**BEDMINSTER, N.J.** President Donald Trump on Friday issued fresh threats of swift and forceful retaliation against nuclear North Korea, declaring the U.S. military "locked and loaded" and warning that the communist country's leader "will regret it fast" if he takes any action against U.S. territories or allies.

The warnings came in a cascade of unscripted statements throughout the day, each ratcheting up a rhetorical

standoff between the two nuclear nations. The president appeared to draw another red line that would trigger a U.S. attack against North Korea and "big,

big trouble" for its leader, Kim Jong Un. Trump's comments, however, did not appear to be backed by significant military mobilization on either side of the Pacific, and an important, quiet diplomatic channel remained open.

"If he utters one threat in the form of an overt threat – which by the way he has been uttering for years and his family has been uttering for years – or he does anything with respect to Guam

## Coroner: Woman in trunk stabbed, strangled

**YOUNGSTOWN**

The death of a North Side woman whose body was found in the trunk of a car in Niagara Falls, N.Y., has been ruled a homicide.

Lt. Doug Bobovnyik said Friday the Niagara County Coroner's Office found that Anvia Mickens, 28, of Bradley Lane, died of multiple stab wounds and strangulation.

Her body was found in the trunk of a car belonging to her boyfriend, Jeshawn Elliott, 37, of Outlook Avenue, in a Niagara Falls parking lot Wednesday after Elliott's brother called police in both cities and said Elliott told him he had stabbed Mickens.

Police have not determined where Mickens was killed.

Bobovnyik would not say how many times Mickens was stabbed, only confirming that it was more than a dozen times. *The Buffalo News* reported she was stabbed 23 times and an additional 14 lacerations were found during an autopsy.

Elliott is in the Niagara County jail on a charge of assault on a police officer after he had to be restrained with a stun weapon Wednesday when he pulled a folding knife on officers looking for him.

## PUCO case against Y-town Thermal brings court motion by Home Savings

While the receiver continues work to get Youngstown Thermal's finances under control, a local bank has filed a motion to intervene in the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio case against the utility company.

Home Savings Bank uses

Youngstown Thermal's heating and cooling services at its corporate headquarters at 275 W. Federal St. downtown.

Youngstown Thermal's financial struggles left the company unable to pay its payroll and utility expenses in a timely manner. Fearful of a potential energy crisis in downtown Youngstown,

PUCO, via the Ohio Attorney General's Office, had the court appoint a receiver for the company in concern for the utility's 45 customers.

"PUCO has moved so quickly in this matter that intervention by ratepayers at the PUCO hearing level has been effectively impossible," the bank's motion reads. "If PUCO had held administrative proceedings on this matter, Home Savings would have had a mandatory right



## What does N. Korea want? Its playbook offers clues

### SEOUL, SOUTH KOREA

Threatening to fire a volley of missiles toward a major U.S. military hub – and the home to 160,000 American civilians – may seem like a pretty bad move for a country that is seriously outgunned and has an awful lot to lose.

But pushing the envelope, or just threatening to do so, is what North Korea does best.

By announcing a plan to send four "Hwasong-12" intermediate range missiles over Japan and into waters near the Pacific island of Guam, Pyongyang has significantly upped the ante despite threats from U.S. President Donald Trump.

The North has made it clear Kim Jong Un still has to sign off on the plan and give the execution order. But it says it could be ready to go within days – or just before the U.S. and South Korea are set to begin their annual Ulchi-Freedom Guardian military maneuvers.

So what, ultimately, is Pyongyang trying to accomplish?

A lot of things, actually.

### FIRST, BUILD UP THE CRED

North Korea sees the United States as an existential threat.

It knows that if it is going to be taken seriously, it needs to have a credible military deterrent. Its strategy for years, if not decades, has been to attain that by building long-range missiles that can carry nuclear warheads to targets on the U.S. mainland. It's not good enough just to claim to have that capability – it must be demonstrated.

Successful tests provide the data needed to make technical advances and valuable training for ground troops. They also dispel doubts about whether those advances are being made.

Provocative testing or training also is a way of gauging where Washington's red lines are. That can be used to decide when to push more aggressively or when to ease off.

**G**ENERATIONS COFFEE Lab is more than a coffee shop.

It's where the chemistry of coffee is heavily thought about to make the perfect cup.

The chemist in this lab is Matt Campbell, a former nuclear medicine technologist turned coffee connoisseur, who started his coffee business two years ago.

With his wife, Kristin, a Mahoning Valley native, Matt opened Branch Street Coffee Roasters in Boardman with a coffee roaster proudly displayed in the front.

Now the Campbells have taken over Generations, a Columbiana coffee shop that's been there for three years and was a main com-

petitor for Branch Street, another coffee shop.

Generations will offer free coffee from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. today with local entertainer Whiskey Pilot playing after 5 p.m. and free Generations merchandise while supplies last.

"We are just excited to show

people what we've been up to," Matt said.

Generations Coffee Lab will offer consultation services for other coffee lovers/entrepreneurs to learn the science of coffee making.

Before Matt became a coffee entrepreneur himself, he was working in New Jersey in oncology. He describes himself back then as a "big-box" coffee drinker until one day his co-worker made him try coffee from a local shop that was roasting its own beans.

"I was in love," he said. "I had to find out what was so amazing about it."

He then spent two years as a coffee apprentice learning how to roast beans.

"It was a lot to take in," he said.

**Homicide captured on video, police say**



Prosecutors and police won't reveal the specifics of what they saw on a July 8 surveillance video of the knife fight that killed Michael Krevas in a parking lot near downtown.

But authorities are confirming that the fight between Krevas, 31, of Washington Street Northwest, and Artemus Brodeur, 24, of North Park Avenue, was captured on surveillance video.

Police won't say where the camera that caught the fight is located, but the parking lot next to Brodeur's house where the fight occurred is also next to a large apartment building and across

the street from the Warren YWCA and a funeral home.

In court documents filed in Brodeur's case, Chris Becker, assistant Trumbull County prosecutor, said prosecutors have turned over to Brodeur's lawyers a DVD containing a video of the fight.

In another filing, Becker said prosecutors believe Brodeur stabbed Krevas to death in the parking lot, "then went back to his apartment and left the bloody knife, then fled and hid at 1937 Willard Ave. SE."

Prosecutors also gave Brodeur's attorneys six DVDs containing witness statements police obtained.

Adding to the evidence against Brodeur is information contained in a court document saying police secured a bloody knife from Brodeur's apartment two

**Man gets 1-year sentence in sexual assault**

**YOUNGSTOWN**

A man who pleaded guilty to having sexual contact with a mentally disabled 18-year-old family member received a one-year jail sentence with credit for one year he's served awaiting disposition of his case.

In June this year, John Kimble, 47, of North Jackson pleaded guilty to one count of gross sexual imposition, which involves sexual contact.

A Mahoning County grand jury indicted Kimble on two counts of gross sexual imposition in July 2016 for crimes that were said to have occurred in June of that year.

The woman involved had disabilities that impaired her ability to resist or consent, and Kimble was aware of those disabilities, the indictment said.

Judge Lou A. D'Apolito of Mahoning County Common Pleas Court sentenced Kimble to three years' probation Friday. The first year would be spent in jail, but Kimble served just over a year in the county jail before the plea.

Kimble also has to register as a Tier 1 sex offender for the next 15 years. Under Ohio law, a Tier 1 sex offender is the lowest level, with the offenses ranging from voyeurism, sexual imposition, pandering obscenity, menacing by stalking with sexual motivation and importuning.

The victim and her family did not appear in court Friday.


jail after he was arrested in Austintown earlier that day, reports said.

inside, and there is minimal structural damage.



Whitney.

Cartwright did not have an attorney. Judge Kobly appointed one for him.

