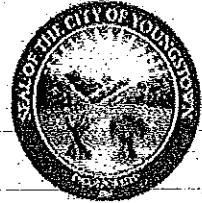

Chief Lees,

The investigation into Internal Affairs case 14-95 has been completed. The facts gleaned during the investigation (see case file) support the conclusion that the following Officers violated the following departmental rules and regulations:

Officer Thomas Wisener:

Officer Wisener admitted to not formally charging Joseph Slattery with O.V.I. even after he had issued him a citation for the violation, which Slattery already signed. Officer Wisener advised that he did this because Lieutenant John Kelty (Officer in Charge) told him on the phone (unrecorded cell phone conversation) to only charge Slattery with Open Container and Red Light. Officer Wisener advised that he questioned the instruction given by Lt. Kelty on the phone and specifically asked, "So you want me to charge him with Open Container and Red

Light?" to which Lt. Kelty advised him, "yes". Officer Wisener advised that he told Lt. Kelty that he believed that it should not matter who you are related to when deciding to charge someone with OVI. Officer Wisener advised that he took the direction from Lt. Kelty as an order and added that he simply followed his orders.

Officer Wisener admitted to writing an erroneous police report for the incident. He advised that he did this because he felt that he had to document the events to match the fact that Slattery was not intoxicated and that the vehicle was never towed. Officer Wisener advised that he was not ordered to do this but did it because he was nervous and scared. Officer Wisener admitted that he did have the option of simply writing the police report to accurately reflect the facts as they occurred, but did not do so. This is in violation of the Oath of Office, Youngstown Police Department Code of Ethics, Youngstown Police Department Code of Conduct and Youngstown Police Department General Orders Rules and Regulations; specifically:

**Rule 1 - Dishonesty**

*All employees are expected to be honest at all times in performing all aspects of their jobs for the City of Youngstown. Employees shall not lie, deceive, steal, cheat or defraud anyone while engaged in the scope of their duties in any manner. The following acts or omissions are specifically prohibited:*

*B. Falsifying or tampering with personnel, operating or other work records and reports, including the unauthorized use or alteration of time cards or other records kept for pay purposes.*

*G. Engaging in any other behavior not specifically listed herein with the intent to lie, steal, cheat, defraud or otherwise deceive anyone while engaged in the scope of their duties in any manner.*

**Rule 4 - Conduct Unbecoming**

*Officers shall conduct themselves at all times, both on and off duty, in such a manner as to reflect most favorably on the Department. Conduct unbecoming an officer shall include that which brings or tends to bring the Department into disrepute or reflects discredit upon the officer as a member of the Department, or that which impairs the operation or efficiency of the Department or officer.*

*A Police Officer is the most conspicuous representative of government, and to the majority of the people he is a symbol of stability and authority upon whom they can rely. An officer's conduct is closely scrutinized; and when his actions are found to be excessive, unwarranted, or unjustified, they are criticized far more severely than comparable conduct of persons in other walks of life. Since the conduct of an officer, on or off duty, may reflect upon the Department, an officer must at all times conduct himself in a manner which does not bring discredit to himself, the Department, or the City.*

**Rule 5 - Failure of Good Behavior**

*All employees are expected at all times to exercise common sense and conduct themselves in an appropriate professional manner. Employees should always be polite, courteous, considerate of co-workers and members of the public and helpful to all. They should refrain from any conduct which might be offensive to their co-workers or members of the public with whom they come in contact during the performance of their duties. The following acts and omissions are specifically prohibited:*

*L. Behaving or acting in any manner that would constitute misfeasance, malfeasance or nonfeasance, not otherwise listed in these rules.*

**Rule 32 - Departmental Reports**

*Employees shall submit all necessary reports on time and in accordance with established Departmental procedures. Reports shall be truthful and complete, and no employee shall knowingly enter or cause to be entered any inaccurate, false, or improper information.*

**Rule 33 - Processing Property and Evidence**

*Property or evidence which has been discovered, gathered, or received in connection with departmental responsibilities will be processed in accordance with established departmental procedures. Employees shall not convert to their own use, manufacture, conceal, falsify, destroy, remove, tamper with, or withhold any property or evidence in connection with an investigation or other police action, except in accordance with established departmental procedures.*

**Officer Assad Chalbi:**

Officer Chalbi admitted to throwing the BAC paperwork, the BMV2255, and the traffic citation for OVI in the shred bin (locked cabinet where documents are shredded by a private company at regular service intervals). Officer Chalbi advised that he walked into the Captain's Office with the papers in his hand and asked Lt. Kelty, "What do you want me to do with these? (Lt. Slattery (off duty) was present in the room)" Officer Chalbi advised that he did not receive a response from either person and opted to put them in the shred bin. It should be noted that I later recovered the documents intact inside the shred bin in the desk area. Officer Chalbi further advised that after putting the documents in the bin, he then came back to the office and told Lieutenant Kelty where he put the documents. This is in violation of the Oath of Office, Youngstown Police Department Code of Ethics, Youngstown Police Department Code of Conduct and Youngstown Police Department General Orders Rules and Regulations; specifically:

