightley?

Bloopers: The time a gentleman accidentally-on-purpose snatched the lace from the front of Jane's gown, requiring that her brother quickly give her a hanky to cover up.

And one final, great reveal: What really happened during that undocumented stretch in Bath? Hint from Cassie Austen: "Thank God for high-waisted Empire gowns and our relatives in France."

Action necessary to fix Medicaid so spending growth is restrained

Over the past few weeks, much of the country seems finally to have woken up to the reality that we are on a highly unsustainable fiscal path. One of the key drivers of that unsustainability, at both the federal and state levels, is Medicaid.

Much has been written on this subject in response to the health-care bill winding its way through the Senate, and at this point it can be easy to conflate opinion with reality. Here are three of the most important facts about Medicaid.

First and foremost, the program is incredibly important. Just over 70 million Americans get their health insurance through Medicaid. Many of those people are on the extreme lower end of the income distribution, and the program's existence has saved countless lives since its inception in the mid-1960s.

Second, insuring that many people isn't cheap. The program will cost roughly \$600 billion this year, around \$8,500 per Medicaid recipient.

Third, and of most interest lately, the program's costs are growing much faster than the revenue used to pay for them.

MEDICAID COSTS

This is projected to continue. According to the last actuarial report from the Obama administration, Medicaid costs will grow an average of more than 6 percent per year over the next decade. Meanwhile, nominal personal income, the collective pool of income out of which all of us pay our taxes, will grow just over 4 percent per year.

This means that every year, there will be a roughly 2 percentage-point growth mismatch in the amount of money we need to spend on Medicaid and the amount of money we will collect to pay for it. This funding gap is not new; it has persisted ever since the program was first instituted, and has resulted in Medicaid taking up a larger and larger portion of overall government spending.

At the federal level, this is relatively simple to deal with. We issue more Treasury bonds and run up the national debt to pay for the mismatch. At the state level, things get a bit more complicated. States must have balanced budgets, and as such are a zero-sum game. Every additional dollar they have to

spend on Medicaid is a dollar that cannot be spent on other things like education, public safety or infrastructure.

Thus, as Medicaid has grown from about 9 percent of state budgets in the mid-1980s to almost 20 percent today, other spending programs have shrunk in proportion. The next time you get upset because you see funding for things like public universities or K-12 schools decline as a share of the budget, you'll know why. In response, one of the most simplistic and commonly proposed solutions to this problem is to raise taxes.

Raising taxes is the right solution when a level shift in funding is required, for example when adding a new program to the budget. But Pennsylvania and other states don't have a level problem; they have a growth problem.

TAX BURDEN

Raising taxes in this instance would only give us more rope to hang ourselves with. Because spending would still accelerate faster than revenue, in short order we would be right back to where we started, only with a greater tax burden on the economy.

The Medicaid debate shines a harsh spotlight on Pennsylvania. For one thing, we spend more on Medicaid than almost any other state as a percentage of our budget – Medicaid made up 29 percent of the commonwealth's general fund budget last year compared to 12 percent in New Jersey. For another, Pennsylvania's senior senator, Pat Toomey, is one of the lawmakers pushing hardest for reform.

One of the biggest points of contention in the Senate health-care bill is Toomey's proposal to cap Medicaid growth at the rate of inflation. In a strict sense this would not be a cut to Medicaid, in that Medicaid spending is not declining from one year to the next. Rather, the measure would force the program, at the federal level, to grow much more slowly than it otherwise would.

This provision of the bill holds monumental implications for Medicaid as well as the federal and state budgets. The only problem is that reasonable people can disagree vehemently about whether those implications are good or bad.

At the heart of the matter is whether or not you can slow the pace of health-care cost growth by turning down the amount of

government money you pour into health care. Medicaid has continuously grown faster than the economy, not because of increases in the number of people enrolled, but because of increases in the cost per enrollee.

Sound theory suggests that this is at least in part because the government is required by law to pay into the system as much as is necessary to cover a recipient's health-care costs, and this gives little incentive for the system to keep costs low.

CONSERVATIVE ECONOMISTS

This is a core tenet of many conservative economists' work, but it is a concept also recognized by many left of center as well. In theory, then, capping the pace at which Medicaid spending can increase from one year to the next should eventually reduce the rate at which underlying health-care costs grow, which again is a fiscal necessity for both the federal and state governments.

The problem is what happens if this approach does not work, or does not work quickly. The federal government would be better off fiscally and protected from risk because of the cap. State governments are the ones essentially operating without a net under this scenario.

If underlying costs don't fall in line with the capped growth in federal spending, states will have to make up the difference. Thus so much of the consequences of this proposed policy ultimately depend on how states handle the reforms. Their reaction would be limited to two options: Limit the number of Medicaid enrollees, or find ways to limit growth in cost per enrollee. Neither would be an easy lift.

The only thing that is clear in this debate is that we are beyond the point of questioning whether or not action is necessary. The only question now is what action to take.

Continuation of the status quo is not an option.