Lawrence Whitney asked for a 10 percent bond for his client, Glenn Lambert, saying one of the bottles connected to the meth lab was outside and another was hidden from view and in a secure place inside the home.

Judge Kobly, however, denied Whitney's request.

"In a situation like this, when the whole neighborhood can blow up, I think a 10 percent bond is out of the question," the judge said.

Moliterno said Nicole Lambert had a previous conviction on similar charges in 2013.

On Thursday, Rob Whitted of the Mahoning Valley Law Enforcement Task Force, which investigated the case and served a search warrant at the home Wednesday, said the people at the house who were operating the lab were not only making methamphetamine to sell, but also to use. He said that is common in a lot of methamphetamine cases.

All three of the defendants are from the Akron area. Cartwright said he came to Youngstown to stay away from the methamphetamine scene there.

"I came down here to get away from all that," he said.

"So much for that idea," Judge Kobly said.

Authorities in Niagara Falls said Thursday that Elliott has refused to talk to them and has asked for a lawyer.

Detectives in both cities have been working together to try to determine where Mickens was killed.

Both McLaughlin and Juhasz chose not to comment after the verdict.

tenced him to life in prison. Towler was 24.

Decades later, when he's half-asleep at night, Towler can't stop his brain from conjuring up the sounds of prison — inmates fighting, his cellmate's stomach growling, the guard's radio.

"The thing about prison was that it was never quiet," Towler said. "It was bunk beds like sardines in a can."

Art helped Towler stay sane. He got a job as an attendant in the prison art room and began selling portraits for pocket money. His sister sent him a guitar, and he taught music theory to other inmates.

He made an effort not to become "hard" and to maintain a connection to broader society. He did this by befriending some of the social workers, guards and other prison staff.

He also established friendships with several of his fellow inmates. Towler said he had sympathy for some of the men doing time alongside him. Some of them were mentally ill, and some of them had agreed to take the fall for a friend's theft or drug crime, Towler said.

Towler said that while he was distrustful of police due to "run-ins" during his childhood, he kept believing that the system would correct its mistake. He kept expecting to hear that it was all a misunderstanding, that he was free to go.

He said he was pressured to take a plea deal but refused to admit guilt for something he didn't do.

"There was no way I could physically do it, you know, say the words," Towler said.

The case went to trial. Because the only physical evidence was inconclusive at the time, the case relied on identifications of Towler by the children and two passers-by who believed they saw Towler in park. Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Judge Roy F. McMahon found Towler guilty and sen-

squad, and I came out to a parade," Towler said.

Towler's release ignited a media frenzy. To this day, people hear his story and want to shake his hand or give him a hug.

The passage of a 2003 Ohio law changed Towler's life. The law allowed convicts to request DNA testing under limited circumstances to prove their innocence. Since 1989, more than 350 people across the nation have been exonerated with DNA evidence, according to the Innocence Project. More than 60 percent of those people were black like Towler.

With the help of the Ohio Innocence Project, Towler had petitioned for exoneration several times and was unsuccessful. In 2010, the science finally caught up.

DNA test results came back. The results showed the samples belonged to the same man, and that man definitely was not Towler.

Towler remembers he was technically free to go once a

judge signed papers accepting the results. He wanted to burst out of the lockup and run through the cornfields.

He agreed to stay one more night behind bars, however, so he could walk free for the first time in front of the news cameras at his court appearance the next day. At that hearing, Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Judge Eileen Gallagher choked back tears and read Towler an "Irish blessing."


In 2011, the state awarded Towler a \$2.5 million settlement. Towler says the money is no substitute for his lost decades, though he acknowledges it's a way to help him live the life he wants to live.

Despite his wrongful conviction, Towler considers himself to be "blessed."

"I can't be thinking about the past," Towler said. "I spent almost 30 years in prison — that's a whole lifetime for some people. I've got to focus on the future."

# Prosecutor: Ex-police chief's records should not be sealed

## WARREN

An assistant Trumbull County prosecutor says Reggie Potts, the former Bazetta Township police chief fired after he was convicted of three offenses, is still not eligible for his criminal record to be sealed because his offenses were five years apart.

Diane Barber, assistant county prosecutor, filed a document in the case recently to respond to Potts' motion, in which Potts said he is eligible and "has lived a law-abiding life" since his convictions.

Barber said Potts, of Howland, was convicted of felony theft in office in 1993 for a 1987 offense. He was

convicted of misdemeanor falsification in 1993 for a misdemeanor falsification that occurred in 1989. And he was convicted of misdemeanor records tampering in 1994 for a 1991 offense.

Barber said Ohio law would allow Potts to have his records sealed only if all his offenses "are connected to the same act or result from offenses committed at the same time."

Potts' three offenses were not related to one another, and they involved Potts' employment, Barber said.

Potts' theft in office involved letting a friend borrow a car lent to the police department. The falsification was writing a letter indicating a man had worked for the Bazetta Police Department who had not. The

records tampering related to police department drug records, according to documents.

Barber said there are nearly five years separating the three offenses, and they had nothing to do with each other.

But Matthew Williams of Cleveland, attorney for Potts, said in a filing Wednesday that the law is ambiguous and may not mean what Barber thinks it means.

He argued that "the ends of justice and the law are served by resolving the ambiguities within the statute ... in favor of the applicant [Potts]."

No hearings are scheduled in the case, and Judge W. Wyatt McKay of common pleas court has not ruled on it.

Meanwhile, Judge McKay has ruled against the request of Carlisa Davis, 19, of Warren, to be released from prison after serving seven months of a 30-month sentence.

Davis was convicted of two counts of felony child endangering after her children, age 9 months and 21 months, had to be revived with the opiate-reversal drug naloxone after they became unresponsive.

Authorities said Davis never told authorities that the cause of their illness might be related to a drug overdose. She knew her brothers were selling drugs out of their mother's house, and she saw one of the children playing in powder, a prosecutor said.



prise, Miss.; and two sisters, Joan E. Balas of Boardman and Barbara Check of Canfield. He also leaves many nieces, nephews and cousins.


Preceding him into the light was his beautiful sister, Jeanie Check Bissett.


He was born June 16, 1951, in Warren, the son of Louis and Tina Greco Baragona.



**DeVos says school

LAS VEGAS

More than a third of U.S. states have created school voucher programs that bypass thorny constitutional and political issues by turning them over to nonprofits that rely primarily on businesses to fund them. But the programs are raising questions about transparency and accountability at a time when supporters are urging that they be expanded into a federal program.

Unlike traditional school vouchers, which are directly funded by the states – or in the case of Washington, D.C., the federal government – these programs don't use any public money. Instead, those who contribute to the voucher program get tax credits. Seventeen states now have the so-called tax-credit scholarships.

Both President Donald Trump and Education Secretary Betsy DeVos have promoted the scholarships as a way to give parents greater choice in deciding where their children will go to school. Supporters are pushing the administration to launch a federal program extending the tax-credit scholarships nationwide.

A hairstylist suffered more than 40 stab wounds to his upper body in a fatal attack last month in the high-rise Chicago condo of a Northwestern University professor, police said Friday.

The since-fired professor, Wyndham Lathem, and Oxford University financial officer Andrew Warren were arrested in the San Francisco area eight days after 26-year-old Trenton James Cornell-Duranleau was found dead last month.

Cornell-Duranleau suffered "lacerations and mutilations to his body, his upper body, but not to the point of decapitation," Chicago police spokesman Anthony Guglielmi said. He described the attack as "certainly very intense."

Guglielmi said police believe there might have been some tension in Lathem and Cornell-Duranleau's relationship.

## Resistance leaders play long game, dismiss any impeachment talk

## ATLANTA

The resistance movement that flourished with Donald Trump's ascendence to the White House isn't necessarily itching to see his presidency undone by the investigation into Russia's election meddling or even impeachment.