**Rule 4 - Conduct Unbecoming**

*Officers shall conduct themselves at all times, both on and off duty, in such a manner as to reflect most favorably on the Department. Conduct unbecoming an officer shall include that which brings or tends to bring the Department into disrepute or reflects discredit upon the officer as a member of the Department, or that which impairs the operation or efficiency of the Department or officer.*

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**Rule 5 - Failure of Good Behavior**

*All employees are expected at all times to exercise common sense and conduct themselves in an appropriate professional manner. Employees should always be polite, courteous, considerate of co-workers and members of the public and helpful to all. They should refrain from any conduct*

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**Lieutenant Gerard Slattery**

Lt. Slattery advised that his brother called him while off duty and asked him to pick him up from the police station because he had gotten an OVI. When asked what Officer was involved, he gave him Chalbi's name. Lt. Slattery advised that he was extremely upset and called Officer Chalbi who advised him that Officer Wisener was the person who was charging his brother. Lt. Slattery advised that he then called Lt. Kelty (Officer in Charge) and voiced his displeasure with Officer Wisener to him. Lt. Slattery later came on station (after his brother was released) and yelled at Officer Timothy Edwards (who towed Slattery's vehicle) that he should have known better and that he should not have let this happen. Lt. Slattery then picked his brother's vehicle up from the tow yard and took it home without paying the towed car fee. This is in violation of the Oath of Office, Youngstown Police Department Code of Ethics, Youngstown Police

Department Code of Conduct and Youngstown Police Department General Orders Rules and

Regulations; specifically:

**Rule 4 - Conduct Unbecoming**

*Officers shall conduct themselves at all times, both on and off duty, in such a manner as to reflect most favorably on the Department. Conduct unbecoming an officer shall include that which brings or tends to bring the Department into disrepute or reflects discredit upon the officer as a member of the Department, or that which impairs the operation or efficiency of the Department or officer.*

*A Police Officer is the most conspicuous representative of government, and to the majority of the people he is a symbol of stability and authority upon whom they can rely. An officer's conduct is closely scrutinized; and when his actions are found to be excessive, unwarranted, or unjustified, they are criticized far more severely than comparable conduct of persons in other walks of life. Since the conduct of an officer, on or off duty, may reflect upon the Department, an officer must at all times conduct himself in a manner which does not bring discredit to himself, the Department, or the City.*

Employees shall not lend to another person their identification cards or badges or permit them to be photographed or reproduced without the approval of the Chief of Police.*

**Rule 53 - Additional Standards of Conduct for Supervisors, Managers, and Administrators**

*Supervisors, managers and administrators shall follow all of the above rules. Because those employees who hold positions of responsibility and trust at the levels of supervisor, manager or*

*administrator must be held to a higher standard than the employees they supervise, they must always conduct themselves with diligence and in a manner above reproach. In addition to complying with the previous rules and regulations, supervisors, managers and administrators shall not engage in any of the following acts:*

*A. Aiding or cooperating with subordinate employees in the violation of work rules, policies or directives.*

*D. Failing to perform supervisory, managerial or administrative duties competently.*

*E. Using the position of supervisor, manager or administrator for inappropriate personal gain.*

*H. Failing to administer and support the policies, directives or other requirements of the City, or otherwise engaging in conduct which undermines the mission or the reputation of the City.*

**Lieutenant John Kelty**

Lt. Kelty admitted to telling Detective Sergeant Brent Gaitanis to delete the towed vehicle report from the computer (which was already approved by Sgt. Gaitanis). Lt. Kelty advised that Sgt. Gaitanis was not explained the situation. He was told to delete the report because Lt. Kelty did not know how to do it himself.

Lt. Kelty called the radio and directed Shultz Towing to release the vehicle to Lt. Slattery. Lt. Kelty also called the radio and inquired as to what was listed on the call logs in the CAD computer.

Lt. Kelty admitted to knowing that Officer Chaibi was going to place the documents in the shred bin and permitted this to happen.