In isolation, capping federal Medicaid growth is obviously risky. As an economist, I can come up with well-reasoned arguments both for and against it. In the context of the unsustainability of overall U.S. fiscal policy today, however, it might be worth the risk.

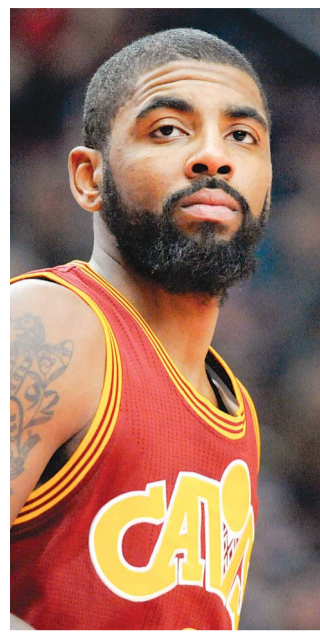

Sources: Irving asks to be traded

Point guard was No. 1 pick in 2011

CLEVELAND

Kyrie Irving wants the stage for himself. Cleveland's All-Star point guard has asked the Cavaliers to trade him, two people familiar with the situation told the Associated Press on Friday. Irving made the request last week to owner Dan Gilbert, said the people who spoke on condition of anonymity because the team is not commenting on the star's demands.



The Cavs are promoting assistant GM Koby Altman to be full-time GM, a person familiar with the decision said Friday.

Irving's appeal was first reported by ESPN. A four-time All-Star, Irving has spent six seasons with the Cavs, who selected him with the No. 1 overall pick in 2011. The 25-year-old

has overcome injury issues and blossomed into one of the league's elite point guards and biggest stars.

And now that he's finally established himself playing alongside LeBron James, Irving wants out.

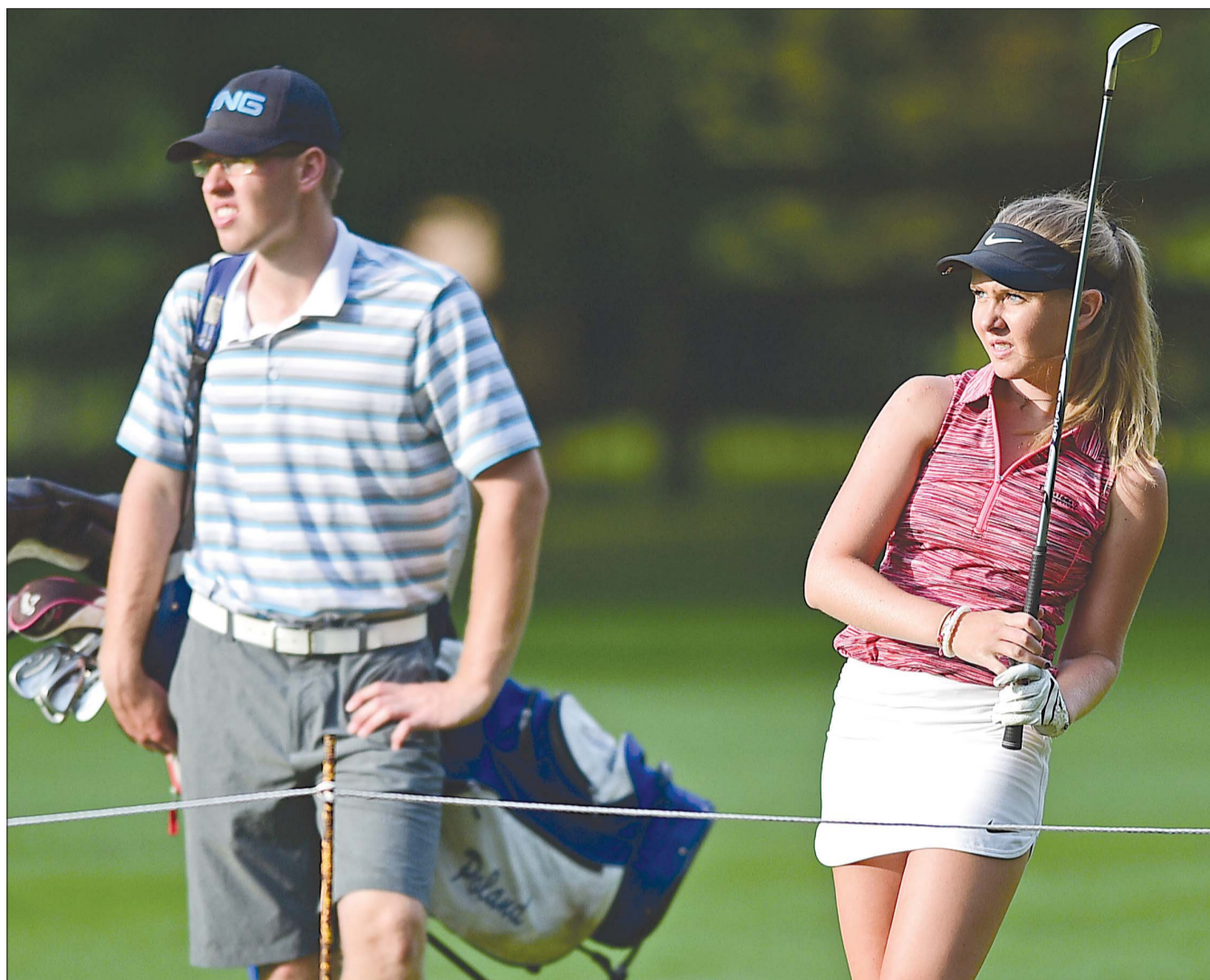
He's under contract for two more seasons with Cleveland (he has a player option in 2020), but the Cavs could be inclined to move Irving now and begin another rebuild around James, who can opt out of his contract next summer and leave Ohio for the second time.