They'd rather beat Trump and other Republicans at the ballot box, winning an argument over the nation's direction, not the president's fitness for office.

To be clear, liberal activists gathered for the annual Netroots Nation confab this weekend in Georgia say they're following counsel Robert Mueller's inquiry into possible collaboration between Russian agents and Trump's inner circle. But obsessing over subpoenas, much less clamoring for impeachment, they say, distracts from larger policy debates and congressional midterm elections whose outcomes will last beyond Trump.

"This administration is a dumpster fire, but that means we need

members of the movement focused on everything, on action," says Ericka Perrson, an organizer for the Working Families Party. "Russia, that whole investigation can serve sometimes as a magic trick. There's this hand moving up in the air so you don't see what's going on over here."

The immediate task, says Leah Greenberg, co-founder of Indivisible, sometimes cast as the tea party of the left, is to keep pressure on congressional Democrats when the Republican majority returns in September to pursue an overhaul of the tax code, figure out how to fund the government and continues to grapple with health care.

"We're focusing on the places where constituents have leverage right now," Greenberg says.

The long-term aim, say Greenberg and others, is simple even if not easy: Help Democrats – liberal Democrats, specifically – win more elections from Congress and governors' offices down to local school boards so the left can do more than

play defense.

The strategy suggests there may not be as many divisions among Democratic Party leaders, the activist left and conventional advocacy groups as it sometimes appears, and it certainly could give some relief to party officials on Capitol Hill, where House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi, D-Calif., and Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer, D-N.Y., want no part of an impeachment resolution introduced by a handful of liberal members and accusing Trump of obstruction of justice.

Democrats argue that impeachment talk energizes the Republican base, and such a drastic step would elevate Vice President Mike Pence.

"It's important that Democrats don't overplay their hand" so the party "takes advantage of whatever opportunities we will have in 2018," says Jaime Harrison, a top deputy to Democratic National Committee Chairman Tom Perez, as he mingled with Netroots attendees.

## Southern nationalists again crying 'secede'

## BIRMINGHAM, ALA.

As 21st-century activists seek to topple monuments to the 19th-century Confederate rebellion, some white Southerners are again advocating for what the Confederates tried and failed to do: secede from the Union.

It's not an easy argument to win, and it's not clear how much support the idea has: The leading Southern nationalist group, the Alabama-based League of the South, has been making the same claim for more than two decades and still has an address in the U.S.A., not the C.S.A.

But the idea of a breakaway Southern nation persists.

The League of the South's longtime president, retired university professor Michael Hill of Killen, Ala., posted a message in July that began, "Fight or die white man" and went on to say Southern nationalists seek "nothing less than the complete reconquest and restoration of our patrimony – the whole, entire South."

"And that means the South will once again be in name and in actuality White Man's Land. A place

where we and our progeny can enjoy Christian liberty and the fruits of our own labor, unhindered by parasitical 'out groups,'" said Hill's message, posted on the group's Facebook page a day after a rally in support of a statue of Confederate Gen. Robert E. Lee in Charlottesville, Va.

While white-controlled government is its goal, the group says in a statement of beliefs that it offers "good will and cooperation to Southern blacks in areas where we can work together as Christians to make life

better for all people in the South."

According to the U.S. Census, 55 percent of the nation's black population lived in the South in 2010, and 105 Southern counties had a black population of 50 percent or higher.

Hill said they're not advocating for a repeat of a Civil War.

The group has erected billboards that said "SECEDE" in several states, and it even has its own banner – a black and white version of the familiar Confederate battle flag, minus the stars.

## Cleveland Clinic won't move Mar-a-Lago event

## COLUMBUS

A leading U.S. hospital has decided it won't move its annual fundraiser away from Donald Trump's Mar-a-Lago resort despite pressure from health professionals and others over the president's support for repealing the Affordable Care Act.

The Cleveland Clinic said donors and hospital executives in Ohio and Florida reviewed the request and decided against changing the venue.

Spokeswoman Eileen Sheil said the event raises between \$700,000 and \$1 million annually to expand programs and purchase equipment for the hospital's Florida facility. It's been held at Mar-a-Lago the past eight years, she said.

"For us, this is more about raising money to help our clinical programs and patient care," Sheil said.

A public letter seeking relocation of the event has quickly collected more than 1,100 signatures from doctors, nurses, medical students and other Ohio residents concerned about

the nation's No. 2-ranked hospital patronizing a Trump business.

A Columbus cardiologist who signed it says Cleveland Clinic is a thought leader in medicine, and Trump's support for repealing the Affordable Care Act goes against its core principles supporting science, research and integrity.

"The Cleveland Clinic has always been a bastion of science, of research and of integrity," said Greg Lam, a member of the Physicians Action Network.

"When the founders established the Cleveland Clinic in 1921, it was based on the principles of diversity, integrity, research and facts. And that's completely antithetical to what Donald Trump represents."

The letter says the hospital's support for the Trump Organization is unacceptable "because it symbolically and financially supports a politician actively working to decrease access to health care and cut billions of dollars in research funding from the National Institutes of Health budget."

## Trump not ruling out military action in Venezuela

In an escalation of rhetoric, President Donald Trump said Friday that he hasn't ruled out military action against Venezuela.

Speaking to reporters at his Bedminster, N.J., golf club, Trump bemoaned the country's growing humanitarian crisis and declared that all options remain on the table – including a potential military intervention.

"We have many options for Venezuela and, by the way, I'm not going to rule out a military option," Trump volunteered, adding, "A military operation and military option is certainly something that we could pursue."

On Thursday, Trump said he discussed Venezuela along with North Korea and Afghanistan in a security briefing with top national security aides and Vice President Mike Pence. Pence is traveling to Colombia on Sunday to begin a regional trip that is expected to include discussions on how to deal with President Nicolas Maduro.

Peru expelled Venezuela's ambassador Friday as regional pressure built on Maduro's government for allegedly trampling his country's constitutional order.

Peru gave Ambassador Diego Molero, a former Venezuelan defense minister, five days to leave the country. As part of what it said was a firm commitment "to help restore Venezuela's democracy," Peru's administration also refused to accept a diplomatic protest made by Maduro over Peru's hosting this week of foreign ministers from 17 regional nations who refused to recognize the new, loyalist-packed special assembly that is to rewrite the constitution.

### High rankings of hospitals in Valley inspire confidence

◆ St. Elizabeth Boardman Hospital, which is celebrating its 10th anniversary this year, ranked No. 22 overall in the state. The 193-bed suburban hospital with 12,961 admissions and 46,534 emergency room visits in a recent year, received high performance grades in COPD, heart failure and knee replacement.

◆ St. Joseph Warren Hospital, part of the same Mercy Health network as the two honorees above, also ranked as high performing. The 236-bed facility with 74,300 emergency room visits and 8,036 admissions in a recent year, received honors for COPD and heart disease treatment.

◆ Trumbull Memorial Hospital, now a part of the Steward Health Care system, also drew praise in the analysis. The Warren hospital with 292 beds, 95,000 emergency visits and about 15,000 admissions yearly, was named a High Performing Hospital for its treatment of heart disease.

### Put sex traffickers on alert

*Toledo Blade:* The Communications Decency Act has unwittingly supported the explosion of online sex trafficking since its enactment in 1996. It is high time that something be done about it.

Websites, such as Backpage.com, that have been accused of knowingly facilitating sex trafficking, have been able to exploit a loophole in Section 230 of the CDA to escape legal and civil liability. The results have been gut-wrenching.

According to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, there was an 846 percent increase in reports of suspected child-sex trafficking from 2010-2015, mostly attributed to the Internet marketplace.

Sen. Rob Portman, R-Ohio, has been tenacious in trying to close this loophole. Mr. Portman, along with a bipartisan coalition of 19 senators, introduced the Stop Enabling Sex Traffickers Act of 2017 last week.


