On 1-19-18 I Officer Knebel was advised by Chief Taafe that councilmen O'Hara called and advised he needed a police officer to respond to the fire station reference to an incident that has come up. Upon my arrival I was brought up stairs to the conference room where Chief Stanish, Councilman O'Hara, trustee Hernandez and Fallen were. Chief Stanish began to show me discrepancies with one of there firefighters pay sheet, Rich Wittkugle. It was also brought to my attention that the suspect (Wittkugle) is the treasurer of the fire department and he does the sheets that shows which firefighters were on each call. Chief Stanish started with 2013 and the suspect had responded to 180 call but put that he responded to 198. In 2014 he responded to 154 and reported 174. 2015 showed 174 but reported 198, 2016 was a significant difference with 165 actual and 249 reported and the same with 2017 with 174 actual and 249 reported. The Chief then showed me 2018 thus far and the suspect has been on 26 call but has already reported 45. Chief Stanish also started to explain to me that Wittkugle has all records that would show all of this at his house in files and on his computer due to him being the Treasurer and was concerned that the files may get destroyed. I explained to them that I would go back to the station and speak with Chief Taafe and advise him of this situation and how to proceed from here. Once back on station I started to explain the situation to Chief Taafe and he advised me to contact Det. Banic and have him informed to this as well. Det. Banic Chief Taafe and I met in Banc`'s office and he was brought up to speed as to what was going on. Case has been forwarded to Det. Banic for investigation.

1/19/2018 incident received and case folder opened.

1/20/2018 Search warrant for 88 Hillview Dr. was created and signed by Judge Adler at approximately 12:40. Items to be seized are any documents, computers and computer related equipment that could contain Eagle Joint Fire District or Hubbard Fire Department Inc. relating to the operations of those departments.

1/20/2018 14:30 Search warrant served on 88 Hillview Dr. Hubbard, OH 44425. There was no answer at the door. At 14:32 I called Rich Wittkugle with no answer. I left him a message that we were at his residence and that he needed to return home ASAP. After a few minutes of not hearing from Wittkugle, officers made entry into the residence with out damage. Several documents and computer related items were taken. Copy of the search warrant and inventory sheet was left on the kitchen table. Wittkugle's cell phone was observed and a picture of my missed call was taken.

1/20/2018 16:16 Richard Wittkugle called dispatch stating his home had been ransacked, point of entry unknown. Sgt. Moffitt called him back and advised that officers served a search warrant today and that he should contact Det. Banic on Monday.

1/20/2018 16:16, 16:24, 16:38 I had missed calls from Wittkugle on the department cell phone.

1/20/2018 16:43 I called Wittkugle back. He stated that he had to meet with the Fire Chief and wanted me to also attend so that we could explain to him what was going on. I advised him that I was not working at this time and would not be coming. He then asked how we got into his house. I respectfully declined to answer not wanting to reveal our trade secrets. Wittkugle then disconnected.

1/22/2018 10:00 returned the warrant and inventory to Girard Court and requested another search warrant for the items taken from 88 Hillview Dr. Hubbard, OH 44425

1/22/2018 11:55 Called Wittkugle and left him a message to call me back.

1/22/2018 12:54 Wittkugle called back and will be coming in to talk with me today. He asked if he needed an attorney. I advised him it was his right to have an attorney and that he needed to make that decision.

1/22/2018 13:57 I interviewed Wittkugle in the interview room. He was advised

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of his rights and form completed with the exception of the waiver portion. At first he said he was there to help me and provide passwords to the documents I seek on his laptop, which he provided. Wittkugle began to share information and did sign the rights waiver form. Wittkugle started off by saying that on Saturday he really contemplated committing suicide and that he feels really bad about what happened. Wittkugle claimed that he believed there was an issue with formulas in the spread sheet he uses which is the cause of the discrepancies. When I asked what if the formulas are correct he then stated that he just does this in his spare time sitting in his recliner while watching TV. Wittkugle never actually admitted to stealing but stated that I have proof that he did pointing to a document that had a list of discrepancies for years 2013 through 2017. Wittkugle wanted to end the interview stating that he had to return the car he borrowed to get there because his was in the shop. After the interview ended I asked him if he wanted to hurt himself and Wittkugle stated yes I do. I then called for Ptl. Dripps to assist and had dispatch call Life Fleet. An emergency admission form was completed and he was transported to Sharon Regional Hospital. See video of interview.