Lt. Kelty's actions are violations of the Oath of Office, Youngstown Police Department Code of Ethics, Youngstown Police Department Code of Conduct and Youngstown Police Department

General Orders Rules and Regulations; specifically:

**Rule 1 - Dishonesty**

*All employees are expected to be honest at all times in performing all aspects of their jobs for the City of Youngstown. Employees shall not lie, deceive, steal, cheat or defraud anyone while engaged in the scope of their duties in any manner. The following acts or omissions are specifically prohibited:*

*B. Falsifying or tampering with personnel, operating or other work records and reports, including the unauthorized use or alteration of time cards or other records kept for pay purposes.*

*G. Engaging in any other behavior not specifically listed herein with the intent to lie, steal, cheat, defraud or otherwise deceive anyone while engaged in the scope of their duties in any manner.*

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*L. Behaving or acting in any manner that would constitute misfeasance, malfeasance or nonfeasance, not otherwise listed in these rules.*

**Rule 9 - Neglect of Duty**

*Employees, during their tour of duty, shall devote their time and attention to the effective and professional performance of their responsibilities. Employees shall not leave their assigned duty posts during their tour of duty without proper authority.*

**Rule 53 - Additional Standards of Conduct for Supervisors, Managers, and Administrators**

*Supervisors, managers and administrators shall follow all of the above rules. Because those employees who hold positions of responsibility and trust at the levels of supervisor, manager or administrator must be held to a higher standard than the employees they supervise, they must always conduct themselves with diligence and in a manner above reproach. In addition to complying with the previous rules and regulations, supervisors, managers and administrators shall not engage in any of the following acts:*

*A. Aiding or cooperating with subordinate employees in the violation of work rules, policies or directives.*

*D. Failing to perform supervisory, managerial or administrative duties competently.*

*E. Using the position of supervisor, manager or administrator for inappropriate personal gain.*

*H. Failing to administer and support the policies, directives or other requirements of the City, or otherwise engaging in conduct which undermines the mission or the reputation of the City.*

**Polygraph Examination**

There was an obvious discrepancy between Lt. Kelty's statement and Officer Wisener's statement pertaining to the decision to not charge Slattery with OVI. Lt. Kelty advised that this decision was made by Officer Wisener himself, whereas Officer Wisener advised that he was ordered to do so by Lt. Kelty. In either case, the decision to not charge Slattery with OVI was directly related to his affinity to Lt. Slattery. Lt. Kelty had clear knowledge of this, and permitted it to occur under his command. Although he denied ordering Officer Wisener to not charge Slattery with OVI, he had direct knowledge of the underlying facts and circumstances

and did not ensure that he was charged with the offense. Even after conducting follow up interviews with both Officer Wisener and Lt. Kelty, gross inconsistencies remained in their statements regarding this issue.

In order to verify the conflicting statements, both Officer Wisener and Lieutenant Kelty were ordered to submit to a polygraph examination on December 17, 2014. It should be noted that Officer Wisener passed the examination, whereas Lt. Kelty failed the examination:

Officer Wisener did not show deception on the following relevant questions:

1. *Did Lt. Kelty tell you not to charge Joseph Slattery with OVI? (yes)*
2. *Did you tell Lt. Kelty that due to liability you could not let Joseph Slattery drive from the traffic stop? (yes)*
3. *Did Lt. Kelty tell you to only write Joseph Slattery a citation for red light and open container? (yes)*

Lt. Kelty did show deception on the following relevant questions:

1. *On the phone, do you recall telling Wisener to not charge Joe Slattery with an OVI? (no)*
2. *On the phone, do you recall telling Wisener to only cite Joe Slattery with red light and open container? (no)*
3. *Do you recall, before getting to the station, telling Wisener to only issue a red light and open container to Joe Slattery? (no)*

## **Conclusion**

Overall, the investigation showed that all of the individuals had, at least, tacit knowledge of the situation and failed to ensure that the incident was handled in accordance with this agency's rules and regulations. It is vitally important that all employees of this agency conduct themselves in a manner demonstrating unquestionable integrity, reliability, and honesty consistent with public expectations. A fundamental and unequivocal duty of all employees is to promote the efficient and effective operation of the department through the pursuit of lawful objectives, and any conduct that detracts from this respect and confidence is detrimental to the public interest. As sworn Police Officers, they are a steward of the people's trust and their oath of office was taken with the pledge that they would faithfully discharge all of the duties assigned to them. The success of any law enforcement agency relies upon the integrity of the officers that compose its ranks. This element is necessary to maintain the confidence of the public and the employees of this agency.

## **Recommendations:**

- A camera should be installed in the BAC room in order to better document the BAC tests that are administered.

- Lt. Slattery should be ordered to pay Shultz Towing for the towed vehicle (\$131.65) which would have been the full cost of the service, had they not waived the fee for him.
- A memo should be drafted to any City contracted towing companies from the Chief's Office advising them that any vehicle released must be requested *in writing* by an authorized representative from the police department prior to being released.
- An order should be issued from the Chief's Office requiring any and all BAC printouts to be kept and documented by the administering Officer, whether or not charges are filed.
- The OVI related documents that I recovered should be presented to the Prosecutor's Office and Joseph Slattery should be charged with OVI.