The act would strip the protections for websites that knowingly facilitate sex trafficking, even in ads posted by third parties.

## Trump, Kim: Two peas in a pod

### WASHINGTON

Much has been made of the silly, weird, contrived hairstyles of America's president and North Korea's Dear Leader.

The incredible gold helmet that finds no parallel in nature. The side-shaved mop top that astonishes with ugliness.

Unfortunately, the comparisons do not stop there.

Donald Trump and Kim Jong Un were both spoiled rich bullies growing up with unusual appetites for food, expensive toys and women. They both had father complexes. They both crave daily doses of flattery and adulation. And they each think ominous, untempered threats are the way to more power.

So how serious is this new crisis?

North Korea is fast developing nuclear weapons and intercontinental ballistic missiles and likes to rattle sabers even though it's probably not quite ready to deliver a warhead to U.S. shores. Trump, barely seven months into his presidency and with no major wins since taking office, sees his job approval rating is plummeting. He relishes making bellicose threats. Is war possible? Nuclear war?

Our instincts are to say that's ridiculous. But history is littered with evidence of stupid, pointless wars started because of miscalculation, hunger for power, fear, and rhetoric that quickly escalated beyond control, ending in death and destruction.

Experts warn that Trump's threat to unleash "fire and fury" and, frankly, power the likes of which this world has never seen

before" is counterproductive. They also warn that, yes, we could blunder into a devastating war, killing millions and destroying the idea of America as a peacekeeper and beacon of hope and democracy.

What good are nuclear weapons if they are never used, Trump famously asked with a shrug during his presidential campaign. Did he mean it? Who knows? Years ago on NBC, he said that he would launch a pre-emptive nuclear strike against North Korea.

When he took office, he said North Korea would not get a nuclear warhead that could threaten the United States. "It won't happen," he tweeted with certainty. It's happening. He's piqued. He once promised he'd be "honored" to negotiate with Kim Jong Un. But Trump's self-proclaimed amazing skills in the art of the deal won't do much good in working with a guy who has regularly cheated on the international stage.

### 'MY GENERALS'

The people Trump calls "my generals" – his chief of staff, the secretary of defense and his national security adviser – did not sign off on Trump's fiery rhetoric and red line. (Didn't we have enough ridiculous red-line drawing under former President Barack Obama?) Trump's generals know there is no good military option in dealing with North Korea. No president, including Richard Nixon, responded to North Korea's provocations with military strikes.

Kim is a tyrant who thinks he is a supreme being, a man with no concern for the lives of others. He runs a dictatorship and promises to "pre-emptively annihilate" anyone who threatens

the regime's "supreme dignity." He sees North Korea's nuclear weapons as the only way to ensure the survival of his family's dynasty. He has hidden bunkers, 1,000 missiles, 1.2 million soldiers, 10,000 artillery tubes, and biological and chemical weapons 35 miles and three minutes away from Seoul.

The United Nations Security Council's new sanctions on North Korea, supposed to eliminate \$1 billion to \$3 billion in annual trade with other nations, must be enforced, with China being the key. The good news is that China and Russia both voted for tougher sanctions.

Trump should make clear in a prime-time TV speech – using teleprompters – that the United States will not start a pre-emptive war. He should assure Japan and South Korea he will consult with them before he does anything and reassure them and the world the United States will always be a protector. It is also to be hoped that Kim knows war would spell the end for his debauched life.

We have lived with a nuclear Russia, far more dangerous to us than North Korea. We have lived with a nuclear China. It requires restraint and compromise. But in more than half a century, there has been no nuclear war. It would be catastrophic to yield to provocation and go to war with a criminal regime that will not last forever.

This is another reminder that elections have consequences and that sometimes what you see is what you get – on the head and inside it.

### RAGE JUNKIES

## MVICC is part of a collaborative community

## YOUNGSTOWN

Youngstown State University President Jim Tressel discussed plans for the Mahoning Valley Innovation and Commercialization Center during the Mahoning Valley Manufacturers Coalition's quarterly membership meeting.

The MVICC, which will be at 360 W. Commerce St., is a \$30 million state-of-the-art shared-use facility that will support manufacturing training and research and development.

During the Friday morning meeting, MVMC founder Brian Benyo said: "YSU has really taken the ball and run with this initiative to create this training center."

"We would not be here today if it wasn't for the commitment and the recognition of how this could impact this region," he said.

"We, in the community, were having discussions centered around the idea that to really enhance the level of skills that are needed in manufacturing to where the manufacturers felt are

needed ... we really needed to create some type of shared facility that allow us to advance the capabilities of the instructors and the equipment," he said.

Tressel said from there it soon became an easy decision.

"It was a no-brainer to me when Brian [Benyo]... said, 'Hey, we have got to create a facility, a center, that will give us a chance to bring in the technology and expertise we need so we can be highly competitive,'" Tressel said.

In June, the Mahoning County commissioners authorized the sale of the county's former minimum-security jail to YSU for \$525,000 for use as the collaborative innovation center. The commissioners also authorized a co-application with YSU for a \$2 million U.S. Economic Development Administration grant for renovation of that building.

Tressel said the next step is to get people to buy into the project.

"The biggest thing here is about collaborative partners in this community," he said.

"We have a great offense and a great defense, but we also need to have great fans and great coaches and great special teams. We're insignificant without every other

partner in the collaboration. ... We are creating an environment that will be shared by many in many different ways."

Tressel hopes to renovate

and create a space of more than 70,000 square feet.

"It's about creating opportunities in this area for young people to thrive," Tressel said.

## US stocks snap 3-day losing streak in roller coaster week

Gains among technology companies helped snap a three-day losing streak for U.S. stocks Friday, though the market ended with its worst weekly loss since March.

The modest rebound came at the end of a turbulent week on Wall Street as escalating tensions between the U.S. and North Korea rattled global markets.

In the first four days of the week, the Standard & Poor's 500 index swung from marking its latest record high to posting its biggest single-day drop in nearly three months.

The negative headlines provided many investors with an opportunity to pocket some of their recent gains after a string of record highs fueled by strong corporate earnings.

"It's been a bit of a roller coaster this week, with all the rhetoric between the U.S. and North Korea," said Jeff Kravetz, regional investment strategist at U.S. Bank Wealth Management. "That did temporarily shake investors' complacency, but we think markets are ready to move higher in the back half of the year, and earnings and economic data are going to drive that."

The recovery fit a recent pattern of investors using dips to put more money in

despite the past week's decline, the major indexes are in positive territory so far this year, led by the Nasdaq, which is up 16.2 percent. The S&P 500 is up 9 percent, while the Dow is up 10.6 percent.

"If you strip away what's going on in North Korea, and if you strip away what's going on in Washington, which are things that are tougher to predict, the economy, the global recovery, earnings, it all paints a very positive picture for the rest of the year," Kravetz said.

There were fewer signs of anxiousness in the markets Friday. Bond and gold prices, traditional havens for nervous investors, were little changed, and the VIX, a measure of how much volatility investors expect in stocks, fell 3.3 percent after a 44.4 percent jump the day before. It's still the highest it's been since May.

Investors also drew some encouragement from new government data showing U.S. inflation at the consumer level inched higher last month. July's 0.1 percent increase in consumer prices suggests that the Federal Reserve may be less likely to raise interest rates next month.

## US consumer prices up slight 0.1 percent in July

## WASHINGTON

Consumer prices posted a slight gain in July, with higher costs for medical care and clothing offsetting declines for hotel stays and consumer cellphone plans.

The Labor Department said Friday that its consumer price index edged up 0.1 percent last month after no gain in June and a 0.1 percent fall in May. Core inflation, which excludes volatile energy and food changes, was also up a slight 0.1 percent in July.