The bombshell about Irving adds to what has been a tumultuous offseason for the Cavs following their loss in five games to Golden State in the NBA Finals. General manager David Griffin parted ways with the club after failing to work out a new contract with Gilbert and while other teams have been active in signing free agents the Cavs have been limited in their ability to revamp their roster because of salary-cap issues.

Also, the Cavs courted former NBA star Chauncey

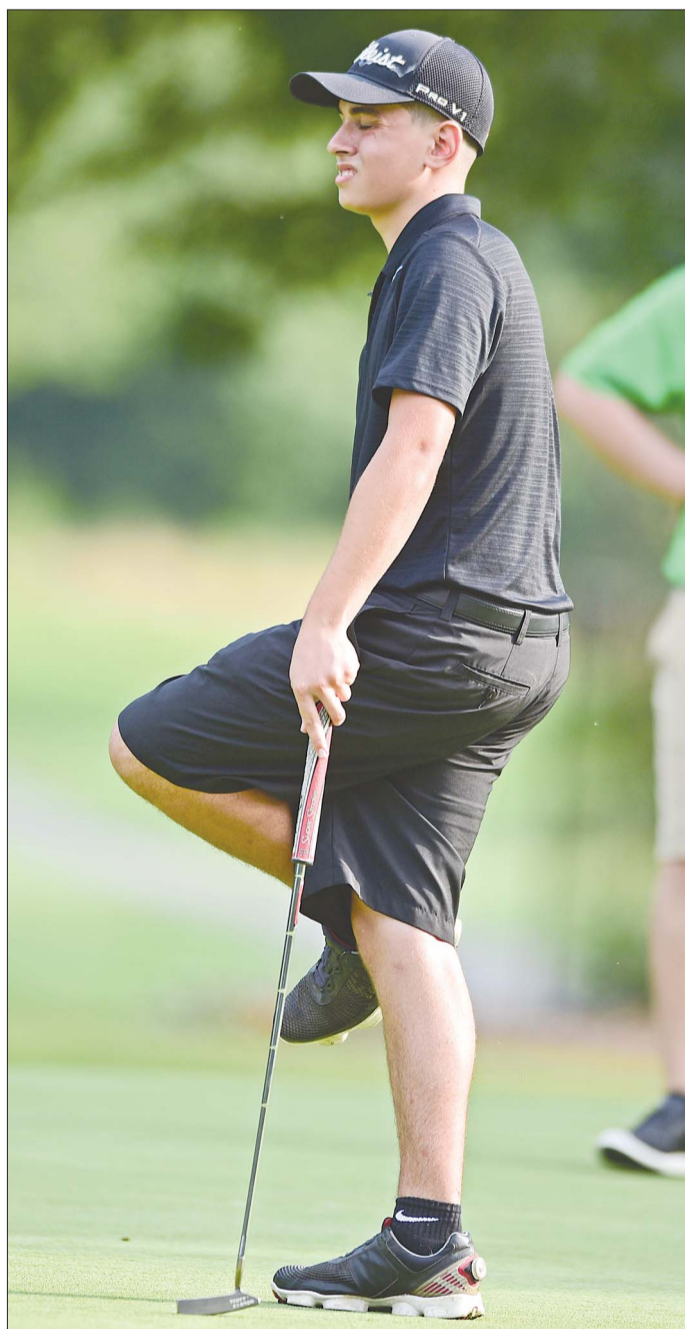

Jordan Spieth expected a rough time at the British Open before he even got to the golf course.

He spent Friday morning at his rented house in front of the television, watching players battle a relentless wind at Royal Birkdale, all the while checking a forecast that was even worse for when he played in the afternoon.

"It wasn't a great feeling knowing we were coming into something harder than what we were watching," he said.

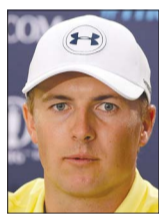
Spieth did more than just survive.

With a short game as sharp as it has been all year, and a 3-wood that turned out a lot better than it looked and led to an eagle, Spieth seized control with a 1-under 69 that gave him a two-shot lead over Matt Kuchar going into the weekend.

Spieth turned a bogey or worse into an unlikely par by chipping in from just short of the 10th green. And he learned enough from watching TV to know that going a little long on the par-5 15th would give him a better birdie chance than playing short. So he switched from a 3-iron to a 3-wood, hit it a little off the neck and watched it run hot and fast some 100 yards along the wet turf to about 18 feet away.