1/26/2018 07:58 Chief Stanish called me and advised that he spoke with John Morris who told him that sometime in 2015 or 2016 Mr. Morris caught a discrepancy in Wittkugle's reporting. Wittkugle told him at the time that he believed it was a spread sheet issue. I will follow up with John Morris.

1/29/2018 Prepared letter to Judge Adler Girard Municipal Court requesting the release of items seized from the Wittkugle residence that is essential to the operations of Joint Eagle Fire District and Hubbard Volunteer Fire department. List numbers 3 and 4 were thoroughly documented with pictures.

- 1) Kenwood portable radio w/ charger
- 2) "For deposit only Hubbard Volunteer Fire Department" Ink stamper
- 3) First National Bank (Blue) check book Account ending in *****874
- 4) First National Bank (Brown) check book Account ending in ***730

1/30/2018 subpoena for Wittkugle's work records prepared. Called and left message for John Morris.

2/1/2018 Dropped of Subpoena to Home Savings Bank in Youngstown, OH.

2/5/2018 14:01 I followed up with John Morris at his residence. John did recall an accounting error by Wittkugle but could not remember exactly when it occurred however did agree that it could have been in 2015 or 2016. John stated that he caught the error and believed that it was an honest mistake and felt no need to bring it to anyone's attention. John and I also went to the Fire Department where

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the fire departments records are stored. John showed me the report that Wittkugle creates and provides to John. John gave me copies of these reports for 2014, (2015 was missing), 2016 and the first page of 2017. The second page of 2017 was missing. I asked John to provide a written statement about what he recalls about the error in Wittkugle's reporting.

2/8/2018 Judge Adler entered a judgement to return the four items to the fire department. See GMC journal 28 page 64.

2/9/2018 08:30 items were released to Captain John Petro of the fire department.

2/13/2018 Picked up Wittkugle's work records from Home Savings Bank.

2/15/2018 John Morris dropped off his written statement. When I met with John on 2/5/2018 I asked that he write a statement in reference to a time when he found an error in Wittkugle's reports. John's statement only states what his own function is and did not describe the accounting error he caught. I called and spoke with John and reiterated the information I wanted. He stated that he would get it to me tonight, I advised that it didn't have to be tonight however soon.

2/22/2018 received statement from John Morris describing that in one or more years between 2013-2016 the original paperwork provided by Richard Wittkugle had some clerical math errors within it, that John had to have Wittkugle correct. John's opinion was that it appeared to him that the errors were caused from incorrect formulas within the cell of an Excel spreadsheet.

3/5/2018 Created excel spread sheet for fire calls that Wittkugle was documented being at and compared those dates and times to Wittkugle's work records from Home Saving Bank. I found the following discrepancies.

Fire call# 15-319 10/23/2015 16:35 - 17:04 recorded by L. O'Hara III, Wittkugle's work records show that he was working from 08:01 - 16:58. Leaving him 6 minutes to drive from down town Youngstown to the center of Hubbard. Google maps estimates a 17 minute drive from his work address to the FD address.

3/26/2018 I found that Wittkugle's work hours for 2017 were not included in the data I received from Home Savings Bank. I email Joan Comport to advised her of the missing data. She emailed the data to me the same day.

Wittkugle's work records show him working from 07:51 to 15:36. According to

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dispatch CAD system the below calls either ended before he left work or shortly after not giving him enough time to arrive on scene considering drive time.