Both overall inflation and core inflation have risen an identical 1.7 percent over the past 12 months. That shows that inflation pressures remain well under control. In fact, a separate inflation gauge favored by the Federal Reserve has been slowing this year, raising concerns that inflation is falling farther from the Fed's 2 percent goal.

"Today's report is just the sort of ammunition the Fed doves need to argue against

additional rate hikes this year," said Chris Rupkey, chief financial economist at MUFG in New York, referring to the group of Fed officials who generally argue for a go-slow approach to hiking interest rates.

The Fed has raised its benchmark interest rate in March and June, and has signaled it plans a third rate hike before year's end. But private economists say the Fed may stand pat for the rest of 2017 unless inflation accelerates in coming months. The Fed's preferred inflation gauge showed a 12-month price gain of 2.2 percent in February, but its latest reading has slowed to a gain of just 1.4 percent.

Joel Naroff, chief economist at Naroff Economic Advisors, said that the low inflation is actually a break for consumers at a time when wage growth continues to lag.

The Fed may want inflation to pick up, but that would not be good news to households," Naroff said.



The possibilities — and options — with Youngstown State's wide receivers seem endless.

On Friday at Stambaugh Stadium, wideouts coach Brian Crist's unit made a few highlight plays. Those things come a little easier with a veteran group. The Penguins lost only one wideout this offseason.

"It's been nice — a little nicer compared to the last couple of years. They're a good group," Crist said. "They like to work so even though they have experience, it isn't monotonous for them. It makes them easier to coach."

**Patterson**  
Senior Damoun Patterson hauled in a long pass at the end of a trick play and junior Isaiah Scott made two quality sideline grabs. One of those plays went for 45 yards a touchdown to send his teammates cheering on the sidelines.

"I came through for my team. My number was called and I was able to make a play," Scott said.

Scott, a Hubbard graduate, finds himself among the Penguins' top three receivers, along with Patterson and senior Alvin Bailey. His resume is the thinnest of the trio with just 10 career catches, but he's getting first-team reps.

"He's had a really good camp so far," YSU head coach Bo Pelini said. "He's made some big plays and he's showing what we'd like to see out of everyone, some consistency."

Going from his sophomore to junior seasons, Crist has seen Scott mature and that translates to the climb on the depth chart.

"It used to be take two steps forward and three steps back, now we take three steps forward and one step back," Crist said. "He's getting better and you see the difference in his attitude, work habits and his execution."

"He's going to be an important part of this offense."

Outside of those three, the depth chart gets more fluid. Pelini mentioned redshirt freshman Darius Shackleford as another young receiver who

"This facility is a very impressive facility and our kids were very excited to play here," Hiraki said. "We have fields along various rivers back home, but they aren't in one place like they are over here."



## BUFFALO BILLS

### Do trades signal move to rebuilding mode?

**ORCHARD PARK, N.Y.** The Buffalo Bills' offseason overhaul isn't over yet with receiver Sammy Watkins and cornerback Ronald Darby the latest players to be sent packing.

The Bills dealt both starters in separate blockbuster trades on Friday as part of an effort to reshape the roster under new coach Sean McDermott.

Watkins was traded to the Los Angeles Rams, while Darby was sent to the Philadelphia Eagles. Buffalo addressed both positions by acquiring receiver Jordan Matthews from Philadelphia and cornerback E.J. Gaines from the Rams.

The Bills also continued looking to the future by further stockpiling 2018 draft selections. They acquired a second-round pick from L.A. and a third-rounder from the Eagles, while also sending a sixth-round pick to the Rams. Add in the acquisition of the Kansas Chiefs' first-round pick in trade completed in April, and the Bills now have two picks in each of the first three rounds next year.

The additional picks provide Bills new general manager Brandon Beane assets in a draft that looks like it will have several top-end quarterback prospects. Bills starter Tyrod Taylor's future is uncertain beyond this year.

## MIAMI DOLPHINS

### QB Tannehill to have surgery, miss season

**MIAMI** Ryan Tannehill has decided surgery can no longer be avoided.

The Miami Dolphins quarterback will undergo an operation to repair the torn ACL in his left knee and will miss the entire season, a person familiar with the decision said Friday.

The person confirmed the decision to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity because the Dolphins hadn't disclosed it publicly. Tannehill will be placed on injured reserve, the person said.

Tannehill, who missed the final four games of last season with two sprained ligaments in his knee, reinjured it a week into training camp on Aug. 3. The Dolphins consulted with specialists before the team and Tannehill decided surgery was the best option.

It also appears rookie linebacker Raekwon McMillan will miss the entire season with a torn ACL in his right knee, a person familiar with the situation said Friday.

The person confirmed the diagnosis to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity because the Dolphins had not disclosed the severity of the injury. McMillan was the front-runner to win the starting job at middle linebacker until he was hurt covering a punt early

while blasting the decision.

"The NFL's findings are replete with factual inaccuracies and erroneous conclusions and it 'cherry picks' so-called evidence to support its conclusion while ignoring other critical evidence," attorneys Frank Salzano and Scott Rosenblum said in a joint statement. "During the upcoming weeks and through the appeal, a slew of additional credible and controverting evidence will come to light."

If Goodell's ruling stands, Elliott will go on the suspended list the first week of the regular season and be eligible to return to the active roster Oct. 23. His first possible game would be Week 8 at Washington.

The ruling requires Elliott to get an evaluation to determine whether he needs counseling or treatment, and to show proof that he is following up on any recommendations. NFL special counsel for conduct Todd

Jones wrote in the letter to Elliott that advisers "were of the view that there is substantial and persuasive evidence supporting a finding that (Elliott) engaged in physical violence against Ms. Thompson on multiple occasions during the week of July 16, 2016."

Last September, the office of Columbus City Attorney Richard Pfeiffer cited conflicting and inconsistent information in the evidence in deciding against criminal charges. Pfeiffer's office declined comment Friday.

Peter Harvey, one of the advisers to Goodell, said the NFL had access to forensic electronic evidence that prosecutors didn't have. Harvey said an example was proof that photographs were taken by Thompson the same day she alleged that she was injured by Elliott.

Harvey also said some of the explanations offered by Elliott's representatives, including that Thompson was injured in a fight with a woman or by falling down stairs, weren't supported by

evidence.

"It is also important to note that, while there may be conflicting testimonial evidence regarding the nature and substance of conversations, there is no dispute that you and Ms. Thompson were together in the same location on the dates identified, and no evidence to suggest that anyone else could have caused these injuries," the letter said.

Cowboys owner Jerry Jones had maintained he hadn't seen anything to indicate Elliott was guilty of domestic violence and he didn't think his star back would be suspended. Jones made the comments several times, including during festivities last weekend when he was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame. The ruling potentially could put Goodell and Jones, a strong supporter of the commissioner, at odds the same way Goodell clashed with New England owner Robert Kraft over last year's four-game suspension for quarterback Tom Brady over the "Deflategate" controversy.

takes, some of them subtle and undetected by everyone but Kizer and his coach, that the second-round pick needs to correct.

The Browns don't play again until Aug. 21, when they host the New York Giants. Jackson is in no rush to name a starter for that nationally televised game and indicated he may wait several more days before deciding who takes the field first.

Kizer could get the nod, or at least leapfrog Kessler and be the second QB to get snaps. He looked good against the Saints' second- and third-stringers, and the Browns would like to get a look at him against stiffer competition.

Whatever Jackson decides to do, it'll have little bearing on the long-term picture.

Kizer is the one the Browns are grooming to lead their franchise, and Jackson insists he won't rush that process.

"It is the making of the quarterback," he said. "It is the raising of a quarterback. That takes time. I don't think you do things out of a knee-jerk reaction. You just don't make decisions to make them. You kind of let things play themselves out, and they will. If a guy is good enough and deserving of an opportunity, trust me, we are not in a position to where we wouldn't give the best player an opportunity."