"I mishit the shot, which is probably why it looked so gross," Spieth said. "I hit it low off the heel, which is easy to do when you're trying to carve a cut. And it just ... one hop, scooted around the group of bunkers there, and then it was obviously fortunate to get all the way to the green."

The flight of that 3-wood looked as ugly as the

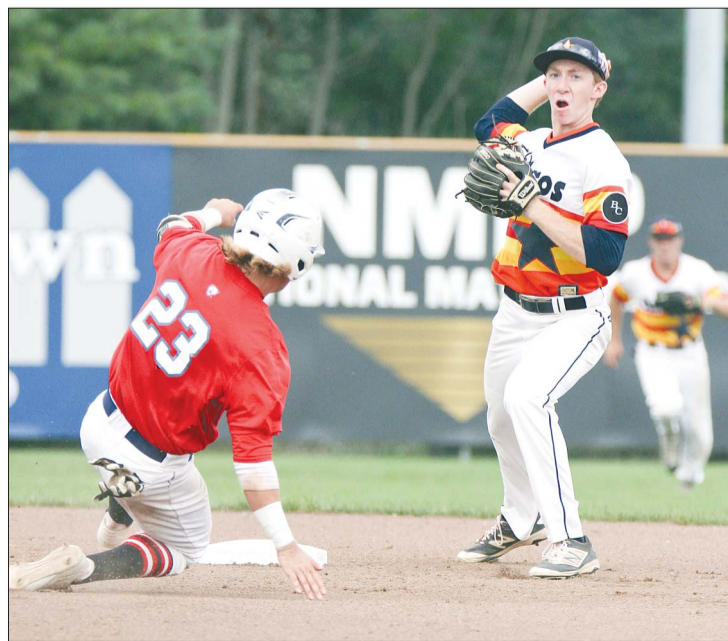

Billups but couldn't get him to join their front office.

Irving's request to be dealt perhaps sheds some light on the Cavs' recent pursuit of former league MVP Derrick Rose. The team has talked to Rose about a one-year contract in recent days, a source familiar with the negotiations told the AP on Thursday.

Rose was thought to be a potential backup, but now it appears he could be needed to start if the Cavs and Irving are indeed breaking up.

There is certain to be major interest in Irving, who averaged a career-high 25.2 points and 5.8 assists in 72 games last season. Irving averaged 25.9 points in his third straight Finals, but he and James couldn't do enough to match the Warriors, who took back their crown after adding Kevin Durant last summer.

A potential trade partner for the Cavs could be the New York Knicks, who have been trying to unload Carmelo Anthony, a close friend of James. Irving is from New Jersey and would welcome a chance to go back to his home area. However, the Knicks may not have enough assets to intrigue the Cavs and there is a sizeable imbalance in contracts, so the Cavs would have to include other players in any potential deal.

It's strange that Irving would choose now to ask for a trade.

After all, he has finally developed into a bona fide superstar following three tough seasons following James' departure to Miami in 2010. Irving had no help during those years and the Cavs were in a state of disarray before James came back in 2014.

In his second year alongside James, Irving made the biggest shot in franchise history, draining a 3-pointer in the closing moments of Game 7 to give the Cavs their first title — and the first for any Cleveland pro team since 1964.

By all accounts, Irving and James got along but there were times when they didn't quite see eye to eye.

James was demanding of his younger teammates but he was always adamant that Irving would grow into a superior player. Following Cleveland's Game 5 loss in the Finals, Irving credited James for leading the way. "He's freaking awesome," Irving said. "As a student of the game, it would be a disservice to myself if I didn't try to learn as much as possible while I'm playing with this guy. Every single day demanding more out of himself, demanding more out of us, the true testament of a consummate professional. And understanding how things work, not only just in the game but off the court, things that matter, just taking care of your body, understanding the magnitude of what the goal is at hand and what steps it takes in order to achieve that goal."

Moments earlier, James had walked off the court at Oracle Arena where Irving was waiting.

They made their signature handshake and James told Irving, "We'll be back." Now, they may be headed in opposite directions.

CAVS TO PROMOTE ALTMAN TO GM

A person familiar with the decision says the Cavaliers are promoting assistant general manager Koby Altman to be their full-time GM. Altman has been serving as the club's interim GM for the past few weeks. His deal is being finalized and will be announced in the next few days, said the person who spoke Friday to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity because of the sensitive nature of the talks.

Altman has been with the Cavs since 2012 and had worked as David Griffin's assistant since after the 2016 title season. Griffin left the club last month after he couldn't work out a contract extension with owner Dan Gilbert.

The 34-year-old Altman will be one of the league's youngest executives.

Matt Luke tries to pull together shattered Ole Miss program

The task of pulling together Mississippi's shattered football program is now in the hands of interim coach Matt Luke.

The 40-year-old was promoted from co-offensive coordinator on Thursday night in the stunning aftermath of coach Hugh Freeze's resignation for a "pattern of personal misconduct" that started with the school's investigation into a call to an escort service.

It's just the latest issue facing the embattled Rebels.