3/27/2018 BCI is still processing the electronic devices from this case. I emailed Erica Moore who is the agent processing the devices. I requested if she could provide me with a cd containing the data from the green PNY thumb drive (BCI item# 3) from Wittkugle's brief case. Wittkugle advised during questioning that this is the thump drive with the Fire Departments data on it. He stated that he used Microsoft Excel to calculate calls per fire fighter. He also advised that QuickBooks is password protected and that the password is witt2816 (he thinks) or it might be capital "W".

3/28/2018 I picked up the data cd for (BCI item# 3) from BCI. Upon looking at the data I observed Excel files named E:\EV3USB1 (Green Gray PNY)\Exported Logical Files\Fire Dept Pay Run\14-15 Fire Depart Pay Run and E:\EV3USB1 (Green Gray PNY)\Exported Logical Files\Fire Dept Pay Run\15-16 Fire Depart Pay Run.

Looking at E:\EV3USB1 (Green Gray PNY)\Exported Logical Files\Fire Dept Pay Run\15-16 Fire Depart Pay Run I found this document was used to calculate the pay for fire fighters based on how many fire calls they were on. This document was used from November 1, 2015 through mid June where the data stops. No other data files were located that document Wittkugle's documentation of pay for fire fighters. Using E:\EV3USB1 (Green Gray PNY)\Exported Logical Files\Fire Dept Pay Run\15-16 Fire Depart Pay Run file I compared Wittkugle's entries to the original fire records provided by Chief Stanish and Wittkugle's copy of the fire records that were recovered in the execution of the search warrant on his residence.

I found generous amounts of discrepancies in the document. A few of which could be clerical mistakes. The discrepancies were usually in favor of fire fighter getting paid for calls that they were not documented as being on. Between Nov. 1, 2015 and June 5, 2016 (CFS 1 through 264) Wittkugle gave himself an additional 31 calls only being second to John Petro at 35 calls. There was a missing fire record

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from Wittkugle's data. I found 16-062 missing which 11 fire fighters did not get paid for that call. Based on this incomplete document if fire fighters were paid from the available data Eagle Joint Fire District would have lost \$2685.00.

4/2/2018 I emailed Erica Moore asking if she can provide data cd from (BCI items 4,5, and 6). She replied that she would.

4/9/2018 I picked up data for items 3 through 10 from BCI. Along with a sterile USB stick that I provided BCI prior. The USB stick contained Attachments A through K. Located in Attachment B were the following two files containing Wittkugle's work for tracking the fire department's pay role, were complete and the totals matched what Wittkugle submitted to the district's clerk for payment. These two files were recovered from Wittkugle's Dell lap top Item #1.

15-16 Fire Dept Pay Run[137441].xlsx found at H:\2018-0141\Attachment B\Fire Dept

Also contained in Attachment B from the Dell lap top was the file (Rich Resume 2015[139274].doc) which is Wittkugle's resume. The file was last modified 11/15/2015. Under qualifications Wittkugle stated the following.

"I have an Associates Degree in Accounting and Business Management along with 23 years of experience in the collection field and over 10 years experience in auditing, accounts receivable, accounts payable, payroll, bank reconciliation, and inventory. My past job duties have involved collecting medical bills, auto loans, student loans, mortgages, credit card debt and merchandise sales as well as working with accounts receivable, accounts payable, auditing, and payroll. I am proficient with computers and have experience working with Excel, Microsoft Word, Word Perfect, Quick Books, Quicken and other various software."

Over the next several weeks I compared the files 16-17 Fire Dept Pay Run[137442].xlsx and 15-16 Fire Dept Pay Run[137441].xlsx to the original fire record and to the copies of the fire records recovered from Wittkugle's residence. See attachments Fiscal Year 2016 and Fiscal Year 2017.

For the fiscal year 2016 which runs between November 1, 2015 through October 31, 2016 I found contradictions between Wittkugle's excel spread sheet and the original fire records resulting in \$5,010.00 of misappropriated funds. Wittkugle received \$915 of those funds.