The Browns open the regular season on Sept. 10 against Pittsburgh and will play at Baltimore, at Indianapolis and host Cincinnati the next three weeks. That would be a daunting schedule for any quarterback, never mind one who only made 23 starts at Notre Dame.

Before deciding on his starter, Jackson is factoring in several variables, which include Cleveland's plan to run the ball more and attack defensively. Those things can help a young quarterback and Jackson said he would have no reluctance to play a rookie.

"If that is the decision that we make, then I wouldn't have any hesitation," he said.

Jackson is still mapping out the practice schedule to possibly give Kizer more snaps against Cleveland's starting defense to prepare him for the Giants.

There's still work to do, and Jackson isn't going to succumb to outside pressure to rush him.

"We are going to keep working at this thing, and we are going to continue to coach all of these guys to get better," he said. "When it is the right time to make the decision that we feel is right to say, 'This is the quarterback of the Cleveland Browns for 2017,' then we will make that decision."

For many, fishing becomes a mental place as much as a physical pursuit. They go there to be happy, to gain perspective, to add meaning.

But fishing isn't always more than, well, fishing. It isn't always – or perhaps even often – an existential exercise. It's not exactly "Waiting for Godot," but (sorry, Samuel Beckett) fishing can be a tragicomedy.

I think it breaks out this way: As I go about the various motions, I am fishing. When I catch something, I am fishing. When I pause to think or analyze for strategic purposes, I am fishing.

Recently I went to the lake with high hopes. I almost always have my optimism at full volume as I launch the boat.

The day dawned fresh and humid. It wasn't hot, but the air was the kind of sticky that I've come to learn can be a very good sign.

I shoved away from the dock and soon popped the electric motor from its stowed position and throttled the propeller to pull me along a rip-rap bank. A few cars buzzed past on the highway atop the causeway and a heron took flight when the BassCat approached too close for the bird's comfort.

The flooded rocks produced no fish, which was puzzling, but not cause for panic.

I moved to a different spot and fished hard with lures I'd proved a thousand times in the past to be productive in similar situations.

But still no fish bit. A 30-inch musky followed my lure, but veered off to look for something real to eat.

My third stop finally yielded a small bass. Not exactly what I was seeking, but at least it had broken the ice. Or so I thought.

The balance of my day went just about the same as the first couple hours. Long stretches of unproductive casts punctuated by the occasional little fish.

It was one of those days when fishing was, well, just fishing. But that's just fine with me because the rest of the weekend picnic was still out there to be enjoyed.

# Good news for monarch butterflies

Over the past 20 years, monarch butterfly populations that overwinter in the mountains of central Mexico have fluctuated wildly. Some years, the species' survival has been in doubt. The news this year, however, is good.

Dr. Chip Taylor, director of Monarch Watch at the University of Kansas, monitors the status of monarchs each year, and he just issued his status report for 2017.

Before getting to Taylor's expectations for the fall southbound migration, it's important to understand how he arrives at his predictions. He begins with the numbers of monarchs measured at the overwintering sites in Mexico.

Next he analyzes winter survival. Then he monitors the environmental conditions that monarchs experience as they move north from Mexico into Texas, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Arkansas and Kansas. Then he assesses conditions during the breeding season that permit (or don't permit) first-generation mon-


archs to reach the northern breeding grounds. Summer temperatures and rainfall also factor into Taylor's predictions.

Based upon this year's conditions, Taylor predicts a great fall season for monarchs.

Though monarch populations are usually highest in the Midwest and plains states, Cape May, N.J., is also known for its impressive fall monarch migration. Taylor expects numbers there to be much greater than in recent years. A September or October trip to Cape May to see monarchs should be worthwhile.

Taylor also predicts a great fall season for the Upper Midwest from the Dakotas east to Wisconsin, Illinois, Michigan and Ohio. And I'm expecting a good fall season here in northern West Virginia. I've been seeing lots of monarchs since early June.

Given his positive forecast, Taylor expects this fall to be a great opportunity for citizen scientists to tag monarchs. Much of what

we know about monarch migration originates with the citizen science program called Monarch Watch. Participants can purchase self-adhesive tags (25 for \$15) to place on the hind wings of captured monarchs. During the winter, tags recovered in Mexico help biologists understand the complexities of monarch migration. For more information and to purchase tags, visit [www.monarchwatch.org](http://www.monarchwatch.org).

For monarchs to continue a strong comeback this year, a variety of factors must converge. Weather along the migratory path must be favorable. An abundant crop of nectar-bearing flowers to fuel the migration is required. And toxic herbicides applied by farmers along the migratory path must not have exterminated wildflowers, particularly milkweed.

Monarchs that make it

to the winter grounds in Mexico must then survive three to four months before beginning their return migration. Under ideal conditions, that's not a problem, but cold temperatures and freezing rain in fir forests where monarchs winter can be catastrophic. Under adverse conditions, millions of monarchs can die.

So we cross our fingers and hope for the best. Until we have a sense of how many monarchs made it to the winter grounds, we must wait. The more important number, however, is how many leave the winter grounds and head north in February.

In the meantime, here's what we can do to help monarch butterflies:

◆ Plant milkweed. It's the only host plant upon which monarchs lay eggs.

◆ Plant more milkweed.

## SOLAR ECLIPSE ALERT

On Aug. 21, the U.S. will experience its first coast-to-coast total solar eclipse since 1776. From Oregon to

South Carolina, the eclipse will follow a 67-mile-wide path of totality.

In the zone of totality, the brightness of the sun will dim drastically, and the temperature could quickly and briefly drop as much as 20 degrees. Animals will prepare for nightfall, and winds may pick up. Totality will last only a few minutes, but from start to finish the eclipse will take several hours. Outside the path of totality, the results will be far less dramatic.

Of course, all of this requires clear skies. Under a cloudy sky, the eclipse will be almost unnoticed.

Warning: Looking directly at the sun during a solar eclipse can cause severe damage to eyes and even blindness, so explain this to children and take proper precautions. For tips on safely viewing the eclipse, visit [www.nasa.gov](http://www.nasa.gov).



## Maybe 'Alice' will come to her senses

**Dear Annie:** My husband of 44 years passed away from Alzheimer's disease six years ago. I was a widow when I met him and had three small children, a son and two daughters. He had been divorced for 2½ years and also had three children from a previous marriage, two sons and a daughter. The boys came to live with us. The daughter, "Alice," stayed with her mother.

Alice kept in close touch as long as we were supporting her financially. We noticed she seemed to be jealous of my children, especially my daughters. We tried to include her in all of our family gatherings. But after she got married — with a big church wedding that we paid for — we didn't hear from her very much. We didn't even get so much as a phone call from her on my husband's birthday or on Father's Day.

A while back, my husband had a heart attack and was not allowed visitors in the hospital aside from me. Alice went into a rage. She told me he was her daddy and he had been taken away from her. I reminded her that I had nothing to do with their divorce. (Her mother asked for the divorce; she was having an affair.) It was very upsetting, to say the least.

Years later, I let Alice know when her father was put on hospice. She made one visit to see him. She lived an hour and a half away.



## Rabbits: Do they make good pets?

- ◆ Search rescue groups to adopt a rabbit. There are different breeds; a larger breed usually is better for kids.
- ◆ Rabbitproof the house. Rabbits are known to chew.
- With some work, as all pets require, a rabbit will be a fun and loving member of your family! Ask your veterinarian for more information about having a rabbit as a pet.



## Metal rocker shares his horror memorabilia

### SALEM, MASS.

Kirk Hammett may be known best as the guitarist whose deafening solos have come to define the band Metallica. But a new exhibit is showcasing a different side of the rocker, his passion for sci-fi and horror films.

The exhibit, which opens today at the Peabody Essex Museum, features 135 works owned by the heavy-metal musician. It runs through Nov. 26.