While Luke has been an assistant at Ole Miss during Freeze's entire five-plus year tenure, his name has not been linked to the ongoing NCAA investigation of the program. Luke also has deep family ties to the university and north Mississippi, playing offensive line for the Rebels from 1995-98.

Now he has a 12-game audition for the full-time job.

It's not an ideal situation, but it's not completely bleak either.

"Matt is a great coach," Bjork said when announcing Thursday the school was turning the program over to Luke. "He's a leader. He's a rock. He's an Ole Miss Rebel. And I'm confident — and especially even more confident after watching him address the team — that he will lead this team and program through this difficult time."

Bjork also noted that Wesley McGriff, the team's defensive coordinator, has been promoted to associate head coach. Luke was not immediately available for interviews in the aftermath of Freeze's resignation.

Luke is now in charge of a program that still has a talented roster — especially on offense — but is in the midst of long-running NCAA in-

vestigation that's already caused the school to impose a one-year bowl ban for the upcoming season.

The offense features several promising young players, including sophomores like quarterback Shea Patterson, left tackle Greg Little and receivers A.J. Brown and D.K. Metcalf.

Luke needs to hold on to them to have success. But it is unclear if any players on the current roster will transfer in the wake of Freeze bombshell.

Bjork said "it's hard to say" if there will be any roster changes. He said players are currently in summer workouts and several are in summer school. They'll also have a few days off before preseason camp on Aug. 2.

"We will give them space. We will listen," Bjork said. "And whatever they decide to do, we will support them."

The Ole Miss program was under a lot of stress even before Freeze's resignation. The Rebels are in the middle of an NCAA rules infractions case that includes 21 charges of academic, booster, and recruiting misconduct. Fifteen of those allegations are currently classified as Level I, which the NCAA deems most serious.

The school has already self-imposed several sanctions, including the postseason ban, scholarship restrictions and recruiting restrictions. More penalties could be coming after an NCAA decision in the case, which is expected later this year.

It remains to be seen if

Another go-round for 'Last Chance U'

NEW YORK

The East Mississippi Community College Lions are back as the documentary series "Last Chance U" returns for a second season.

All eight episodes of season two are available on Netflix.

The first season of the documentary by director Greg Whiteley chronicled the ups and downs of the junior college football team's 2015 season and turned out to be a hit that reached well beyond hard-core sports fans and drew people to Scooba, Miss.

"When we were film-

ing season two, every week there was somebody showing up, and frequently they were from overseas," Whiteley said in a phone interview with the AP on Thursday. "I remember there was this one couple from Scotland. They were on their honeymoon. There was another couple that came from Australia. These are people, they have Netflix accounts overseas, they watched the series and loved it. Didn't know anything about American foot-

ball. Didn't care anything about American football, but just wanted to come to Scooba, Miss., and meet some of these people they fell in love with."

Junior college football teams are typically stocked with players talented enough to be playing in Division I, but because of issues away from the field — sometimes academics, sometimes behavior problems or legal issues — they end up in small towns hoping to redeem themselves. Rosters turnover drastically from year to year so there are plenty of new faces at "Last Chance U" in season two.

Two of the biggest stars

from the series are back.

Brittany Wagner returns as the pencil-pushing, strong-willed academic adviser who often stole the show, though 2016 turns out to be her last season with EMCC. Wagner left the school earlier this year to take a marketing job in Birmingham, Ala., and then started her own academic consulting firm called 10 Thousand Pencils.

Blustery coach Buddy Stephens is back and hoping for some redemption of his own, Whiteley said.

"He really felt as though, 'I didn't like what I saw in season one and I didn't like what I saw in me. I need to make some changes,'" Whiteley

said about Stephens' receptiveness to another season of being followed by cameras.

Whiteley and his crew demand lots of unfettered access and time. He said East Mississippi was once again happy to accommodate.

Whiteley said he did not go into the project thinking it would produce more than one season, but the stories were simply too rich to let go.

"The season ended with a fight, and so we knew they were going to have to begin the next season with one arm tied behind their back in the first game. We thought that would be interesting," Whiteley said.

Both sides of camera

NEW YORK

In his new drama series "Ozark," Jason Bateman doesn't aim to make waves as Chicago financial adviser Marty Byrde — more like ripples that leave no one around him untouched or unexposed.

When not advising clients on their 401(k) plans, Marty launders cash by the millions. But now he's jammed up with the South American drug cartel he cleans that money for. So he and his family bolt for the Missouri Ozarks, a safer base of operations where he hopes to make things right before the Byrdes end up dead.

The intoxicating saga that powers the 10 episodes of "Ozark" (just released on Netflix) is full of unexpected twists and is fortified by a splendid cast including Laura Linney as Marty's accomplice-wife and the mother of their two kids.

The drama churns around Marty, yet, for Bateman, this starring role was just his means to a more compelling end: the role of director.

At 48, Bateman began his acting career in childhood on "Little House on the Prairie" and "Silver Spoons," and is perhaps best known as a member of the flakey Bluth family on the cult comedy "Arrested Development." (Next month, he reunites with his fellow Bluth loonies to shoot a new cycle

of the series for Netflix.)