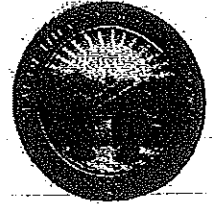

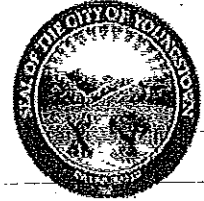

Officer Chaibl,

The investigation into Internal Affairs Case 14-95 has been completed. After reviewing all of the facts and circumstances involved, it was determined that you violated the following rules or regulations of the Youngstown Police Department:

**Rule 33 - Processing Property and Evidence**

*Property or evidence which has been discovered, gathered, or received in connection with departmental responsibilities will be processed in accordance with established departmental procedures. Employees shall not convert to their own use, manufacture, conceal, falsify, destroy, remove, tamper with, or withhold any property or evidence in connection with an investigation or other police action, except in accordance with established departmental procedures.*

The investigation showed that you violated this rule by not documenting the fact that the documents that you put into the shred bin were disposed of. It is established departmental procedure to document (typically on a form 7) when citations or other documents are voided, destroyed, etc.

This conclusion follows a pre-disciplinary meeting that was held in the Chief's Office on December 18, 2014 where you were offered an opportunity to orally respond to the allegations of employee misconduct. The information provided during this meeting has been taken into consideration. The conclusion of fact shall be classified as "Improper Conduct".


Article 11, Section 1 of your collective bargaining agreement states, in part, *"The Employer may take disciplinary action against any employee in the bargaining unit for just cause."*

Article 11, Section 2 states, in part, *"any conduct unbecoming a representative of the Employer, violations of City or department work rules, policies, procedures, or any other acts of misfeasance or malfeasance or nonfeasance, shall be cause for disciplinary action."* This language closely mirrors Ohio Revised Code 124.34.

The information gleaned during the investigation supports the conclusion that just cause exists for disciplinary action. It is because of these actions that the following discipline is being imposed:

- Four (4) hours of Accumulated Time shall be immediately deducted from your Accumulated Time balance.
- Be advised that any future misconduct may result in more severe disciplinary action being imposed in the future.

Article 19, Section 1 of your collective bargaining agreement states, in part, *"The tenure of every employee subject to the terms of this contract shall be during good behavior and efficient service. No employee shall be reduced in pay or position (including working suspensions), fined (i.e. forfeiture of accrued leave), suspended, discharged, or removed except for grounds stated in section 2 of this article. The Employer may take disciplinary action against any employee in the bargaining unit for just cause."*


Article 19, Section 2 states, in part, *"Dishonesty, immoral conduct, failure of good behavior, any conduct unbecoming a representative of the Employer, violations of City or department work rules, policies, procedures, or any other acts of misfeasance or malfeasance or nonfeasance, shall be cause for disciplinary action."* This language closely mirrors Ohio Revised Code 124.34.

The information gleaned during the investigation supports the conclusion that just cause exists for disciplinary action. It is because of these actions that the following discipline is being imposed:

- You are hereby suspended, without pay, for five (5) days. The unpaid suspension shall commence on December 29, 2014 and conclude on January 2, 2015, inclusive. You are not permitted to work secondary employment while serving the unpaid suspension.
- You are hereby permanently reduced in rank (demoted) from the classified position of Lieutenant to the classified position on Patrolman. The permanent reduction in rank shall be effective on January 3, 2015.



To whom it may concern:

As a result of Internal Affairs Case 14-95, Officer Thomas Wisener will be suspended, without pay, for fifteen (15) days. The first week of the unpaid suspension shall commence on December 27, 2014 and end on January 14, 2015 inclusive.

The investigation into Internal Affairs Case 14-95 has been completed. After reviewing all of the facts and circumstances involved, it was determined that you violated the following rules or regulations of the Youngstown Police Department:

**Rule 1 - Dishonesty**

*All employees are expected to be honest at all times in performing all aspects of their jobs for the City of Youngstown. Employees shall not lie, deceive, steal, cheat or defraud anyone while engaged in the scope of their duties in any manner. The following acts or omissions are specifically prohibited:*

*B. Falsifying or tampering with personnel, operating or other work records and reports, including the unauthorized use or alteration of time cards or other records kept for pay purposes.*

*G. Engaging in any other behavior not specifically listed herein with the intent to lie, steal, cheat, defraud or otherwise deceive anyone while engaged in the scope of their duties in any manner.*

Article 11, Section 1 of your collective bargaining agreement states, in part, *"The tenure of every employee subject to the terms of this Agreement shall be during good behavior and efficient service. No employee shall be reduced in pay or position (including working suspensions), fined ( i . forfeiture of accrued leave), suspended, discharged, or removed except for grounds stated in Section 2 of this article. The Employer may take disciplinary action against any employee in the bargaining unit for just cause."*