"My collection takes me to a place where I need to be," Hammett said. "Among the monsters, where I'm most comfortable and creative. That's where the magic has happened for me all these

years, and it's something I've come to trust," he said. "From the moment I first encountered these characters, I could see that these guys had just as much difficulty in coping as I did."

Daniel Finamore, who curated the show titled "It's Alive: Classic Horror and Sci-Fi Art from the Kirk Hammett Collection," said although the posters may have played a supporting role to the films, they give the mummies and zombies top billing and "deliver on the promise of fear."

"These are rare works of art, but they're under-recognized as such," he said.

There are posters of the undead and unnatural, in-

cluding ones from the 1931 film "Dracula" and the 1932 film "The Mummy."

The exhibit also features some collectible electric guitars, monster masks and sculptures.

One of the stars of the show is the lone-surviving, three-sheet poster for the 1931 film "Frankenstein." It was found in the boarded-up projection room of an old movie theater.

Collecting horror items is a new, but lucrative, endeavor. The most expensive movie poster was purchased in 2016 by a private collector for nearly \$700,000. It was for director Fritz Lang's 1927 film "Metropolis."

## Cable news channel becomes the home for Trump haters

## MSNBC ratings surge

### NEW YORK

For the first month since CNN's Larry King owned cable news in October 2001, the most popular personality in prime-time doesn't work for Fox News Channel. Rachel Maddow of MSNBC is the new champ.

Her network achieved other milestones in July, including its closest finish to Fox since 2000 and largest margin of victory over CNN ever. The numbers illustrate a surge in popularity at MSNBC, where politics has become prime-time entertainment. Like late-night comic Stephen Colbert can attest, having President Donald Trump as a regular punching bag is great for business.

"I thought there would be a lot of interest in news," said MSNBC President Phil Griffin. "I had no idea this would happen."

It's especially noteworthy because the year after an election traditionally signals a slump in cable news ratings. During prime-time weekday hours in July, Fox News averaged 2.36 million viewers — still more than any other cable network, news or entertainment. MSNBC was at 2.13 million and CNN at 961,000, according to the Nielsen company.

A wider view illustrates how things have changed. Earlier this year, Fox routinely had more viewers than MSNBC and CNN combined. Those two networks frequently duke it out for second place; last November CNN averaged 1.83 million viewers to MSNBC's 1.64 million, Nielsen said. MSNBC took over second earlier this year and the gap continues to widen.

MSNBC's Maddow, Chris Hayes and Lawrence O'Donnell follow Trump with a critical eye each evening. The rapid pace of new developments, often aided by the fierce competition for scoops between *The New York Times*, *Washington Post* and other outlets, gives MSNBC a fresh helping of outrage every night

for Trump critics eager to lap it up.

"They're not interested in someone looking to be impartial," said Rick Kaplan, former president of both MSNBC and CNN. "They want the same kind of red meat that a lot of conservatives wanted from Fox 10 years ago."

Griffin believes a key to MSNBC's success is that its hosts aren't just spouting talking points, that their programs contain solid reporting. Maddow's ability to make connections and tell stories is beloved by fans who want to get absorbed by the issues, even if they can be frustratingly slow for the nonbelievers.

"People want depth," he said. "This is a complicated time."

CNN believes that MSNBC's success doesn't come at its expense. The network is on pace to have its second-highest prime-time viewership since 2008 and best ever in full-day ratings, Nielsen said. CNN also is comfortably profitable, with more advertising revenue at this point in the year than ever before, the network said.

Essentially, MSNBC's surge is fueled by newbies, people who weren't regular cable news viewers. So the question remains of why these people are primarily going to MSNBC instead of CNN.

CNN's prime time is panel-based, with a stream of people talking about the news. Unlike MSNBC, CNN regularly includes Trump supporters in the mix and some of those — think Jeffrey Lord — infuriate the president's opponents. CNN's

immediate announcement that it wasn't interested in outgoing White House press secretary Sean Spicer as a contributor was understandable given the administration's biting attacks on the network, but Spicer is likely to be more skilled than Lord.

While Trump has ripped CNN relentlessly, MSNBC has gotten off easily — with the prominent exception of "Morning Joe" hosts Joe Scarborough and Mika Brzezinski. It's hard to tell whether those attacks have undermined CNN with potential viewers, or if most people receptive to them would be watching Fox, anyway.

Maddow's ratings victory comes with one asterisk: she no longer has Fox's Bill O'Reilly to compete with.

O'Reilly's ouster in April after harassment charges, coupled with Megyn Kelly's departure for NBC, leaves Sean Hannity as the one constant in Fox's prime-time lineup. The network's 2.36 million viewers in July compares to 3.82 million in February.

Fox's revamped lineup may not be as appealing. Fox's hosts also strongly back a president who has been buffeted with bad news and is supported by one-third of the public. Time will reveal the determining factor in the network's loss of strength.

MSNBC recently moved to shore up a weak spot in its lineup, replacing Greta Van Susteren with Ari Melber at 6 p.m. The weekend — a mix of live and long-form programming — is another test. Will MSNBC's leaders spend the money necessary for more live news programming on Saturday and Sunday to make the network more competitive then?

Griffin, who has been with MSNBC since its 1996 launch, understands the relentlessly cyclical nature of his business enough to enjoy this run.

"As someone who has been here, loves this place, believes in it," he said, "I've never seen it like this."

BEN SOLLEE

◆ Album: "Ben Sollee and Kentucky Native"

◆ Grade: A

Take a classically trained cellist with an adventurous spirit and strong feelings for his native Kentucky and what do you get? A brilliant new album that will warm the hearts of those who know and love the Bluegrass State — and just might encourage others to come calling.

On "Ben Sollee and Kentucky Native," the cellist Ben Sollee blends ancient mountain melodies with stirring lyrics rooted in the state he calls home. Sollee brings other influences to bear — a syncopated African rhythm on the opener, "Carrie Bell," for example — but the core is all Kentucky.

There's a lovely ballad about a ship called the Eva Kelley that once hauled coal down the Ohio River and now carries mostly other cargo. It touches lyrically on hard times in the coal business, but with a gentle, understated touch.

In "Pieces of You," the album's best song, the only thing identifiably Kentuckian in the lyrics is how Sollee pronounces "hungry" ("hongry"). The song was inspired by a piece of art that blurred the distinction between mementos and trash. But it stands taller on another track of meaning, as a wistful, achy love song about the urge to hang on to the physical remnants of a relationship that has ended.

The song's Kentucky roots, though absent lyrically, shine through in the melody — sweetly enough that those who love the state might imagine they're seeing mist on the shoulders of distant mountains.

PAUL KELLY

◆ Album: "Life is Fine"

◆ Grade: B+

Paul Kelly, Australia's national treasure, has gone eclectic in recent releases, unless you consider setting Shakespearean sonnets to music mainstream.

"Life is Fine" returns to familiar territory: sturdy, pop-rock songs from a writer who's a master of economy and expressiveness. Lovely lines abound: "You're autumn trees undressing in the month of May," he sings, a reminder that this came from the Southern Hemisphere. Kelly updates a Roy Orbison song and sets a Langston Hughes poem to music in the title cut.

Vika and Linda Bull shine as singers, and not just backups — Kelly generously gives each a lead in one song (although maybe not too generous, since Vika's assignment, "My Man's Got a Cold," is the album's one true clunker).

The joyous and playful love songs, "Firewood and Candles" and "Josephina," shine particularly bright.

**Court overturns conviction of man who said he was Sasquatch**

**PORTLAND, ORE.**

An appeals court overturned the conviction of an Oregon man with bipolar disorder who attacked a hunter while claiming to be a Sasquatch.

A statement Linus Norgren made to a deputy that he "was a Sasquatch and was from a family of Sasquatches" showed he was having a mental break from reality, the Oregon Court of Appeals ruled Aug. 2.