But after decades on camera, Bateman found an even greater passion. He directed (not just acted in) a pair of features: "Bad Words" (2013) and "The Family Fang" (2015). He wanted more of that.

That's where "Ozark" came in. He signed on as its executive producer with plans to direct all 10 episodes. (This proved logistically impossible; he directed the four that bookend the season, passing the reins to others for the middle six.) His acting job was secondary. The chance to direct "was the draw," he says. "That's what got me vibrating."

A yearning to direct? What actor doesn't hear that siren call?

But what makes Bateman's case a bit different is his attitude toward acting, and how, in "Ozark," that less-is-more policy informs his performance.

Though slammed with one fearsome challenge after another, Marty responds in mostly microscopic ways. The audience can tell things eat at him, but it's mostly buried deep beneath the surface. Marty seems so disconnected from his feelings, the viewer is obliged to do the connecting for him, to fill in the blanks Bateman sketches out. The viewer is summoned to help Marty feel.

This is Bateman's kind of role. "The characters that I'm always

drawn to play is 'us,'" he says — "as a proxy who shapes the experience for the audience."

Even in his signature role on "Arrested Development," his character, Michael Bluth, serves as the audience's surrogate — the sanest member of this clan who shares and shapes viewers' wonderment at the lunacy whirling around him.

"Acting changed for me a while ago when I started to become disenchanted with pretending to be other people," Bateman says. "I'm not interested in tricking you into thinking I'm somebody else. My challenge with acting has now changed into a different goal: to give me another hand on the wheel, along with directing, to steer the audience through the story."

It seems like heresy: The notion that an actor isn't always playing let's pretend, and wouldn't want to claim the spotlight at every opportunity.

"I'm trying to not do ANY acting," Bateman insists. "I'm trying to be not distracting at all. I don't want to rock the boat. I don't want to do anything where the audience goes, 'Oh! Look at that performance!' I'm just trying to service the story. I'm trying to be as natural" — a long, contemplative pause — "and invisible as possible."

Or, put another way: "This ISN'T Daniel Day-Lewis work," he says with a smile.

◆ **Album:** "Hopeless Fountain Kingdom"

How the darkly intrepid electronic music chanteuse Ashley Nicolette Frangipane — the tangy toast of Washington, N.J. — got to be the nu-synth-soul diva Halsey is a matter of patience on her part, and the broadening of expectations from her longtime fan base and radio programmers. — and a nod to softly strung, overly sensitive singer-songwriter stuff ("Sorry").

FOSTER THE PEOPLE

◆ **Album:** "Sacred Hearts Club"

◆ **Grade:** A-

It hasn't always been easy to be Foster the People. Making sophisticated pop with thoughtful lyrics in danceable, candy-coated hooks is like being a character actor trapped in a leading man's body. If that's the case, then Foster the People resemble Brad Pitt on their third studio album.

"Sacred Hearts Club" gets the delicate mix right, getting progressively more complex as you go through the album, delivering pure shimmering pop like "Pay the Man" and "Sit Next to Me" at the beginning, and ending with a glimpse of the LA-based band's ambition in such complex, thrilling songs as "Loyal Like Sid & Nancy" and "Harden the Paint."

Led by lead singer, guitarist and keyboardist Mark Foster, the band has undergone changes since it created hits such as "Pumped Up Kicks" and "Houdini." The trio is now a quartet, with multi-instrumentalist Isom Innis also helping produce.

On the 12-track "Sacred Hearts Club" — two cuts are interludes — Foster the People get help from "The Hunger Games" actress Jena Malone on the airy "Static Space Lover" and OneRepublic's Ryan Tedder on the catchy first single, "Doing It for the Money."

Making ambitious pop isn't easy but "Sacred Hearts Club" is way more musically consistent than Foster the People's last offering, the complex ultimately unsatisfying "Supermodel" in 2014. This time, the band pairs joyous melodies with thought-provoking content in ever-increasing complexity and lets you find your sweet spot. And you will find it.

The actor who was 'Mad' before he was a 'Zoo' keeper

Q. Now that "Zoo" is back, I'm pretty sure I've seen the actor who plays Jackson on "Mad Men." Am I right? — Bob Shaw, via e-mail

A. You are. James Wolk had previously — including "Lone Star," which lasted two episodes before Fox canceled it, and the Robin Williams-Sarah Michelle Gellar CBS comedy "The Crazy Ones" — before he landed the role of ambitious, glad-handing 1960s ad-agency man Bob Benson (whose transparent behavior became sort of a popular cliché, though he had much more going on beneath the surface) on AMC's acclaimed "Mad Men."

Wolk was seen in only a dozen episodes of that show, but that was enough to fast-forward his career and land him the top-billed part of vicious-animal-fighter Jackson Oz on "Zoo," which now is in its third CBS season. He also appeared in a couple of episodes of Showtime's "Billions" earlier this year.

Q. I saw a production of "Death of a Salesman" with Dustin Hoffman on television recently. When was that done? — Jane March, Glen Burnie, Md.