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For the fiscal year 2017 which runs between November 1, 2016 through October 31, 2017 I found contradictions between Wittkugle's excel spread sheet and the original fire records resulting in \$5,205.00 of misappropriated funds, \$4,800 from the district and \$405 from individual fire fighters that were not paid for calls (moving payment from one fire fighter to another). Wittkugle received \$1,245 of those funds.

Wittkugle provides statistical data to the district from his excel sheet also. I believe he was adding calls to other fire fighters with the purpose to disguise the increases in his attendance compared to other fire fighters.

Luke Takash was getting paid every other fire call from Report#16-469 Pay#76 to Report# 17-114 Pay# 198. I spoke with Chief Stanish who advised that Takash was injured while on a fire call and that this was injured on duty pay. Since Takash reports to 50% of the calls he was being paid every other call. These calls were not calculated as part of Wittkugle's doing and I subtracted them from the totals. I identified this time frame on the my work sheet highlighted in yellow.

While examining the fire records I noticed a high number of calls that Wittkugle was marked as being "on station" which is indicated by the number 11 on the fire record. This caused me to question if Wittkugle is adding himself to fire records in addition to the scheme of adding calls to himself in the excel sheet. Unfortunately there is no way to determine who responds to the fire department as they have a common pass code to enter the building which is not tracked. There are also no cameras there. However while comparing the data I did observe that there were original fire records that showed Wittkugle marked with 11 and Wittkugle's copies recovered from his home do not show him on the call. John Petro who is a Captain at the fire department. It is commonly known that Wittkugle is closest to Petro than anyone else at the FD. Petro received the 2nd

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highest amount in misappropriated funds Wittkugle being the highest.

7/13/2018 10:22 I called and spoke with Petro. I asked if I could speak with him about this case. He agreed and while we tried to determine a meeting time Petro stated that he works for UPS and will be on vacation next week. We agreed to meet on Monday July 16, 2018 at his residence.

Charges for Wittkugle prepared. 10:42 I called Wittkugle's cell phone and it went directly to voice mail. I left him a message to come pick up his charges and that if he did so prior to Monday that he would be booked here and released. If he did not on Monday I would obtain a warrant and he would be picked and transported to the county jail.

13:16 I received a call from Attorney Ed Czopur inquiring about the message I left Wittkugle. I explained I was giving his client an opportunity to come in to pick up his charges and to be booked then released. If he should not come in by Monday that I would be getting a warrant for him. After speaking with Attorney Czopur we all agreed that Wittkugle will turn himself in on Monday July 16, 2018 at 13:00 hours.

7/16/2018 12:45 I met with John Petro at his residence. John was cooperative and advised that he was not aware of Wittkugle's theft scheme. He also stated that Wittkugle has not admitted anything to him. Petro did say that he suspects that Wittkugle was stealing from the fire departments fund raisers explaining that before all of this Wittkugle would be in charge of the money. This year since Wittkugle was not involved they raised more money from spaghetti dinner this year then last year, selling less dinners this year. Petro allowed me to read his text messages between him and Wittkugle. Most of their texts were related to Wittkugle's tumultuous relationship with his wife, the rest was small talk. I did not observe any texts that were related to this case. I asked Petro is the guy would know if their pay is off. He stated he does not keep track of his pay at the FD or at UPS and doesn't believe anyone else would except Greg Thomas because frugal. During our conversation I asked Petro about Wittkugle's relationships at the FD in reference to who he gets along with and not so much. He stated that Wittkugle does not get along with Ken Mauch and Greg Thomas. Petro stated he would bet that their pay would not be altered because they would catch it. Petro was very forth coming with information, cooperative and I did not observe any signs of deception. There is no indication that Petro knew or was taking part in Wittkugle's theft scheme.

7/16/2018 13:00 Wittkugle and his attorney on station to pick up charges and to

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be booked. Ptl. Dripps processed (booking, finger prints and DNA) Wittkugle and released him on his charges. Wittkugle is ordered into court on 7/24/2018 in Girard Municipal Court at 09:00.

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