He didn't knowingly and intelligently waive his Miranda rights, and incriminating statements made during the interview should not have been allowed at his March 2015 trial, the court said.

Washington County deputies arrested Norgren in October 2013, saying the 20-year-old was naked when he hit a 58-year-old hunter with a rock

and tried to choke him in woods west of Portland.

Despite suffering multiple injuries, the hunter, Jeff McDonald, fought back and held his attacker at gunpoint until authorities arrived. Norgren was lying in a fetal position.

McDonald told The Oregonian/OregonLive after the trial that he asked Norgren during their struggle: "Why are you trying to kill me?" He said Norgren replied, "Sasquatch kills the hunter."

Jurors convicted Norgren of assault and attempted murder, and Washington County Judge Thomas Kohl sentenced him to 10 years in prison.

The case now returns to county court.

Kohl had decided Norgren was properly given his Miranda rights based on the deputy's assertion that the suspect gave responsive answers and the only unusual statement was the one about Sasquatch.

Defense attorneys told jurors that

Norgren believed he was acting in self-defense and his behavior was caused by bipolar disorder.

Norgren was on medical leave from the University of Oregon to address his mental health and had stopped taking his medication, his mother testified.

**Woman gives birth at German techno festival**

**BERLIN**

A woman gave birth to a baby girl at a techno festival in Germany.

Public broadcaster SWR reports that the 20-year-old was unaware she was pregnant until giving birth at the festival campsite Aug. 5.

Organizers of the Nature One festival at a former U.S. military base in southwestern Germany were quoted Sunday as saying the child would get a ticket for life once she turns 16.

Mother and child were taken to a nearby hospital and were reportedly doing well.

© Zap2it**Q** • Did Ed Sheeran make an appearance in the season premiere of "Game of Thrones"?

**A** • He did, and the music superstar's cameo on the wildly popular HBO drama wasn't met with open arms by a good number of critics and viewers. "Stunt casting" was a phrase used frequently in post-telecast references, but in fairness, Sheeran had acted before. He was a cast member of the FX series "The Bastard Executioner," and he had been a guest star on the NBC sitcom "Undateable" — though in the latter case he played himself.**Q** • Now that Sean Spicer is no longer the White House press secretary, does that mean Melissa McCarthy won't be playing him on "Saturday Night Live" anymore? — Jeff King, via e-mail**A** • It's often hard to predict just what the NBC late-night staple will do before it does it, and that also goes for the "Weekend Update" primetime spinoff that the network is airing for the next several Thursdays.

The more time that elapses between Spicer's departure and new episodes, the less timely it is to invoke him in sketches ... but McCarthy was such a hit in her portrayal of him, we'd never say "Never" if the program still can find sensible ways to work her/him in. We surely wouldn't rule out flashbacks and dream sequences.

**Q** • I watched an episode of "20/20: In an Instant," and it seemed like one I had seen just a few weeks before. Is that possible? — Jane Edwards, Reading, Pa.**A** • Very. Relatively few episodes have been made each of the ABC show's three seasons, so they repeat relatively soon — and that's the case again this summer. As an example, "Whiteout" (the true story of a snowbound couple) opened Season 3 on June 3, and it repeats on Aug. 22. As primetime broadcast-network reruns go, that's pretty quick.**Q** • I enjoy watching "McMillan & Wife" repeats. Why did Susan Saint James leave the show? — Mike Collier, Stuart, Fla.**A** • Reportedly, it was because she and the studio couldn't agree on a contract for the sixth season, which turned out to be the last for that portion of the "NBC Mystery Movie" franchise. Her character Sally was said to have died in a plane crash, so with no "Wife," the Rock Hudson-starring show simply became "McMillan."

Another cast exit that last year was that of Nancy Walker, who had gotten her own ABC sitcom. With her gone, Martha Raye was brought in to reprise her earlier guest role as the sister of Walker's Mildred — and San Francisco police commissioner McMillan's new housekeeper. John Schuck's appearances as McMillan's police comrade Enright also were lessened, since that actor also had gotten his own ABC comedy series, "Holmes &amp; Yoyo."

**Q** • Could you please find out when they are going to put "Mackenna's Gold" on? It stars Gregory Peck and Julie Newmar. — Joyce Gnip, via e-mail**A** • That 1969 movie — with a huge cast that also includes Omar Sharif, Telly Savalas and Edward G. Robinson — turns up fairly frequently on the Starz Encore Westerns cable channel, though at the time of this writing, we don't see it listed for the immediate future there. It also turns up from time to time on Turner Classic Movies, so we'd say that keeping an eye on the listings for those two outlets is your best bet.**Q** • I was watching a "Night Court" repeat, and I'm wondering if the actress who played Christine is on "Chicago P.D." now. — Annie Wade, Bryan, Ohio**A** • Yes, Markie Post has appeared in a recurring guest role as Erin Lindsay's troublemaking mother on the NBC police drama. Her future with that show is uncertain since Sophia Bush — alias Lindsay — isn't returning, at least not as a cast regular. Mom has had dealings with other characters, notably Hank Voight (Jason Beghe), so it's possible that she still could be written into episodes even without her daughter being there, but time will tell.Send questions of general interest via email to [tvipeline@gracenote.com](mailto:tvipeline@gracenote.com). # NBC's 'Marlon' puts Wayans' improv skills on display

In 1990, NBC struck comedy gold with a stand-up named Jerry Seinfeld playing a fictionalized version of himself in a self-titled sitcom. Now more than a quarter century later, the Peacock Network hopes that formula will again prove fruitful with Marlon Wayans in a series premiering this week.

In "Marlon," a half-hour family comedy premiering with back-to-back episodes on Wednesday, Aug. 16, Wayans ("In Living Color," "Scary Movie") stars as Marlon Wayne, a loving though immature father of youngsters Marley (newcomer Notim Taylor) and Zachery (Amir O'Neil, "Mann and Wife"), who is still adjusting to life after his amicable divorce from his very together ex-wife Ashley (Essence Atkins, "Are We There Yet?," "A Haunted House").

An internet star, Marlon is a larger-than-life personality whose parenting style can best be described as well-intentioned though misguided, a combination that — along with Wayans' formidable improv skills — provides much of the comedic moments in the series.

"I'm a crazy man," says Wayans, who is also a creator and executive producer of the series. "... There's nothing like just coming off the cuff, trusting your instincts and bringing you to your show. And I think when you're doing comedy like this, when it's your name and your view, you've got to make sure you inject your personality and your perspective and your point of view. ... I've got a great cast that has fun with me and it's like we're jazz musicians playing some great standards and putting a whole new twist on it."

Chief among them is Atkins, with whom Wayans has worked on many projects, among them "A Haunted House." In that 2013 movie — in which Wayans and

Atkins also starred as husband and wife — he was impressed by her ability to play along while he went off on his improvisational tangents. So when he got this series, she was the first person he thought of to play his partner in comedy.

"What I love about her," Wayans explains, "is she has to play com-

edy double-dutch. Because she doesn't know where to jump in. She don't know how long my riff is going to be. She doesn't know where I'm going but she stays in the scene and jumps in at the right time. She normally has something really great within her character to come back and combat it. And she always stays in the scene and

keeps it grounded and I love her for that."

Wayans also professes admiration for O'Neil and Taylor, the two young actors who play their kids. Their laughter at many of Marlon's riffs appears to be genuine, and Wayans says they often served as his comedic barometer, much as he did for his older brothers Keenen Ivory and Damon when he was younger and they starred in

their 1990-94 Fox sketch comedy series "In Living Color."

"They knew when they were doing something funny when me and (brother) Shawn were laughing (hysterically)," Wayans says. "And then they would be like, 'OK, we're onto something. Shawn's got pee on his leg and Marlon's sitting here with snot bubbles on his face. We're onto something.'"