A. It was recorded during mid-1980s Broadway revival of the Arthur Miller stage classic, and first shown on CBS in the late summer of 1985. Directed by the acclaimed filmmaker Volker Schlöndorff ("The Tin Drum"), it earned Emmys for Hoffman as title salesman Willy Loman and Johjn Malkovich as eldest son Biff. (It also won a third for its art direction.)

To play his role accurately, Hoffman had to "age" about 15 years ahead of his actual age at the time, which he achieved through a combination of mannerism and makeup. A very interesting part of his preparation was that for part of it, he rehearsed with the veteran actor who originated Loman on the stage, Lee J. Cobb.

Q. When will the new "American Idol" begin? — Donna Wade, Norman, Okla.

A. Though ABC hadn't announced a premiere date at the time of this writing, indications are that the network wants to start it coming out of its annual broadcast of the Oscars. Though the show's traditional launch had

been in January when it was on Fox, then, it could be in March.

Q. Will "BattleBots" be returning to ABC this summer? — Pete Bush, Lady Lake, Fla.

A. No. After two seasons of that revival, the network decided to go in some different directions ... a couple of them including other revivals, namely "The Gong Show" and "Battle of the Network Stars." However, "BattleBots" does live on elsewhere, since its eighth season is running on the Discovery-owned network Science.

Q. On "The Man From U.N.C.L.E.," what did U.N.C.L.E. stand for? — Tom Lord, Providence, R.I.

A. As the story goes, nothing, originally. It was simply an acronym that the show's makers liked, and they were content to leave it a mystery — until the United Nations voiced some concern about potentially being mistaken for the "U.N." part, particularly given the general area of New York where the base of the show was, since that's where United Nations headquarters is located.

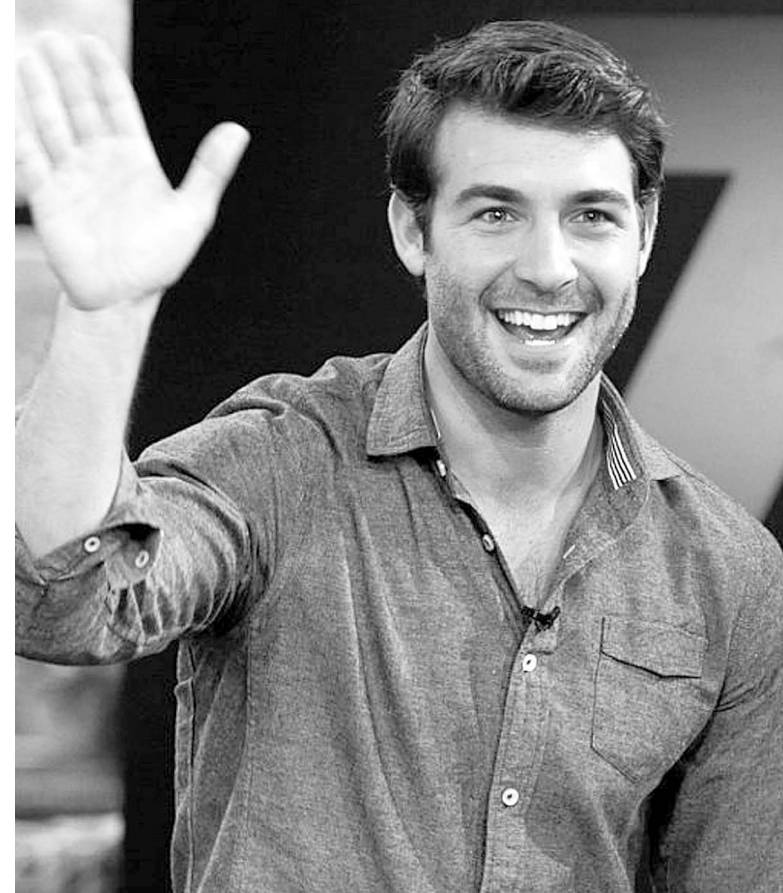
Thus, the phrase "United Network Command for Law and Enforcement" was born. The producers took it a step farther in the show's closing credits and thanked that organization "without whose assistance this program would not be possible," though it actually didn't exist.

Q. If "Doubt" wasn't a success for CBS, why is it back? — Danielle Prince, via e-mail

A. You'll often see that happen on summer Saturdays with series that didn't last through the entire run during the regular broadcast-television season. Admittedly, that's something of an understatement with "Doubt," which lasted for all of two weeks before CBS pulled it ... leaving a lot of episodes unseen.

The upside for the network is that it gets to make some use of its investment in the show by still running it, plus they have something fresh to show on usually repeat-heavy Saturdays. That's also been done in recent years with the comedies "Angel From Hell," "The Millers" and "The McCarthys."

Something evil is afoot in a small Texas backwater and a group of unusual locals is determined to put a stop to it in a new supernatural thriller series debuting this week on NBC.

In "Midnight, Texas," which premieres Monday, July 24, nothing is what it seems and abnormal is normal. In this place where the veil between the living and the dead is at its thinnest, those looking to hide from the outside world will find safe haven.

Into this remote burg comes Manfred (Francois Arnaud, "The Borgias"), a charming, powerful psychic with an ability to communicate with the dead. His presence raises the suspicions of assassin Olivia (Arielle Kebbel, "The Vampire Diaries"), mainly because no one comes to Midnight of their own volition.

Midnight is also home to Bobo (Dylan Bruce, "Orphan Black"), proprietor of the local pawn shop; Fiji (Parisa Fitz-Henley, "Luke Cage"), a witch and owner of the local wiccan shop; Joe (Jason Lewis, "Sex and the City"), an angel hip to all of Midnight's secrets; Lemuel (Peter Mensah, "True Blood"), a wise vampire in a rather unusual and symbiotic relationship with Olivia; Creek (Sarah Ramos, "Parenthood"), an aspiring writer whose family harbors a deep secret; and the Rev. Emilio Sheehan (Yul Vazquez, "Seinfeld"), a cleric swayed by the full moon.

When Aubrey Hamilton, Bobo's fiancée, is found dead in a creek, the victim of an apparent ritualistic slaying, suspicion immediately falls on Bobo. So the locals must band together to find out the truth behind the crime, among them Olivia.

Kebbel, whose roles have been mainly in dramas and comedies, saw in Olivia the chance to play an

action heroine, a genre she's eager to get into.

"Olivia Charity is quite the woman," the actress says. "She's a hit woman. She's also considered to be the town protector along with Lem, who is the resident vampire, and Olivia and Lem are in a relationship together that is very deep and twisted and we'll explore that

as the season goes on. And for me, what I love about bringing Olivia to life is that she continues to surprise me. She continues to bring parts out of myself that either I didn't know were there or I did know was there but was scared to bring out. And I feel like she allows me to be this strong, fearless, bold, sassy

woman with no apologies and I love that."

The opening episode introduces viewers to the Olivia/Lem relationship in a scene that resembles a standard vampire-bites-victim-on-neck scenario, except there is no biting, no blood and both appear to gain something from the exchange.

"Leeching actually provides life for both of them in a special way," Kebbel explains, "because when it just gets too unbearable for her, Lem leeches the anger out of her and in turn that anger gives him energy so he doesn't have to go and feed on blood. So the exchange between them is I think a really beautiful thing."

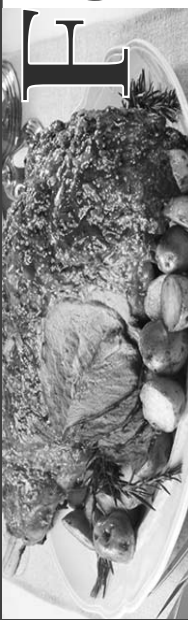

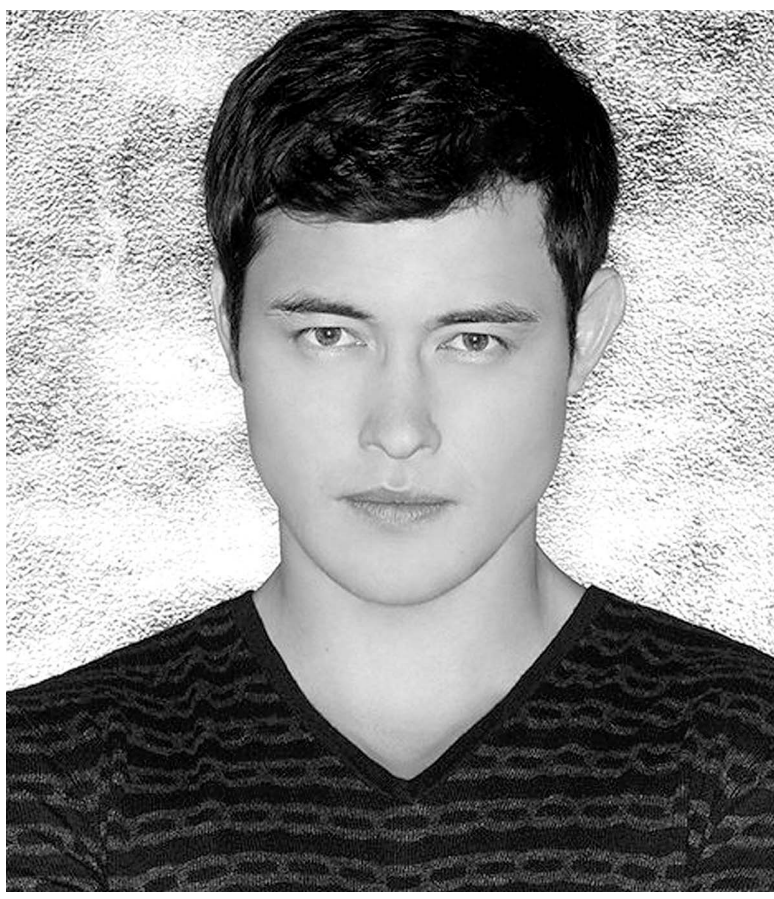
